



Thursday 22 September, the last week of Term 3, is now booked for school photos with Fotoworks.


Year 5/6 Camp Update



MAGPIE NESTING SEASON

Magpies breed between August and October each year. Although magpies are quite alarming when they swoop please remember to stay calm - the clap of their wings and clacking of their bill is usually just a bluff. Like a dog, magpies seem The following steps can be to sense fear. followed to avoid or reduce the impact of a swooping magpie:

- Never deliberately provoke a magpie.
- Avoid areas where magpies are known to swoop.
- Locate the bird and keep watching it when entering its territory. If you are being swooped don't crouch or stop -continue on your way quickly but don't run.
- If you are riding a bike make sure you wear a helmet, and dismount and walk through nesting magpie territory.
- Try wearing a hat and sunglasses or carry an umbrella for protection, and
- Remember the magpies are just trying to protect their young.





Corn Relish Cob

Ingredients

1 cob loaf 300g sour cream 250g jar corn relish 2 spring onions finely chopped

Instructions

Preheat oven to 180°C.

Cut the top from the cob and remove most of the bread from inside: leave a 2cm thick lining (reserve the lid and inside bread).

In a bowl mix together sour cream, corn relish and spring onions. Season to taste. Spoon the dip into the loaf and bake for 20 minutes; remove from oven.

Tear the lid into several dippers, then nestle it and inside bread around the cob. Bake for another 10 minutes, or until the bread is nice and crispy on the outside. Serve immediately, using the toasted bread to dip.



Apple Crumble Cake

Ingredients

1 1/2 cups self-raising flour

1/2 cup caster sugar

115g butter


1 egg lightly beaten

440g canned pie apples sliced

1/4 cup icing sugar *to decorate

Method

- 1 Sift flour and sugar.
- 2 Quickly break the butter into the dry mixture until it resembles crumbs
- 3 Add egg and gently mix through with a fork until it resembles crumbs.
- 4 Press just under half the mixture into a greased and lined 20cm round tin.
- 5 Top with apple.
- 6 Sprinkle over remaining crumbs.
- 7 Bake at 180C for 40 minutes. Cool on wire rack.
- 8 Dust with icing sugar and a dollop of thickened cream to serve.



Garden Snippets...



...Vegie Variety

Now is a great time to start a Vegie Patch. To boost the success of your crops, take the time to improve the soil before you plant with plenty of organic matter, like compost, aged manures or blood and bone. In most areas you can start sowing beans, basil, carrots, chillies, cucumbers, eggplants, lettuce, pumpkin, radish, sweetcorn, tomatoes and zucchinis – just to name a few. If you are prone to frosts, wait a little longer to avoid frost damage to tender young leaves.

Seedlings or Seeds: You can get a head start on the planting season by using seedlings. They're easy to grow and, as they are young established plants, may have a greater chance of success in the garden. But if you are not in a rush then seeds are great too, as the plants will be grown in the one spot and you will avoid the risk of loss through the shock of transplanting.

Pests: Caterpillars, whitefly, slugs, aphids – just to name a few - find vegies and herbs irresistible. Keep them at bay with organic insecticide sprays, spraying at first sight and repeat as necessary.

Weeds compete with plants for valuable moisture and nutrients, and are a harbour for unwanted insects and bugs. Make sure your area has been bared of weeds before you start planting, and pull weeds regularly throughout the growing season.

Support tall or climbing plants like cherry tomatoes and beans can be supported using a tepee trellis, or the like, made with bamboo stakes. Tie string along it at intervals for extra support.

Supercharge the growth and productivity of your vegie patch by regular feeding with a liquid fertilizer.

Keep your household in greens by growing your own lettuce. Try:

Cos – This lettuce forms a tight head of sturdy, long and crisp leaves. Pick the outer leaves while the head grows.

Oak Leaf - A loose-leaf variety made up of heavily lobed leaves, like an oak leaf. Harvest the outer leaves often.

Iceberg – Ever popular, its round head has layers of crisp, mildly flavoured leaves with good crunch factor. Harvest the whole lettuce.

Buttercrunch – Much loved for its mild butter-flavoured leaves and smooth velvety texture. Great as wraps or in sandwiches.



***After applying fertiliser around edible plants, delay harvesting for a few days and rinse well before eating or cooking. If you are using products to deal with pests, diseases or weeds, or when handling compost or manure, follow any instructions carefully, and always wear gloves and any other suitable protective equipment.

***Store all garden chemicals and products out of reach of children and pets.




ADULT FICTION THE PEOPLE ON PLATFORM 5 - CLARE POOLEY

Celebrating 50 years of protecting consumers

With Consumer Protection recently celebrating its 50th anniversary in Western Australia, we have been reminded that while many things have changed over the last five decades, there is also so much that has remained the same.

Back in the early 1970s, second-hand cars accounted for 40 per cent of the complaints we handled, while travel agents, tenancy and product safety were the other big issues affecting WA consumers.

Now, 50 years later, we have handled 250,000 consumer and tenancy complaints and achieved \$69 million in redress for those impacted. Many of the same issues are still relevant today and so too is the way we handle them. Community education, complaints management, public namings and prosecutions remain a consistent way we alert consumers to issues while simultaneously holding to account those who do the wrong thing.

Even though much remains unchanged, the last 50 years have yielded incredible advancements in the way business is conducted.

The speed of electronic communications may have made it easier to do business, but it has also created new opportunities for scammers and dodgy traders seeking to take advantage. Scams and other forms of misleading and deceiving conduct are rapidly evolving issues that will require sophisticated and innovative ways to combat them.

Just as the business landscape changed, so too did the laws that governed it. Up until 11 years ago, there were 17 different national, state and territory laws covering consumer issues in Australia, before they were all replaced on 1 January 2011 with the Australian Consumer Law (ACL). In what remains the most significant change to consumer laws to date, the ACL means that no matter where they are in this country, consumers could know their rights and traders understood their obligations,.

Heralding a new era of consumer protection in Australia, the ACL was backed up with greater penalties and enforcement powers than had existed previously. This afforded State and Federal agencies a wider scope to take action for breaches of consumer laws, provide more compensation options for unlawful conduct, and introduce product safety standards.
