Vale Bruce Halliday



Was born at Wickepin in January 1927, first son to Bruce and Margaret (Maggie) Halliday. He was followed by Ray (dec), Irene and Doug.

Bruce did correspondence for 5 years before starting school at Wickepin. Bruce and his siblings, had to walk 3 miles to catch the bus at Hoskins farm. Bruce left school at 13 to work with his father on the Hannaford grader, as well as learning to shear. He became a very good shearer and continued to shear for many years, mostly shearing with his good mate Laurie Whyte. Bruce commenced working at "Sunshine", (later Nepowie) when he was 17, Grant and Betty McDonald were very kind to Bruce and treated him like a son. He was woken every morning with a cuppa and a biscuit from Grant, to get an early start for the day.

Bruce was an outstanding sportsman playing football, tennis and cricket.

He started his football career with Toolibin in the Wickepin Football Association. He played mostly as a centre man, winning a Kelly Medal (Fairest and Best in the Association) and also a Fairest and Best For the Wickepin Association at the Northam Carnival. He won a number of F&B s for Toolibin as well.

He was a classy, neat footballer and usually finished the game just as neat as he started it, due in part to carrying a comb in his sock! He was an excellent exponent of the drop kick and was selected in the Wickepin Football Club Team of the Century at their Centenary Celebrations.

He also played a season with Towns Football Club in Narrogin along with teammate Ed Reynolds in 1959. He went to Melbourne at one stage and trained with his beloved Hawthorn Football Club. This was cut short when problems emerged with his farmland at Esperance. He did a lot of clover harvesting while there and again after he returned to the Wickepin area. Bruce sold that farm and bought a share in a hotel in Kalgoorlie. This hotel unfortunately burnt down. He then became Bar manager at the Naval Base Hotel for 4 years before returning to work at Nepowie. He was part of the furniture at Nepowie and Alan and Heather White continued to look after him after Grant and Betty retired. Cameron and Lachlan also continued the family tradition until Bruce moved into Karinya. Bruce had a nickname at Nepowie, they called him the "Overseer."

He left there for a while when he took up a new land block at Dunn Rock, near Ravensthorpe. He didn't have much luck there either and Allan White eventually bought the land off Bruce, and he then tried his hand developing a block in Perth, with a plan to build 3 units, planning to sell one to cover the cost, and make the profit selling the other two. However, he didn't have enough money, due to interest rates going to 18%, to finish and sold the lot without making much profit at all. He got a Real Estate license in 1981 and spent some time selling Real Estate. It would have been difficult with such little education, but he said that two young ladies doing the course told him the answers as they wanted him to take them out to lunch. Bruce always had a passion for horses and over the years owned and part owned a number. Firstly, trotters with Jim Schraeder and then racehorses. He won a couple of races at Belmont and won two Cornwall Hotel Cups in Narrogin. He loved horses and loved having a bet. He was a regular at local events and in Bunbury, Kalgoorlie, and the metro area. He watched every meeting televised and when his eyesight failed him, he listened intently to the radio. He joined the Men's Shed in Narrogin and was a regular in his early years at Karrinya when he wasn't glued to the TV watching football and the races.

Bruce was a very social person, regularly attending the local dances and again presented himself immaculately and whilst being a "ladies' man "he never married. He was a really good dancer and was never short of a dance partner.

In the last couple of years he wasn't very mobile, his social life was limited to a small wine with a couple of friends each evening. A number of people visited him often and he was always very keen to hear what was happening on his old patch and reminisce about the good old days.

Rest in Peace Bruce you have earned your rest and you should be proud of your football career, your interesting life and the many friendships you made wherever you went.



Wickepin Skate Park and Street Basketball Court

Works to build the Wickepin Skate Park and Street Basketball Court will commence shortly. Unfortunately skateboarding accidents and inclement weather have prevented the Skate Sculpture team from commencing the works earlier.

Independent Living Units

Work continues to progress on the building of the units, albeit slowly. The builder has commenced replacing the interior fencing and the footings and installation of the sub-meter for power distribution is to be finalised shortly. Thank you to the community members who submitted naming suggestions for the Units. Council will be considering the naming options shortly.

Yealering Ablution Blocks

The Shire has recently received the preliminary hydraulic drawing for the facility. This will see an improved method of wastewater treatment applied to the facility which, in the long run, will provide a better environmental outcome than what would occur with more traditional septic systems.

Wickepin - Pingelly Road

Following the recent preservation works conducted approximately 10km north of Wickepin it was noted there was excessive stripping of the recent works. An incorrectly prepared batch of blue metal was identified as the reason, and confirmed as having impacted four other local governments. Repair works will occur, under warranty, when the next preservation works is completed later in the year.

Garden Snippets...



Zest Appeal...

Citrus offer much pleasure to the garden. As well as sweetly fragrant flowers and evergreen, glossy, scented foliage, at this time of year many varieties are also dripping with luscious fruit - and the selection goes far beyond oranges and lemons-with selections including lemons, limes, oranges, grapefruits, tangelos, calamondin, cumquats and more.

Citrus trees are perfect for almost any garden. They can be clipped, espaliered, trained into vase shapes, grown in giant terracotta pots, or displayed in formal rows to create a "Mediterranean" effect.

Citrus like regular fertiliser placed monthly around the drip line of the tree from new spring growth until December. Water well before and after feeding. Add a layer of compost and well rotted manure in spring to keep the moisture around the root zone uniform and to assist in preventing split fruit. All citrus can be grown in pots where the container acts as a "dwarfing mechanism" that will keep your tree smaller than if it were planted out in the open garden.

Common Mistakes & How to Avoid Them:

- 1. Planting in Poor Soil: Citrus need very well drained soil. A slightly acidic, loamy soil is ideal. Dig in a good amount of well rotted organic matter before planting. In poorly drained conditions, grow citrus in large pots or raised beds.
- 2. Underfeeding: Citrus need large amounts of fertiliser to sustain growth and good fruiting. Feed monthly from first sign of spring growth until the end of December with a complete citrus food or organic fertiliser.
- 3. Ignoring Problems: Citrus trees can be plagued by scale, aphids, fruit fly, leaf miner and other pests. Look for early signs (curling or chewed leaves, general decline in health) and if you spot the problem early you can usually solve it easily by picking off and squashing the bugs or spraying with pest oil.
- 4. Planting Citrus in Shade: Citrus trees need full sun otherwise will produce lots of leafy growth and less fruit.
- 5. Inconsistent Watering: Citrus trees are shallow-rooted, so to keep them in tip-top condition you need to give them a reasonably consistent supply of water, particularly when they are young, or when fruit is developing. If not, maturing fruit may split.
- 6. Letting Young Plants Crop: Remove developing fruit on a young tree for 1-2 years so all energy goes into growth and development. This will result in a healthier plant with good framework for fruiting. Mature plants also benefit from "crop thinning" of heavy crops, so that the tree doesn't exhaust itself.
- 7. Planting around the Base: Any plants growing directly beneath citrus trees compete for water and nutrients and may encourage potentially fatal stem rot diseases. Instead, apply a layer of mulch, leaving a hand-span width clear of the trunk, and grow suitable companions away from the rootzone.





Pork, beef and eggplant stew Ingredients

¼ cup olive oil

1 medium brown onion, chopped finely

2 stalks celery trimmed, chopped finely

1 medium carrot, chopped finely

2 cloves garlic, crushed

315g minced pork

315g minced beef

1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh rosemary

1 cinnamon stick

2 cloves

Method

Heat 1 tablespoon of oil in a large frypan, add onion, celery, carrot and garlic; cook stirring, until onion softens. Add minces, rosemary, cinnamon and cloves to pan; cook stirring until browned. Add wine; simmer, uncovered until liquid has reduced. Add undrained tomatoes and stock; bring to boil.

Reduce heat, simmer, covered 30 minutes.

Place eggplant in colander, sprinkle with salt, stand 20 minutes. Rinse eggplant; drain pat dry.

Heat the remaining oil in frypan stir eggplant until browned. Add eggplant to meat mixture: simmer uncovered 15minutes. Season to taste.

Cook pasta in large saucepan of boiling water until tender, drain

Serve pasta with meat sauce.

Classic Apple Pie

Ingredients

10 medium apples (1.5kg)

1/2 cup (125ml) water

1/4 cup (55g) caster sugar

1 teaspoon finely grated lemon rind

1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 egg white

1 tablespoon caster sugar, extra



1 cup (150g) plain (all-purpose) flour

1/2 cup self-raising flour

1/4 cup cornflour

1/4 cup custard powder

1 tablespoon caster sugar

100 grams cold butter, chopped coarsely

1 egg yolk

1/4 cup (60ml) iced water

Method

Make pastry.

Process dry ingredients with butter until crumbly. Add egg yolk and the water, process until combined. Knead on a floured surface until smooth. Wrap in plastic wrap; refrigerate 30 minutes.

Peel, core and slice apples thickly. Place apples and the water in a large saucepan; bring to the boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, for 10 minutes or until apples soften. Drain; stir in sugar, rind and cinnamon. Cool.

Preheat oven to 220°C/425°F. Grease a deep 25cm (10-inch) pie dish.


Divide pastry in half. Roll one half between sheets of baking paper until large enough to line dish. Lift pastry into dish; press into base and side. Spoon apple mixture into pastry case; brush edge with egg white.

Roll remaining pastry until large enough to cover filling, lift onto filling. Press edges together; trim away excess pastry. Brush pastry with egg white; sprinkle with extra sugar.

Bake pie for 20 minutes. Reduce oven to 180°C/350°F; bake for a further 25 minutes or until golden brown.

Notes Make sure the apple filling has drained well and cooled to room temperature before you add it to the pastry case. Brushing the pastry case first with a little of the egg white before you add the filling will also help stop the apples from making the pastry soggy.





Avoid tax time scams

Ongoing cost of living pressures mean many Western Australians will be looking forward to receiving tax refunds, but the end of a financial year is also a time when scammers emerge with false promises of monetary windfalls.

In a sign scammers are once again ramping up their tax-time efforts, our WA ScamNet team has received reports of a phishing email claiming to be from the Australian Tax Office (ATO), but is actually from a completely unrelated email address.

The fake email (which even comes with stolen Australian Government logos) promises a refund of several hundred dollars, but only if the recipient sends across their personal and financial information in return. The scammers would then likely use this information to commit identity theft and steal their money.

Unfortunately this email is just one of many ways scammers target their potential victims, with more than 19,000 scam reports received by the ATO during the 2022-23 financial year alone.

Along with text messages and threatening phone calls, scammers are increasingly turning to social media. Both the ATO and myGov have expressed concerns about fake social media accounts impersonating their organisations, staff and senior executives that ask users to send a direct message so they can make phony offers of help with taxes or fake refunds.

No matter how you're contacted, the best way to stay safe from tax-time scammers is to 'practice the pause' on calls, emails and messages that come out of the blue and never send your personal or financial information to someone you don't know or trust.

For social media messages, investigate the account that has messaged you — look for verified ticks showing the account is genuine, then check the follower numbers and recent activity for any red-flags. On emails, click or hover over the sender's name to find the full email address. If you receive a phone call, hang up and call back the organisation using contact details you have independently sourced.






As the search intensifies, conflicting clues emerge that suggest no one really knew Brad - least of all Izzy ...

Adult Fiction: Where Light Meets Water - Susan Paterson


London, 1847. Sailor Tom Rutherford has two passions: the sea and his painting. Tom knows nothing but life on tall ships, and is determined to captain his own.


Non Fiction: Work Less Make More - Kim Northwood

Avoiding Phone and Internet Scams

Scammers are constantly changing the ways they work and adapting to new technologies. To keep yourself safe, it's important to know how scammers can use phones and the internet to try to profit from your personal information.

Types of scams

Technical support scams

This type of scam usually uses telephone cold-calls, browser pop-up windows, or paid search results on search engines like Google to trick people into thinking that there is malware or a virus on their computer.

Technical support scammers will often try to get you to install a remote access program that lets them control your computer. Scammers will lie, saying that

this is done to help solve the computer's issues. However, letting them into your computer will only cause more problems as they can access your personal information, documents and install malicious malware.

If granted access to your computer, the scammer may also claim that they have found the problem with your computer and ask you to pay a fee to fix it.

Phishing scams

Scammers can send you messages where they pretend to be from a company or organisation that you trust (such as your telco, your bank or a Government agency like the Australian Tax Office). These messages can be sent as emails, SMS messages, or through social media.

Phishing messages often ask you to click a link and enter your personal details.




Be aware that legitimate companies will not call, text or email you to ask you to update or verify your password, PIN, account details or credit card information. They will also not cold-call you to request payments over the phone.

Before you click a link (in an email or on social media, instant messages, other webpages, or other means), hover over that link to see the actual web address it will take you to (usually shown at the bottom of the screen). If you do not recognise or trust the address, try searching for relevant key terms in a web browser. This way you can find the article, video, or webpage without directly clicking on the suspicious link.

Avoiding Phone and Internet Scams *continued*

Missed call scams




These scams work by making a very short call to your mobile phone before hanging up. Scammers want you to call back the missed number so that they can charge you at a premium rate. The longer that they can keep you on the phone, the more money they can make from you.


If you don't recognise the number, if it is an international number, or the phone number starts with 190 (which identifies a premium rate service), there's a chance that it may be a missed call scam.

Fake online shopping scams

Online shopping scams involve scammers pretending to be genuine



online stores. This is usually done with a fake website that closely resembles the real deal (e.g. using a capital "i" to replace the "l" in "Telstra.com.au"), or by setting up a website that doesn't deliver goods as promised.



When making payments online, you should also look for secure websites — these have a closed padlock symbol in the URL bar and begin with "https".

How to stay protected from phone and internet scams

- Never let strangers remotely access your computer, even if they claim to be from a well-known company.
- If you're not sure that a call is legitimate, hang up and call the company back by using their official contact details.
- Don't call back phone numbers that start with 19xx, or unknown international numbers.
- Don't click on links in emails or messages, or open attachments, from people or organisations you don't know.
- Be careful about how much personal information you share on social media sites.
- Regularly update your computer with anti-virus and anti-spyware software.
