COUNCIL MEETINGS

Council meet on the 3rd Wednesday of each month. Members of the public who wish to raise any questions are invited to attend the meeting during public question time. Council agendas and minutes are available to download via our website.

INDEPENDENT LIVING UNITS

At its May ordinary meeting, council resolved to accept the tender from K Built Construction for the construction of 4 Independent Living Units at 27 Johnston Street, Wickepin at a tendered price of \$1,329,966. The CEO is to negotiate a price for the inclusion of a double lock up garage to be taken to the June 2020 council meeting.

RAILWAY DAM

Council also authorised the unbudgeted expenditure of \$25,000 for the enlarging of the Wickepin Railway Dam by removing the centre wall and front section of the dam to square the dam. Works are due to commence within the next two weeks.

COMMUNITY SPORT GRANTS

The McGowan Government will fast-track \$12 million in funding applications for community sport and recreation projects to expedite the projects and support Western Australia's economy as part of the COVID-19 recovery.

Applications for Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund's (CSRFF) Annual and Forward Planning grants of up to \$2 million opened on Monday 25 May 2020, and close on Friday 11 September 2020.

The grants will allow local not-for-profit sport, recreation or community groups and local governments to develop basic, sustainable infrastructure to increase participation in sport and recreation, while supporting the economy and creating jobs.

Examples of projects which will be considered for funding include:

- New playing surfaces e.g. ovals, courts, synthetic surfaces etc.
- Floodlighting
- Change rooms and ablutions
- Sports storage
- Clubrooms including social space, kitchen, administration areas and viewing areas. Please note that these areas have a minimal impact on physical activity and would be considered a lower priority.
- Resurfacing of existing sports surfaces.

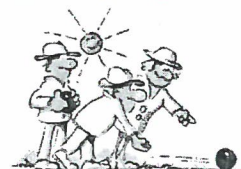

IN THE KITCHEN

Winter warmers



Roasted pumpkin soup

INGREDIENTS:

1 1/2 tablespoon olive oil
3 cloves garlic
1.5kg butternut pumpkin, diced
20g butter
1 medium leek, trimmed, halved, washed, sliced

2 medium cream delight potatoes, peeled, chopped
1 litre Massel chicken liquid stock
1 tablespoon pure cream
1 tablespoon chopped fresh chives
Ciabatta bread, sliced, toasted, to serve

METHOD:

Preheat oven to 200°C /180°C fan-forced. Line 2 large baking trays with baking paper. Place pumpkin and garlic in a bowl. Add oil. Season with salt and pepper. Toss to coat. Arrange pumpkin mixture, in a single layer, on prepared tray. Bake for 40 minutes or until pumpkin is golden and tender.

Squeeze garlic cloves from skin. Reserve. Discard skin. Melt butter in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Add leek. Cook, stirring, for 3 minutes or until leek has softened. Add potato. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes.

Add stock and 2 cups cold water. Season with pepper. Cover. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer for 15 minutes or until potato is tender. Stir in roasted pumpkin and garlic. Cook for 5 minutes or until heated through. Set aside for 5 minutes to cool slightly.

Blend pumpkin mixture, in batches, until smooth. Return to pan over low heat. Cook, stirring, for 2 to 3 minutes or until heated through. Ladle into serving bowls. Drizzle with cream and sprinkle with chives. Serve with toasted ciabatta slices.

Roast tomato and basil soup

INGREDIENTS:

1 bulb garlic, unpeeled, cloves separated
1kg roma tomatoes, halved lengthways
2 tablespoons olive oil
1 cup fresh basil leaves, finely shredded
1 large brown onion, finely chopped

1/3 cup tomato paste
2 cups Massel chicken style liquid stock
Toasted ciabatta bread, to serve
Small fresh basil leaves, to serve

METHOD:

Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan-forced. Line a tray with baking paper. Place tomato (cut-side up) and garlic cloves on prepared tray. Drizzle with half the oil. Season with salt and pepper. Roast for 40 minutes or until tomato is tender. Remove from oven. Set aside to cool slightly.

Peel garlic. Discard skins. Process tomato, garlic and half the shredded basil until smooth.

Strain through a sieve into a heatproof bowl. Discard tomato seeds.

Heat remaining oil in a large saucepan over medium-high heat. Add onion. Cook, stirring, for 3 minutes or until soft. Add tomato paste. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until fragrant. Add stock and tomato mixture. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Simmer, stirring occasionally, for 10 minutes or until mixture has thickened slightly. Stir in remaining shredded basil. Season with pepper. Ladle into bowls.

Top with basil leaves. Serve with bread.

Making a Family Decision

Change is an inevitable part of your life. You and your family may notice changes in your situation which highlight the need to consider and plan for aged care services to support you or your partner.

- Be observant. Your loved ones may try to cover up frailties (for a variety of reasons), look for signs that suggest they are not managing
