

And knowing rice can be prepared In many different ways He thought it wise to cook enough To last for several days.



FENCE LINE CLEARING

Can I Clear Native Vegetation Along My Fence Line?

If you are the owner of the property, you may clear a strip along a fence line within your property to the width necessary to provide access to construct or maintain a fence, provided that the clearing, combined with other limited exempt clearing (under the Regulations) on the property, does not exceed five hectares in the financial year in which the clearing takes place.

A separate exemption exists for clearing between private property and Crown land (eg a road reserve), provided that the clearing on the Crown land is no more than 1.5 metres from the fence and is required to enable access to construct or maintain a fence. This exemption applies to the owner of the land on which the clearing is to take place or with the prior authority of the owner, therefore in the case of a road reserve, written approval from your local shire council must be obtained prior to undertaking the clearing.

These exemptions do not apply in environmentally sensitive areas.

The onus is on the land owner and any other person carrying out the clearing on their behalf, to ensure compliance with the Environmental Protection Act 1986 (EP Act), regardless of any advice given by the Shire.

It is important to read the exemption as a whole which is made up of the following requirements or elements:

- 1. It authorises the clearing of native vegetation on Crown land along a fence line; and
- 2. The clearing can only be for the purpose of providing access to construct or maintain a fence between private property and Crown land; and
- 3. (as a limitation to these first two parts of the exemption) –the clearing can be no more than 1.5 metres from the fence line.

If the intended clearing does not satisfy all of these requirements then the exemption does not apply and a clearing permit is required.

The following images provide examples of this exemption:

Although a tree may have limbs that overhang a fence and there is a possibility that a tree limb could fall and damage the fence at a later point in time, the tree cannot be cleared under this exemption unless all three requirements are met. If the limbs do not impede access to the area to construct or maintain the fence (the second requirement) the exemption would not apply and a clearing permit issued by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) would be required. The limb itself could be removed (pruned) as it would not constitute 'clearing' as defined under the EP Act if the removal of this limb does not cause substantial damage to the tree and the trunk of the tree is not severed.


This exemption does not authorise the wholesale clearing of all native vegetation on the Crown land within 1.5 metres of the fence line, it only authorises the clearing of as much vegetation as is necessary "to provide access to construct or maintain a fence".


Any clearing undertaken must be done in such a way to limit damage to neighbouring vegetation.

Unauthorised Clearing of Native Vegetation


The clearing of native vegetation in Western Australia without authorisation is an offence under the Environmental Protection Act 1986. Unlawful clearing by individuals can result in fines of up to \$250,000. Guidelines on clearing exemptions and applications for clearing permits are available on the DWER website www.dwer.wa.gov.au

Plants for Free....

Plants for Free by Cutting or Division can be done at any time of the year, depending on the plant you are working with.

In a Nutshell, It's not that hard to do.

1. Water your "Mother" plant the day before if possible

For Cuttings:

- 2. Select strong, disease free stems and each cutting should be long enough to have one "Node" above the ground and at least one, preferably more, "Nodes" below the ground when potted. (A "Node" is the growing point from where leaves and shoots originate)
- 3. Trim the top of the cutting to "just above a node" and trim the base to "just below a node".
- 4. Gently strip the cutting of leaves from lower half, and if the top leaves are large, then cut them in half to prevent moisture loss and force energy to the bottom to form roots.
- 5. Dunk cuttings in a very weak solution of vinegar or bleach for 10-20 minutes before planting to kill fungal spores and reduce infections.
- 6. Dip base in honey or hormone powder to encourage faster root development.
- 7. Plant in pot with potting mix, using a stick to make a hole, thus preventing wounds (and infections) to the cutting by just "pushing" it in.
- 8. Water in and cover with plastic bag, or a plastic water bottle with the neck cut off. This prevents drying out whilst the roots develop.
- 9. Watering should not be needed as long as mix stays "just moist". New growth should appear from 4-8 weeks (some take longer), when you can open the bag to reduce humidity and "harden off" your new plant, ready for Potting On into a bigger pot, or into your garden.

For Divisions:

Using a small spade or hand trowel, dig into the root zone of the mother plant and extract a clump. Lift and trim the foliage to about half, the re-plant and water in well.

If you are dividing a tuber or bulb from a potted plant, then tip the whole lot out of the pot and divide accordingly, then re-pot, trim leaves to half and water well.

A great way of expanding your garden is to take "cuttings" or "divisions" from the shrubbery and bulbs you already have growing as you are pruning or tidying your garden.

Some shrubs to try propagating by cutting are (but not limited to): Escallonia, Diosma, Lavendar, Rock Rose, Geranium, Pelargonium, Duranta, Bottlebrush, Grevillea.

By "division" of clumps of roots, or tubers or bulbs, many garden plants can be spread around to fill empty spots. Salvia, Iris, Clivea, Bromeliads, Cacti, Dahlias, English daisy and others can all be "divided" and re-planted in garden beds or pots.

Pizza bianca with zucchini, potatoes and prosciutto



DOUGH

2/3 cup lukewarm water

1 teaspoon caster sugar

1 sachet dry yeast

1 1/2 cups plain flour, plus extra for dusting

3/4 teaspoon salt

1 tablespoon olive oil

Spring-time is picnic time

PIZZA Topping

2 teaspoons plus 4 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil

1 brushed potato, washed and cut 1/2 cm-thick slices

1 small-medium zucchini, thinly shaved

4 cloves garlic, minced

METHOD

60g baby rocket 1/2 lemon

1 cup shredded parmesan cheese

6 thin slices prosciutto

For the dough: Mix the water, sugar, and yeast in a liquid measuring cup. Set aside for 5 minutes, or until a foam forms on the top of the mixture.

Blend the flour and salt together in a food processor. Pour in the yeast mixture and oil, and blend briefly until a dough forms, about 10 seconds. Transfer dough to a work surface and knead for 2 minutes, or until it becomes smooth and elastic. The dough will be tacky but will release cleanly from your hands.

Place the dough on a floured baking tray and dust the top with flour. Cover with plastic wrap and set aside in a warm place for 45 minutes to 1 hour, or until doubled in size.

For the pizza: Position rack in middle of oven and preheat to 280C or as hot as the oven goes. Lightly brush a heavy large baking tray with 1 teaspoon oil.

Place potato slices in small saucepan and add enough cold water to cover. Bring to the boil, reduce heat and simmer for 2-3 minutes, or until potato slices are just tender. Drain and set aside to cool. Transfer to a medium bowl and toss with zucchini and 2 tablespoons oil. Season with salt and pepper.

In a small bowl, mix the garlic and remaining 2 tablespoons oil.

Flour hands, stretch dough then press out onto prepared baking tray to about a 37x29 cm rectangle. Spread garlic-oil mixture evenly over dough. Sprinkle over half the cheese. Arrange the potato mixture in a single layer, then the zucchini. Season with salt and pepper. Scatter over remaining cheese.

Bake pizza for 8-10 minutes until crust is crisp and golden brown.

Arrange prosciutto over pizza. Toss rocket with remaining 1 teaspoon oil to coat then scatter over pizza. Squeeze over lemon juice. Cut into 12 square slices and serve.

Pumpkin, spinach and fetta muffins INGREDIENTS

1 cup self-raising flour

1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour

2 cups coarsely grated pumpkin

60g baby spinach leaves, finely shredded

100g fetta, coarsely crumbled

1 Egg, lightly whisked

80g butter, melted

1 cup buttermilk

2 tablespoons pepitas (pumpkin seeds)

2 teaspoons chia seeds

METHOD

Preheat oven to 180C. Line a 12-hole, muffin pan with paper cases. Place the combined flour, pumpkin, spinach and fetta in a large bowl and stir to combine.

Whisk the egg, butter and buttermilk in a small bowl. Add to the flour mixture and stir until just combined.

Divide the mixture evenly among the muffin pans. Sprinkle evenly with pepitas and chia seeds.

Bake for 20-25 mins or until skewer inserted into the centres comes out clean. Cool slightly on wire rack.
