HAVE YOU MADE A PAYMENT TO THE SHIRE VIA EFT?

On Wednesday 30 September 2020 the Shire of Wickepin received a payment via EFT. Insufficient information was provided in regards to the payment therefore the funds could not be allocated to the correct payee. If this is **YOUR** payment please contact the shire with evidence of payment so the funds can be processed.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

The restricted burning season commenced 1 October 2020 and goes through to 13 November 2020. This means that no burning can be carried out unless you have a permit from your local Fire Control Officer.

A reminder that if you are reporting a fire you must ring 000, not the shire office. This measure will save valuable time.

HARVEST BAN ALERTS

The SMS (text) alert service will again be in operation over the coming harvest period.

If you would like to register your number to receive these messages or have your number removed from the system, please contact the office or email your details to admin@wickepin.wa.gov.au.

BUSH FIRE UNIFORMS

Bush fire uniforms and personal protective goggles and respirators for Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade officers are available from the shire administration office, with one free uniform per registered brigade volunteer. You MUST be registered with your brigade to receive a uniform and not have received a uniform previously.

WICKEPIN AQUATIC CENTRE

The pool is scheduled to open Sunday, 1 November 2020, 1pm – 6pm. The pool will be closed every second Tuesday commencing 10 November unless the temperature is above 35°C or there are VacSwim or Education Department swimming lessons.

DOG REGISTRATIONS

All owners of registered dogs should have received renewal notices in the mail by now, with the due date being 31 October 2020. If you are an owner of a dog who is older than 3 months living within our shire and haven't yet registered them please do so. The relevant forms and information are available on our website www.wickepin.wa.gov.au or please contact the Admin Office.

COVID 19 - NOTICE TO ALL CLUBS (SERVICE OF FOOD)

Serving of Food – during and after events

All clubs must continue to stay aware of Government regulations and advice surrounding this matter, especially in an environment where the situation may change rapidly.

Hygiene Course

All staff and volunteers associated with service of food and/or bar service must complete the required COVID Hygiene Courses. Details of these courses are available here: https://hospitalityhygiene.com/

COVID Safety Plan

Phase 4 restrictions do require an up-to-date COVID Safety Plan, and the certificate must be on display in your Club. The plan should address the provision of food should the Club plan to do so.

Provision of Meals

It is suggested that all meals, including lunches provided at carnivals, be served individually plated and directly to patrons seated at their table. This should include all elements available on the one individual plate, rather than any "self-service" options like a salad bar or shared plates of food in the middle of tables.

Service directly to the table also avoids lines which are difficult to manage in a COVID friendly manner.

After game snacks

It is recommended that clubs should not be serving shared platters of food (sandwiches, party pies, cheese and biscuits etc) to tables while Phase 4 restrictions are in place. Should Clubs devise a

method of serving any of these types of food using an individual serve approach (eg. Individually packaged cheese and biscuits, or sandwiches) then this would be appropriate, but may be a costly solution. At this time it may be prudent to leave this post game offer out until we move to Stage 5 - perhaps a free drink for the opposition may suffice.

Cake stalls etc

Whilst this may be a popular method of raising funds, it is recommended against the running of cake stalls or other "bring a plate" type events during this time. Unfortunately, the safe and hygienic provision of such items is unable to be assured, hence this recommendation.

Sausage Sizzles/Barbecues

Again, avoiding lines and self-service is the advice. So having approved people doing the preparation and then serving the food directly to patrons is the recommendation. Clearly these recommendations, with our best advice to simply follow the Government regulations.

Wickepin set to become Western Australia's newest astronomy town

The Shire of Wickepin is set to be added to the WA's Astrotourism Towns map. Wickepin Shire Council supported a recent proposal to include the town of Wickepin and surrounding landmarks as world-class destinations for stargazing, astrophotography and astronomy. Carol Redford from Astrotourism WA has established a stargazing trail across the Wheatbelt and Mid West over the past two years and Wickepin is the newest addition.

"Regional WA has very low levels of light pollution, making our night sky one of the best in the world. Astrotourism WA is rolling out the welcome mat for visitors to experience our awe-inspiring views of the Milky Way," Carol says.

Carol travelled to Wickepin to present the concept and ideas to the Townscape and Cultural Planning Committee in June and has since been working with Shire staff to begin the development of Astrotourism. The Shire of Wickepin has recognised that dark skies are becoming a rarity on Earth and are highly sought after by thousands of people around the world. Turning this into an economic asset worth maintaining.

Shire President, Cr Julie Russell says, "Astrotourism has the potential to attract visitors and create jobs in our region. A night time activity such as stargazing lends itself to making sure visitors stay overnight and we see the opportunity for ventures such as farm stays and organised astrophotography field trips."

"Being an Astrotourism Town contributes to the Shire Strategic Community Plan's aim to develop and improve foreshore amenities at Lake Yealering. It's a natural asset which can be promoted as a stargazing and astrophotography destination for visitors," she said.

Carol is currently working with Council's Community Development Officer, Michelle Hetherington, to plan a free family-friendly and fun community stargazing evening with telescope viewing. All will be welcome and the date will be released in coming months. The event will be made possible by the Shire of Wickepin and Astrotourism WA.





Garden Snippets....



...Bird Haven..

Encourage Native Birds to your garden by installing a BirdBath to keep them cool and hydrated...

All birds enjoy bathing. They love the opportunity to splash, roll and play in puddles of water, and they also need plenty of water to drink all year around, and especially in hotter months.

Clean, cool water under a leafy tree is a great kindness to them, and can sometimes be one of the hardest necessity for birds to find.

So, Install a Birdbath....

Many people believe that water will attract more birds to your garden than a feeder will, so a birdbath is one of the easiest ways to bring birds up close where you can have a good look at them.

Make sure you keep your birdbath either on a pedestal or hung from a tree to make it easier to clean, and also keep birds safe from predators.

It is very easy to create and make your own using a few rocks, bricks, wrought iron legs of somesort, or other such item for the pedestal, with a suitable sized shallow bowl for the water container.

Place your birdbath amongst shrubbery, for shade, and use a small sprinkler for the water to create a most inviting cool spot for birds to gather.

You will soon have a menagerie of birdlife flitting around your garden.







1/4 cup lemon juice

Lemon zest, to serve

2/3 cup Greek Yoghurt

1 cup pure icing sugar, sifted

Extra 1 teaspoon lemon juice

Lemon yoghurt loaf with yoghurt drizzle

INGREDIENTS

175g butter, softened

1 cup caster sugar

1 1/2 tablespoons finely grated lemon rind

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

3 eggs

1 3/4 cups self-raising flour

METHOD

Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan-forced. Grease a 7cm-deep, 11.5cm x 20cm loaf pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, extending paper 5cm above edges on all sides.

Using an electric mixer, beat butter, caster sugar, lemon rind and vanilla together until light and fluffy. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating until combined after each addition. Add flour. Stir to combine. Add lemon juice and 1/2 cup yogurt. Stir to combine.

Pour mixture into prepared pan. Bake for 55 minutes to 1 hour or until a skewer inserted into the centre of loaf comes out clean (cover loosely with foil if over-browning during cooking). Stand in pan for 10 minutes. Turn, top-side up, onto a wire rack lined with baking paper to cool completely

Combine icing sugar and remaining yoghurt in a medium bowl. Add enough extra lemon juice to form a drizzling consistency. Drizzle icing over loaf. Sprinkle with lemon zest. Stand for 15 minutes. Serve.

Lemon & lime curd tarts

INGREDIENTS

METHOD

1 1/2 cups plain flour
2 tablespoons icing sugar mixture
150g chilled butter, chopped
2 tablespoons water
Thinly sliced lemon, to serve
Thinly sliced lime, to serve

LEMON-LIME CURD

1/4 cup fresh lemon juice

1/4 cup fresh lime juice

1/4 cup caster sugar

4 eggs, at room

temperature, lightly whisked

100g butter, chopped




Sift the flour and icing sugar into a large bowl. Use your fingertips to rub the butter into the flour mixture until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add the water and use a round-bladed knife in a cutting motion to mix until the dough just starts to come together. Use your hands to bring the dough together. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and gently knead until smooth. Shape into a disc. Cover with plastic wrap and place in the fridge for 15 minutes to rest.

Divide the dough into 2 even portions. Roll 1 portion out on a lightly floured surface until about 3-4mm thick. Use a 14cm-diameter round pastry cutter to cut 3 discs from the dough. Repeat with the remaining dough portion. Line six 2cm-deep, 11cm (base measurement) fluted tart tins, with removable bases, with the pastry and trim excess. Place on 2 baking trays. Place in the fridge for 20 minutes to rest.

Preheat oven to 190°C. Cover pastry bases with baking paper. Fill with pastry weights or rice. Bake for 10 minutes. Remove paper and pastry weights or rice. Bake for 7-8 minutes or until golden. Set aside to cool completely. To make the lemon-lime curd, whisk together the lemon juice, lime juice, sugar and egg in a medium heatproof bowl. Add the butter. Place the mixture over a saucepan of simmering water, making sure the bowl doesn't touch the water. Cook, stirring often, for 8 minutes or until the curd thickens and coats the back of a spoon. Divide the curd among the tart cases. Top with lemon and lime slices to serve.

Freeze lemon juice in ice block containers, snap lock bags, or other containers so when lemons are plentiful you have lemon juice all year round!
