

Works have commenced on the construction of 4 x Independent Living Units on Johnston St, Wickepin.

Over the last 5 years the Wheatbelt South Aged Housing Alliance, comprising the Shires of Wickepin, Corrigin, Cuballing and Kondinin, have worked together to secure grant funding to enable more aged care housing to be accessed in our region.

The units are funded by DPIRD Royalties for Regions Housing Project (State), DISER Drought Communities Programme (Federal) and the Shire of Wickepin.


2020 COMMUNITY AWARDS



Eggplant, rocket and goats cheese salad

3 eggplants, cut into 1cm thick slices crossways

½ cup olive oil

2 tbs lemon juice

1tbs extra virgin olive oil


1 bunch rocket, ends trimmed

150g goats cheese crumbled

Preheat barbecue flat plate on medium. Brush both sides of eggplant with olive oil. Cook half the eggplant on the flat plate for 3-4 minutes each side or until tender and golden. Transfer to a plate. Cover with foil and keep warm. Whisk lemon juice and extra virgin olive oil in a jug until well combined. Season. Arrange half the eggplant on a serving platter. Top with half the rocket and sprinkle over half the goat's cheese. Drizzle over half the dressing. Continue layering with the remaining eggplant, rocket, goat's cheese and dressing.



Rum Balls



INGREDIENTS

1/2 x 800g dark fruit cake, chopped 1/4 cup dark rum 1/4 cup dried cranberries, chopped 2 x 180g blocks dark chocolate, melted 1 1/2 cups desiccated coconut 1/2 cup chocolate sprinkles

METHOD

Crumble fruit cake into a bowl. Add rum and mix well to combine. Add cranberries. chocolate and 1/2 cup coconut. Mix well to combine.

Roll 1 level tablespoon fruit cake mixture into a ball. Toss in remaining coconut. Place onto a baking paper-lined tray. Repeat with remaining fruit cake mixture, tossing half the rum balls in coconut and the remaining rum balls in chocolate sprinkles. Refrigerate the balls for 2 hours or until firm. Serve

RE: New Corpuls Monitors for St John

St John WA will be rolling out new cardiac monitors to be installed in all ambulances across WA. These will replace current machines that are no longer supported by the manufacturer in terms of service and parts.

Corpuls Monitors have been trialled in the metro area and two larger regional areas with great feedback from volunteers about the new machines. They also give volunteers enhanced ability to get remote clinical advice and support from our Clinical Support Paramedics. In particular, a quicker diagnosis of cardiac issues that can be passed onto the receiving hospital and medical staff.

With new exciting equipment, comes a hefty price tag. Each machine will cost a minimum of \$30,000 for installation and training. We need your help. Wickepin Sub Centre needs three machines, one for each of our vans, Harrismith, Wickepin and Yealering.

We are asking the community, that if you are in a position to do so as a local family or business to please make a donation towards these. This essential equipment will make us better equipped for any cardiac callouts and be of greater benefit to the community.



• Diploma or Certificate 111 in Children's Service or Early Childhood Education and Care, or be working towards a Diploma or Certificate

AND

- Current Working with Children Check or willingness to apply for a Working with Children Check
- First Aid, Anaphylaxis & Asthma training or willingness to complete training.

Familiarity with the Early Years Learning Framework and National Quality Standard is preferable, or willingness to do some background reading, which will be provided once a member of the staff pool.

Interested workers can register for short or long term, full time or part time relief positions in a specific location or any REED location. In a part time position there will be plenty of time to explore surrounding countryside, and enjoy the social environment offered by small regional towns.

REED offers the opportunity for paid employment under Children's Services Award conditions, and workers are encouraged to seek advice regarding any impact of paid employment on superannuation, pension and benefit entitlements. Alternatively, workers may prefer to work in a voluntary capacity and be reimbursed for an agreed level of expenses.




