# PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

The prohibited burning season commenced 14 November 2020 and goes through to 7 February 2021. This means that NO burning can be carried out.

A reminder that if you are reporting a fire you must ring 000, not the shire office. This measure will save valuable time. We wish all our bush fire and emergency services volunteers a safe season.

# **BUSH FIRE UNIFORMS**

Bush fire uniforms and personal protective goggles and respirators for Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade officers are available from the shire administration office, with one free uniform per registered brigade volunteer. You MUST be registered with your brigade to receive a uniform and not have received a uniform previously.

All owners of registered dogs should have received renewal notices in the mail by now, with the due date being 31 October 2020. If you are an owner of a dog who is older than 3 months living within our shire and haven't yet registered them please do so. Owners of unregistered dogs can incur an on the spot fine by Council Rangers.

# **COVID-19 CONTACT REGISTER**

As of 5 December 2020, to keep all Western Australians safe, particular businesses and venues must maintain a contact register of patrons, staff, visitors and contractors for COVID-19 contact tracing, if required. Particular businesses are:

- food and licensed venues (restaurants, cafés, bars, pubs, taverns, nightclubs)
- gyms, indoor sporting centres and pools
- places of worship and funeral parlours
- beauty and personal care services including hairdressers and barbers
- galleries and museums
- cinemas, theatres and other entertainment venues
- auction houses and real estate inspections
- community facilities, libraries and halls
- zoos and amusement parks
- function centres
- accommodation facilities that already have checkin arrangements in place (ie hostels, hotels, large camp grounds).

Details required are location, date, name, telephone number and arrival time. Email addresses are optional.

### You must:

- keep contact details for 28 days
- store the information confidentially and securely

Both electronic and paper-based systems are considered acceptable, as long as they record the date, arrival time, names and telephone numbers of staff and customers.

To help businesses and venues, the WA Government has developed the SafeWA app. This is a free system that uses QR codes to register attendance.





# HIRING OF SHIRE FACILITIES & COMMUNITY BUS

For any booking of a council owned facility a venue hire form MUST be completed IN FULL DETAIL prior to the date of intended use. Hire fee and bond payment is required to be paid prior to hiring. Waiving of the bond can be requested but must be made in writing 7 days before the facility is being used and is at the discretion of the CEO.

Community Bus hire bookings must be completed using the bus hire form and completed IN FULL DETAIL and returned along with a copy of the driver's current drivers' licence, front and back. The bus must be returned clean inside and out and any damage reported. Failure to comply with these conditions may result in refusal to hire the bus in the future.

Demand for hire of shire facilities and community bus has been increasing over time. Bookings WILL NOT be confirmed until the appropriate paperwork has been received by the administration office and completed to a satisfactory and comprehensible standard. All booking forms are available via the shire's website or can be requested via email.

# Barbecued prawns with ginger and mango mayonnaise

### **INGREDIENTS**

4 kg green tiger prawns, peeled, leaving tail intact, deveined

1 stalk lemongrass, white part only, finely chopped

- 4 kaffir lime leaves, finely shredded
- 2 tablespoons peanut oil

**GINGER AND MANGO MAYONNAISE** 

- 1 mango, peeled, stoned, finely chopped
- 1 tablespoon finely grated fresh ginger
- 1 tablespoon lime juice
- 2 egg yolks
- 1 teaspoon mustard powder
- 1 cup (250ml) vegetable oil

### **METHOD**

Combine the prawns, lemongrass, lime leaves and oil in a bowl. Cover with plastic wrap. Place in the fridge for 1 1/2 hours to marinate.

To make the mayonnaise, place mango, ginger, lime juice, egg yolks and mustard powder in the bowl of a food processor and process until smooth. With the motor running, add the oil in a thin, steady stream until mixture is thick and pale. Taste and season with salt and pepper.

Preheat barbecue on high. Add prawns and cook, turning occasionally, for 5-7 minutes or until prawns curl and change colour. Reserve one-third of the prawns, cover and place in the fridge to chill (see note).

Transfer remaining prawns to a serving platter and serve with the mayonnaise.



# Mango, white chocolate & coconut gateau

# **INGREDIENTS**

4 egg whites

🕆 1 cup caster sugar

2/3 cup Moist Coconut Flakes

2 x 180g pkts white chocolate, finely chopped

600ml ctn thickened cream
2 fresh mangoes, peeled, thinly sliced
lcing sugar, to dust

Preheat oven to 120ºC. Line 3 baking trays with non-stick baking paper. Draw a 22cm-diameter disc on each sheet. Turn the paper ink-side down. Line another baking tray with non-stick baking paper.

Use an electric beater to beat the egg whites in a large clean, dry bowl until soft peaks form. Add the sugar, 1 tablespoon at a time, beating constantly until the mixture is thick and glossy. Spread one-quarter of meringue mixture onto 1 disc. Repeat with two-thirds of the remaining meringue mixture to make 2 more discs. Sprinkle the discs with three-quarters of the coconut.

Spoon remaining meringue mixture into a piping bag fitted with a 1cm-diameter plain nozzle. Pipe logs of meringue onto the remaining lined tray. Sprinkle with remaining coconut. Bake the meringue discs and logs for 1 hour or until crisp and dry. Turn off oven. Leave the trays in oven, with the door slightly ajar, for 1 1/2 hours or until cool.

While the meringue is cooling, place the chocolate and 60ml (1/4 cup) of the cream in a heatproof bowl over a saucepan half-filled with simmering water (make sure the bowl doesn't touch the water). Use a metal spoon to stir until the chocolate melts and the mixture is smooth. Set aside for 5-10 minutes to cool slightly.

Use an electric beater to beat the remaining cream in a bowl until soft peaks form. Gently fold the cream into the chocolate mixture until just combined. Cover with plastic wrap and place in the fridge for 1 hour to chill.

Place 1 meringue disc on a serving plate and spread with one-third of the chocolate cream. Top with one-third of the mango. Repeat with the remaining meringue discs, chocolate cream and mango. Cover with plastic wrap and place in the fridge for 1 hour or until the meringue softens slightly.

Break the meringue logs into large pieces and place on top of the cake. Dust with icing sugar.
