Free mammograms for WICKEPIN women

BreastScreen WA's FREE screening mammogram service is coming to **Wickepin from 07/01/2021** – **11/01/2021**, and the mobile clinic will be located at **Wickepin Sports Club**, **beside bowling green, Wogolin Road**. Women 50 to 74 years are invited to have a FREE screening mammogram. (All women 40 years and over are eligible).

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and 1 in 7 women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should see her doctor immediately.


The Spill - Imbi Neeme





Festive Food



A Glazed ham is the centrepiece of the feast

Steps to Glaze a ham-there are plenty of glazes to choose from.

1 Remove rind, cut around the shank then gently run your hands between the rind and the fat.

2 For perfect presentation, score fat lightly, creating diamond shapes over the ham.

3 Decorate the diamonds with cloves, cherries, pineapple or whatever you choose by pressing into the fat using toothpicks to secure where needed.

4 Brush ham with a glaze before cooking and every 20 minutes while in oven.

Crispy-topped potato bake

INGREDIENTS

75g butter, chopped 60ml (1/4 cup) pouring cream 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

2 garlic cloves, bruised

4 sprigs fresh lemon thyme

2 dried bay leaves

2.4kg Red Delight potatoes

1 teaspoon sea salt flakes



METHOD

Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease a 2.5L baking dish with melted butter.

Stir the butter, cream, oil, garlic, thyme and bay leaves in a small saucepan over medium-low heat for 2-3 minutes or until melted and smooth. Season with pepper.

Use a mandolin or a sharp knife to cut the potatoes, 1 at a time, into 2mm-thick slices. Discard the end slices of each potato and place in stacks on a work surface. Arrange the slices standing on their sides, 1 stack at a time, in tightly packed rows in the prepared dish.

Strain the butter mixture through a small sieve into a jug. Discard solids. Pour butter mixture evenly over the potato. Sprinkle with salt. Cover with foil and bake for 30 minutes. Remove foil and bake for a further 1 hour or until top is golden and crisp. Set aside for 10 minutes to cool slightly.

Strawberries 'n' cream trifle





INGREDIENTS

1kg sponge cake or panettone, cut into 2-3cm pieces 300ml ctn thickened cream, whipped Strawberries, washed, hulled, halved, to decorate Pure icing sugar, to dust

STRAWBERRY COMPOTE

3 x 250g punnets strawberries, washed, hulled

1 1/2 cups dessert wine

¼ cup caster sugar

VANILLA BEAN CUSTARD

1/4 cup custard powder 1/4 cup caster sugar

2 1/2 cups milk

1 cup thickened cream

1 vanilla bean, split lengthways

250g ctn mascarpone



METHOD

To make the strawberry compote, stir the strawberries, wine and sugar in a saucepan over low heat until sugar dissolves. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer for 5-10 minutes or until strawberries are soft but still hold their shape. Set aside to cool completely.

To make the vanilla bean custard, combine the custard powder and sugar in a medium saucepan. Whisk in the milk and cream until smooth. Add the vanilla bean. Whisk over medium-low heat until the mixture boils and thickens. Boil, stirring constantly, for 1 minute. Transfer to a heatproof bowl. Cover the surface of the custard with plastic wrap to prevent a skin forming. Set aside to cool completely. Remove and discard the vanilla bean. Fold the mascarpone into the custard.

Place half the sponge or panettone in a 3L (12-cup) capacity glass serving bowl. Top with half the strawberry compote and half the custard. Repeat with remaining sponge or panettone, strawberry compote and custard. Cover with plastic wrap and place in the fridge overnight to chill.

Top with cream and strawberry. Dust with icing sugar

Garden Snippets...



...Practical with Pretty...

Plant Herbs and Vegies in your Flower Beds

If you love all those herbs and vegies in your salads, try integrating them into your ornamental garden instead of consigning them to an isolated patch "out the back". Their many varied leaves, flowers and fruits can be a productive, delightful and sensual addition to your flowering beds.

For Example...

Go wild with carrots and let them go to seed. The delicate umbels of tiny flowers can be creamy, pale yellow or lilac before they drop to produce a fresh crop. Pair with foxgloves for a perfect country garden.

Velvety purple sage planted next to wrinkly sea kale adds a touch of interesting colour and texture to the foliage of your garden.

Oregano can be used as a creeper and flowers with tiny blooms from spring to autumn. Bay Laurel is popular for topiary or used as a hedge, you can pluck the leaves for a winter soup or stew.

Use Sage in your garden border where the velvety, sweet-smelling leaves on the bush provide a feature of contrast against other leaf textures.

Lemon thyme has little pink flowers that last all through the summer and they are just as edible as the leaves.

Bees love the nectar-filled flowers of the Rosemary, and so it is a wonderful pollinator for all your other plants.

Plant a variegated leaf variety of Thyme as a border and appreciate its lovely aroma as you brush against it when you stroll past.

The list is endless...

Tips:

Fill empty spaces with parsley for a feathery touch and to help deter weeds

Thyme can be used as a pretty, sweet-smelling groundcover

Dwarf fruit trees kick off the flowering season in Spring with their wonderful blossoms

Be careful when using herbicides or pesticides on edible plants

Companion plant by putting onions and garlic next to roses to help deter aphids; Marigolds next to tomatoes to deter slugs; or Petunias next to beans to help keep bugs away.
