

Keith Parnell - Fire Control Officer, Tincurrin.

Shire President Julie Russell presented the following commendation at the Australia Day Breakfast at the Harrismith Golf Club:

"I would now like to acknowledge the retirement of one of our shire's long standing volunteer Bush Fire Control Officers – Keith Parnell.

From the records sourced, Keith commenced duties as the Local Government Fire Control Officer for the Tincurrin-Harrismith Bush Fire Brigade in the Shire of Wickepin on 2nd January 1990.

From the 19th September 2001 to 4th September 2005 Keith was appointed the Shire's Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officer, and then stepped up to the role of Chief Bush Fire Control Officer from 5th September 2005 until 9th December 2009.

Keith then reverted back to the role of Local Government FCO and Volunteer Firefighter for the Tincurrin-Harrismith Bushfire Brigade from 10th December 2009; and was also appointed as Local Government Fire Weather Officer from 26th July 2016.

His retirement from the role of Fire Control Officer took effect in October 2020.

Fire Control Officers regularly monitor the weather conditions and guide our communities as to the safety of activities that can be carried out through periods of severe and extreme weather events. In addition to this, they attend and oversee bushfire (and other fire) events; and join with other members of our volunteer bushfire brigades in responding to, and extinguishing, fires that have started by various means.

In the event of any emergency, FCO volunteers respond immediately the

call is taken-without fear or favour-, and to the best of their abilities.

In times of extreme emergencies Bushfire Officers may work hand in hand with St John Ambulance Officers, DFES, Police and Health Authorities to resolve the situation in a safe and timely manner.

On behalf of your Council and Community members, I would like to present Keith with this "Certificate of Appreciation" and Sincerely Thank You for all of your Years of Service in these roles; and for your Professionalism, Skill and Knowledge in managing these situations.



With lots of fruit and veggies in season at present so a great time to make some preserves. Here are a couple of yummy recipes to try out.

Spiced Tomato and Apple Chutney.

Ingredients:

1 kg Tomatoes

1 Onion finely chopped (large)

2 Granny Smith apples peeled and diced.

100gm Sultanas

300 gm sugar

200ml white vinegar 2 tsp salt

½ tsp mixed spice

1 tsp ginger

½ tsp black pepper

½ tsp cayenne pepper

Method:

- Combine vinegar, sugar and spices in a large heavy based saucepan and heat until the sugar has dissolved.
- Add remaining ingredients and simmer over a very low heat for 2 hours, stirring occasionally, until a thick consistency is achieved.
- Pour into sterilised jars while still hot and seal.

Note: the chutney can be eaten immediately but is best left for 1-2 weeks to mature. Makes 4-5 jars.

Apricot Jam

Ingredients:

2.5 kg Apricots

¼ cup water

¼ cup freshly squeezed lemon juice

2kg sugar

Method:

- Wash apricots cut in half to remove stones.
- Place in a heavy based saucepan with lemon juice and water.
- Bring to boil over medium heat, stirring occasionally, cook until tender.
- Add sugar and stir until dissolved, increase heat and boil gently, uncovered until thick. Stir regularly to ensure mixture does not catch and burn on the bottom of the pan.
- Test a teaspoonful on a saucer to check that it will set.
- Ladle into hot jars and cover tightly.





When IRIS Eyes Are Smiling...

Iris' come up gaily and naturally in almost every part of the world, including Australia. They are hardy, evergreen perennials, and there are three species - Rhizomatous; Bulbous-rooted and Tuberous-rooted. These are further divided into several sections, the main ones being Tall bearded; Dwarf bearded; Beardless; Cushion; Japanese; Tuberous-rooted and Bulbous.

Tall Bearded Iris like to grow in sunny borders amongst other perennials, or planted out in beds by themselves. They like an ordinary, well-drained soil with plenty of lime. Each autumn give a top dressing of lime, then in spring fertilize with superphosphate. If using animal manure make sure it is well aged as fresh animal manure may cause the rhizome to rot. Plant the rhizome firmly with the top part protruding above the soil surface. Cut the Foliage down in autumn so that sun can bake the rhizomes and keep them from rotting over winter. Soil should be kept friable and not allowed to become hard or sodden. Lift and divide every 4 years, and plant out anytime between December and May, the earlier the better.

Dwarf Bearded Iris have the same cultivation as the taller variety but prefer to grow in full sunshine and be very well drained. They can be used for permanent edgings; massed in groups in borders and rock gardens; or used as ground covers on dry banks.

Beardless Iris come in many forms. Some like ordinary rich soil and full sunshine, whilst other species like wet conditions and will grow along the margins of ponds and streams. The Little Crested Iris likes a deep soil with plenty of humus and grows best in half shade, whilst the lime-hating Californian Iris have very fine thread-like roots, are hard to transplant, and are mostly grown from seed.

Cushion Iris are also known as the **Regalia Section**, as many of them come from Turkey or Turkestan. These love good drainage and plenty of sun and include the Mourning Iris.

Japanese Iris have large, flat flowers often 25cm across. They have fibrous roots, so they don't store water in rhizomes during dry spells as do the previously mentioned species of Iris. They do best growing at the edges of ponds with their roots in shallow water. They can be grown in garden beds, rock gardens or sunken gardens, so long as they get plenty of water. These Iris send leaves straight up from their fibrous roots before new roots are established in spring, when watering and careful attention is a must should there be a dry spell.

Tuberous-Rooted Iris come from the monsoon area of south-east Asia and consist of only two species that are quite different from any other Iris. These plants have a small tuberous root protected by the fibre from the old leaves from previous years. Thick, white roots grow out from these tubers, rather like Alstroemeria roots. They must be grown in very well drained soil, as they don't like too much water in winter, but they also need thorough periodic watering in summer, so a good place to plant them is underneath overhanging eaves. Flowers are in sprays of three on a stem, which open in succession, each one only lasting eight hours.

Bulbous Iris are mostly European in origin and include the English, Spanish and Dutch Iris, and the early flowering Reticulatas and Tingitanas, many of which have been crossed, giving a great number of varieties. These bulbs like a well drained, friable soil in an open position, and look attractive in bold colour groups or in mass plantings along borders. Dutch iris need to be planted 7.5cm deep, whereas English iris have larger bulbs so should be planted deeper. For Spring flowering, bulbs should be planted in Autumn; and for Autumn flowering, bulbs must be planted in Spring or early Summer.



Adult Fiction Friends and Strangers by J. Courtney Sulivan

Elisabeth, an accomplished journalist and new mother, is struggling to adjust to life in a small town after nearly twenty years in New York City. 
Adult Large Print Fiction Below deck by Sophie Hardcastle
