





# From "YARNS FROM THE FARM".

Someone asked me a few days ago what happens at seeding time. And the simple answer of "it's when we plant the crops" just didn't do it justice. Seeding time is... a combination of little moments.

It's the unspoken tension as the weather forecasts show up empty handed each morning. It's the chaos that comes with trying to coordinate tractors, and the trucks to fill the tractors, and the utes to fuel the trucks. It's the satisfaction of finishing the last run on a big paddock. It's trying to navigate your way around the trees and rock piles while your tractor cab is engulfed in a cloud of dust. It's the amazing sunrises and sunsets that leave the sky dripping with colour. It's working alongside each other in silence, too tired to talk while clambering up over tyres and metal bars to unblock seeding hoses. It's the relief of falling asleep to the sound of rain on the tin roof. It's the 9pm fill ups underneath the Milky Way that put life back into perspective. It's the family two-way talk back that starts up after listening to Richard Fidler or the Country Hour on ABC radio in 3 different vehicles. It's the familiar glow of tractor headlights on the horizon as evening falls. It's the 180km round trip into town for machinery parts and veggies. It's figuring out the perfect lunchbox combination as you draw to the end of the season. It's the constant tag team between jobs to keep the sheep happy as well as the airseeder moving. It's lots of big decisions like which crop to plant on which soil type, which paddock to start first or how much of the program to put in given the weather conditions. It's trying to remember the one million tractor grease points that Dad has pointed out to you. It's stopping for a chat with your neighbours at the cross roads to see which side of the fence got more rain.

But yeah... essentially it's when we plant the crop



### WOGOLIN ROAD RECREATIONAL AREA



# Winter Warmer Recipe Ideas:

# Vegetable & Chicken Noodle Soup:

A hearty soup, which is great for winter weekend meals and it always tastes better the day after it's made.

# INGREDIENTS:

1 cup lentils

45g chicken noodle instant soup

3 bacon rashers

2 beef stock cubes

1 tea vegemite

1 onion large

1 capsicum

1 potato

3 celery sticks

440gm canned crushed tomatoes

1 cup pumpkin diced

1 zucchini medium

1 tab Italian mixed herbs.

1 cup flat egg noodles

1 lit water

1 pinch salt & pepper to taste.

# METHOD:

Peel and dice vegetables; In a large pot sauté bacon, onion, celery and capsicum; Add all other ingredients except noodles and bring to boil; Simmer until lentils and vegetables are soft; Add noodles and simmer another 10 minutes; Add more water if stock is too thick; Add salt and black pepper as desired.



# 17-Minute Chicken Pot Pie:

Get this Chicken Pot Pie on the table in less than 20 minutes and keep the hordes happy!!!

# INGREDIENTS:

1 sheet puff pastry;

1 tab olive oil;

600gm chicken thigh fillets, chopped;

420gm cream of mushroom soup;

125 ml(1/2 cup) cream;


150gm (1cup) frozen peas, carrots and corn;

1 tea dried tarragon leaves,

1/3 cup chopped fresh parsley plus extra to serve.

### METHOD:

Pre heat oven to 200\*; Lightly spray a pie tray with oil: Cut into pie shaped sections; Place on the prepared tray and bake for 12 minutes or until golden; Meanwhile, heat oil and cook chicken until golden; Add soup, cream, frozen veggies and tarragon, simmer for 5 minutes until sauce thickens. Stir in parsley. Pour into round pie dish and arrange pastry portions on top;








# Adult Fiction Diane Allen - The Girl from the Tanner's Yard



Their lives made up of varying degrees of cruelty and punishments, these children were the 'little black devils' that God and religion forgot. As a child, underfed, poorly clothed and missing his family, Alf sought refuge in the library in the company of Shakespeare and Michelangelo. He writes with joy about the camaraderie

of the boys, their love of sport and their own company, but also notes that many descended into despair upon leaving. Most died early. Alf Taylor is one of the 'lucky ones'.
