Know How Rates are Calculated and Win

Each year households across the State receive their Local Government rates notices, however independent research, commissioned by the WA Local Government Association, has found only about one in five WA ratepayers can identify how rates are calculated.

Of the remainder, 32% believed rates were calculated similar to stamp duty, with another 14% linking rates directly to the housing market. A total of 22% correctly identified that rates form a portion of each Local Government's annual budget.

The survey of 1000 West Australians from across the State found 73% percent of respondents wanted to better understand the process. It also found that 69% of people wanted a greater say on their rates; while about 40% would be prepared to either pay higher rates for more services, or accept a cut to services for lower rates.

WALGA President, Mayor Tracey Roberts said "Rates form a significant part of Councils' operating budgets that is needed to provide the facilities and services that are required by the respective communities."

"The greater the input from the community and involvement with the Council, the more likely it is that the services and facilities provided, and the rates required, will meet their expectations."

Starting next week, in a competition to run in The West Australian newspaper, being able to nominate the correct method could win your residential rates paid for the year.

Supported by WALGA, the competition will give readers a chance to win one of 10 prizes of having residential rates paid up to \$3,500 by choosing the correct calculation method from three options.

The competition is hoped to improve understanding of how rates are calculated in response to the research findings that the majority of ratepayers wanted to better understand this process.

Local news from...

WICKEPIN POLICE STATION

There has been a recent amendment to the Weapons Regulations 1999 to include Gel Blasters making the recreational toy a Prohibited Weapon. This change means from 3 July 2021 the possession of a Gel Blaster and its associated ammunition will be an offence within Western Australia.

There is an exemption to the offence if you delivering it to a police station to surrender. In those circumstances owners of Gel Blasters will have the opportunity of relinquishing the prohibited weapon without fear of being charged.

Wickepin Police seized three Gel Blasters last week during a search warrant in Narrogin. The imitation weapons, a Glock hand gun, a Mac 10 machine gun and an AR15 rifle have now been destroyed. Of concern, the Glock and AR15 are accurate imitations of WA Police Force issue firearms.

Please, if you or anyone you know have these weapons, utilise the amnesty and hand them into your local police station.

On another serious matter, recently Wickepin Police have had several complaints of motor bikes, quad bikes and the like riding through town.

The bike must be roadworthy, registered and you must have a relevant license for that class of bike to be permitted to ride on a road. If you do not comply with the laws you may be charged and in certain circumstances the motor bike seized and destroyed.

The practice is dangerous to yourself, to other people in the community and the noise around town is increasingly annoying. Please consider other people.

Finally, Wickepin Police Station have a new landline phone number. Our new number is 98932800. This has come about due to a technical upgrade at the station. The previous number will still be diverted to this number for some time however this is a good time to change the contact.

The important numbers below haven't changed. Always remember if you are in a life-threatening situation call 000. For non-life-threatening matters that require police attendance, call 131444. And if you need to speak with the Wickepin Police, call our new number. If the number is diverted to Albany Police, don't hang up, leave a message with the person you speak to and have them arrange for us to call you back.





Slow cooker chicken and corn soup

Ingredients

450g pkt frozen corn kernels 500g chicken thigh fillets

2 leeks, trimmed, finely sliced (white part only)

4cm ginger, peeled, finely grated

1 tsp sesame oil

1L Chicken Style Liquid Stock

1 bunch spring onions, thinly sliced, green parts reserved for serving

2 large free range eggs, lightly beaten

4 cups spinach leaves



- Place half of corn in a food processor with 1/2 cup warm water and process until a coarse puree.
 Transfer to the bowl of a 5.5L slow cooker along with chicken, leek, ginger, sesame oil, stock, remaining corn and white parts of spring onion. Cook on low for 8 hours or until chicken is very tender and can be pulled apart.
- Transfer chicken to chopping board and using two forks, shred chicken. Return shredded chicken to slow cooker. Increase temperature to high. Slowly pour eggs into soup, stirring consistently until ribbons of egg form. Stir through spinach leaves. Cover and cook for a further 10 minutes or until spinach wilts.
- 3. Serve soup topped with reserved spring onion.

Hummingbird Dump Cake.

Ingredients:

2 very ripe bananas – 440g can crushed – 370 g packet butter cake mix

1 cup pecans, chopped – 2 tsp ground cinnamon – 1 tsp ground cardamon

Pinch ground cloves - 1½ cups coconut – 125 g butter, melted - ¾ cup milk

1/3 cup golden syrup - ½ cup fresh pineapple - peeled and sliced - cooking oil spray

250g strawberries, hulled and sliced - ½ bunch mint leaves – icing sugar for dusting – ice cream to serve.

Method:

1. Preheat oven to 160° ff, conventional 180°. Lightly grease a 2 litre baking dish, mash bananas and combine in a bowl with undrained pineapple. Spread into dish. Sprinkle over dry cake mix and top with nuts. Combine spices and coconut and sprinkle over the top.

- Combine butter and milk in a jug and pour over the back of the spoon over mixture. Bake for 25 minutes, then drizzle with golden syrup and bake for a further 5 minutes.
- 3. Meanwhile, heat a grill pan on high. Spray pineapple slices with oil and cook for 2 minutes on each side until lightly blackened. Roughly chop and toss with strawberries and mint. Dust cake with icing sugar and serve with fruit and ice cream.





Garden Snippets.....



Winter Colour... Camellia Japonica..

The large Japonica group of the Camellia family is one of the most popular of all garden shrubs, and rightly so, as their attractive foliage alone makes them worthy of a place in any garden or patio setting. Bushes may grow strong and erect, bushy and spreading or vigorous and open in habit and some varieties are able to be successfully grown in large tubs.

Blooms, which are produced in winter over a period of two to three months, vary in form from single, semi-double, double centres; and formal and in-formal doubles. Colours range from white through pink to red and in many combinations and shades in between, depending on variety.

By careful selection of early, mid-season and late varieties it is possible to have colour in your garden right through what might otherwise be a colourless, bleak winter. Japonicas can be grown in a variety of positions, their main requirements being:

- Good Drainage at all times They will not tolerate "wet feet"
- Filtered Light in a Protected Position Some varieties are sun-hardy but generally they like at least two hours' shade during the hottest part of the day, with protection from strong wind
- A Slightly Acid Soil although they will tolerate a wide variety of neutral soils. Where soil is known to be alkaline, give a light dressing of Sulphate of Aluminium and Sulphate of Iron

Once established, camellias require very little attention other than:

- Light pruning for shape when young if the variety is of the "rangy" nature, but is generally not necessary with most varieties
- Spray to control insect pests. Main pests are Scale, Red Spider Mite, other Mite and Aphids. The best spray is a combination of a garden insecticide and White Oil.
- Watering during the drier months to assist new growth and form better flower buds
