




Peter Lewis of Esperance recently passed away. Peter was the brother of Colin Lewis.

# **COUNCIL NOTES**



# 27 JULY 2021

#### COUNCIL'S ROAD NETWORK - RAIN DAMAGE

All of council's roads are currently open but further rain events are forecast. Please restrict heavy vehicle movement and avoid any unnecessary travel on unsealed roads.

The gravel roads network is currently in the process of being inspected to record all damaged sections and will be programmed according to priority.

The sealed network will take priority over the gravel network.

Please drive carefully and ensure you drive to the conditions.

#### ROADSIDE SIGNAGE

A significant amount of signage and white posts around the shire road network have been struck by oversized vehicles.

One yellow sign costs \$200 to purchase and install. Over 40 have been hit so far by machinery.

A white post (timber) costs \$6 to purchase and install. Over 400 of these have been hit. A white post (plastic) is \$80.

This happens every year with seasonal movement of machinery. The signs cannot be moved any further back as it is a legal requirement for signs to be 1.5m from edge of road pavement.

When moving oversized vehicles please take extra caution not to damage the road side signage / posts.







# **Slow Cooker Port Stroganoff**

## **Ingredients**

1 kg pork (or beef) roast, sliced.

1 tsp smoked paprika

1 tbsp plain flour

2 tbsp olive oil

1 large onion, sliced

400g Swiss brown mushrooms, halved

3 cloves garlic, crushed

2 tbsp tomato paste

2 tomatoes, chopped


250 ml (1 cup) chicken or beef stock

2 tbsp Worcestershire sauce

100g (1/2) cup sour cream

Chopped parsley, to serve

Pasta or rice, to serve



## Method:

1. Place pork slices in a large snaplock bag. Add paprikas and flour and season well with salt and pepper. Seal bag and shake to coat in spices. 2. Heat half the oil in a large nonstick frying pan (or base of slow cooker). Cook onion for 2 to 3 minutes or until softened. Remove and set aside. Add pork, in batches, browning for 2 to 3 minutes or until golden. Remove and set aside with onions.

3. Heat remaining oil. Add mushrooms. Cook, stirring, for 3 to 4 minutes or until golden and browned. Transfer onions, pork and mushrooms to slow cooker (or if browning in the slow cooker, return the onions and pork). Add garlic, paste, tomatoes and stock. Cover and cook on high for 4 hours.

4. Reduce heat to low. Stir in Worcestershire sauce and cook for a further 1 1/2 hours. Stir through sour cream. Season well and scatter over fresh parsley. Serve with pasta or rice.

## **Lemon Ricotta Cake With Only 3 Ingredients**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 375g bottle pancake shake mix
- 160g (1/2 cup) lemon curd
- 120g (1/2 cup) smooth ricotta (from a tub)

#### **METHOD**

- Step 1: Preheat oven to 190C/170C (380F/340F) fan forced. Place one shelf in the centre of the oven and another under the grill. Grease a 2.5cm-deep, 23 x 28cm (base measurement) baking tray.
- Step 2: Prepare the pancake mix following packet directions. Pour into the prepared tray. Spoon lemon curd over the pancake mixture. Add 1-2 tablespoons of water to the ricotta and stir to loosen. Spoon over lemon curd. Use a knife or skewer to gently swirl the lemon curd and ricotta.

Step 3: Bake for 10-15 minutes or until set. Serve immediately.
