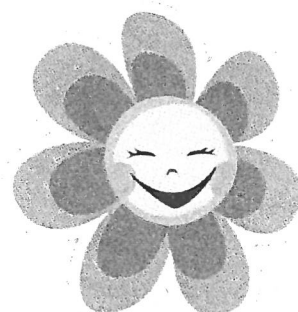
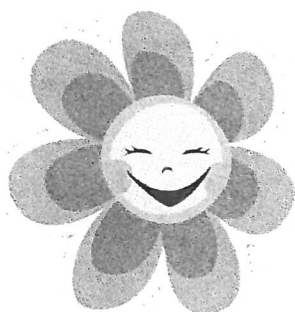

2021/22 RATES

Shire of Wickepin rates will be issued following the August ordinary meeting of council.

To ensure you receive your rates notice and to alleviate possible interest charges on late payments, please make sure we have your correct postal address on record and advise if any changes of ownership are required.

PENSIONER REBATE

If you hold one of the following cards, are a property owner, and were living at that property as your "ordinary place of residence" as at July 1 of the rating year, you may be eligible for a State Government rebate on your Rates and Emergency Services Levy.

- Pensioner Concession Card;
- WA State Seniors Card;
- Commonwealth Seniors Health Card and WA State Seniors Card; or
- State Concession Card

You may also be entitled to a rebate if you have life tenancy under the terms of a will. If you have already registered, the rebate will be shown on your notice as "State Government Rebate".

If you were previously registered for a Seniors Rebate and you now have a Pensioner Concession Card or Commonwealth Seniors Health Card, you should complete a new application to receive an increased rebate amount.

If you have purchased a new property and you had a rebate last year on the property that you sold, the rebate does not automatically transfer to your new property. You must complete a new application.

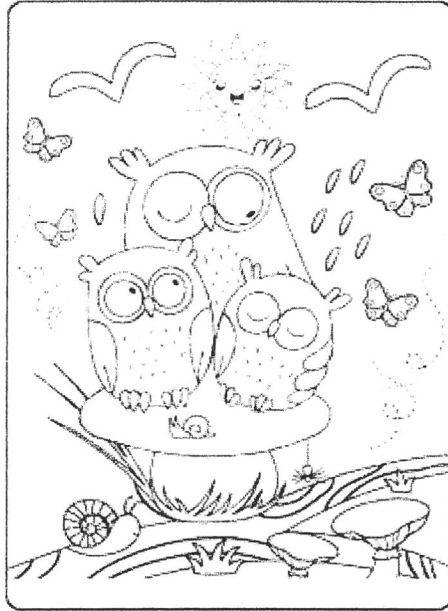

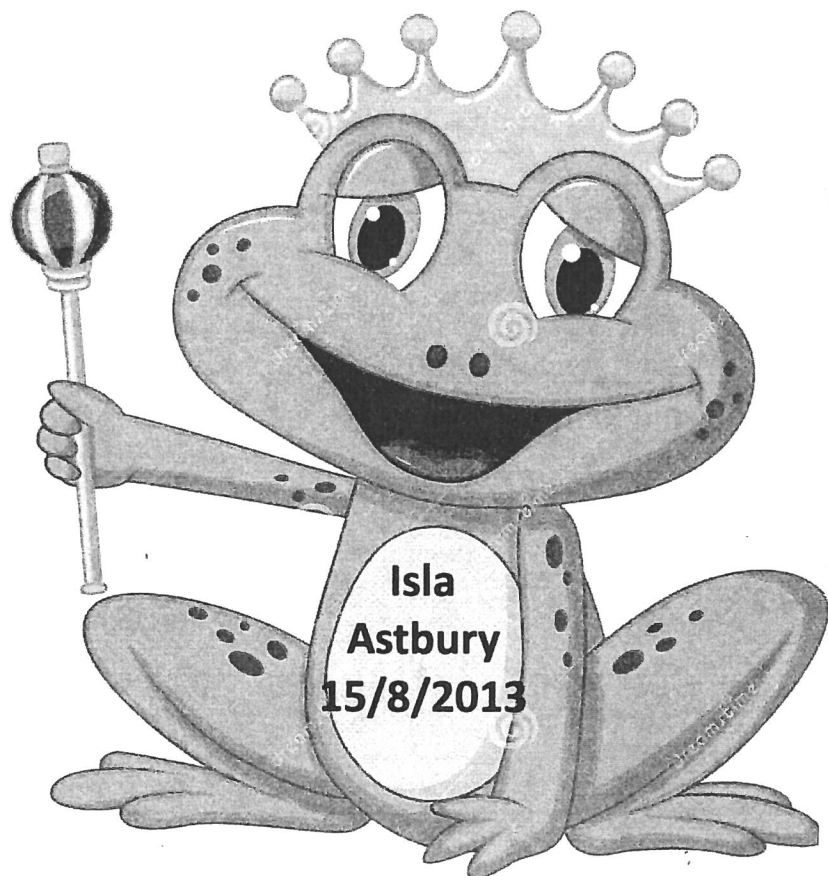

IN THE KITCHEN



Cheesy chicken fajita rice bake

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 medium red onion, thinly sliced
- 1 large red capsicum, coarsely chopped
- 300g (1 1/2 cups) long grain rice
- 30g sachet taco seasoning
- 1 barbecue chicken, skin and bones discarded, meat chopped
- 750ml (3 cups) Massel Chicken Style Liquid Stock
- 375g jar mild thick and chunky salsa
- 300g (3 cups) pre-grated pizza cheese
- 200g (3/4 cup) sour cream, stirred
- 250g cherry tomatoes, quartered
- 1 avocado, coarsely chopped
- 2 green shallots, thinly sliced

Step 1

Preheat oven to 210C/190C fan forced. Grease an 8 cup capacity baking dish.

Step 2 Heat 1 tablespoon of oil in large frying pan over high heat. Add the onion and capsicum. Cook stirring, for 4-5 minutes or until the onions have softened. Add the rice. Cook for 1-2 minutes. Sprinkle over taco seasoning. Stir to combine. Remove from heat.

Step 3

Add the the chicken, stock, salsa and 200g (2 cups) of cheese. Pour mixture into the prepared baking dish. Dollop over sour cream. Sprinkle with remaining 1 cup of cheese. Cover with foil and bake for 30-35 minutes or until golden and most of the liquid has been absorbed. Remove foil for the last 5 minutes of cooking. Set aside to cool slightly for 10 minutes.

Step 4 Serve topped with tomatoes, avocado and shallot.



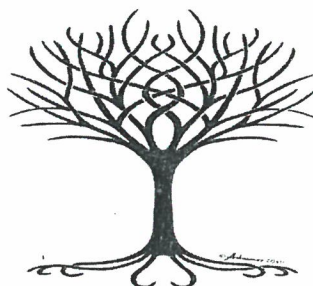
***“The Best Time to Plant a Tree was 20 Years Ago....
The second Best Time is Now....”Chinese Proverb***

Trees are beacons of natural beauty and are remarkably resilient with their ability to adapt and survive. They offer shade to other flora, fauna and surrounding buildings, provide habitats for our fauna and flowers and nectar for birds and insects.

A tree in your garden will become a feature, so the wrong tree in the wrong spot can cause structural problems or throw shade where you don't want it. With the Winter's rains giving soil much needed moisture, Now is the perfect time to start thinking of “Where and What” to plant, in preparation for selecting a tree for your garden.

Here are some key points for consideration:

1. Choose a tree well suited to your climate.
2. Match the size of your tree to the allotted space-Don't plant big trees in small gardens!
3. Decide on Evergreen or Deciduous and whether you want year round shade, autumn colour, winter sunlight, spring blossom, summer colour, fruit or attractive bark; and whether you want an ornamental tree, or a native tree.
4. Consider how quickly you want the tree to establish-some are quicker growers than others.
5. Avoid placing trees with invasive root systems near buildings or pipes (read up on the tree's capabilities before you buy it or plant it).
6. Take care when digging the hole for planting to avoid any underground pipes, and look overhead to make sure you are power-line clear.
7. Select a quality tree that is well balanced in trunk and foliage growth, and avoid sick looking and rootbound stock that will compromise the health and safety of the tree.
8. Improve soil with compost and/or aged manure, and dig the hole deep and wide enough to accommodate root expansion and growth (usually twice the width and depth of the tree pot). Stake if required until roots become strong enough, and protect with a wind/frost guard for the first couple of years.
9. Care for your tree in the early establishment years with regular watering, fertilising and formative pruning.

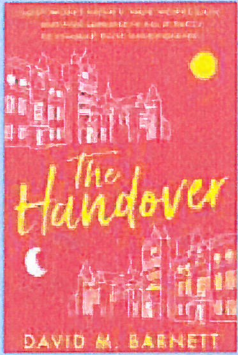
Remedial Massage for Seniors

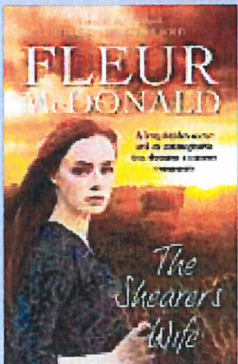
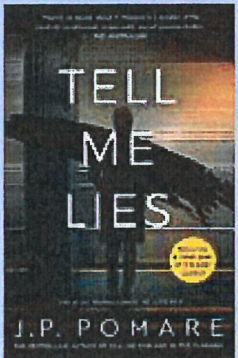
David M Barnett - The Handover

J.P. Pomare - Tell me Lies

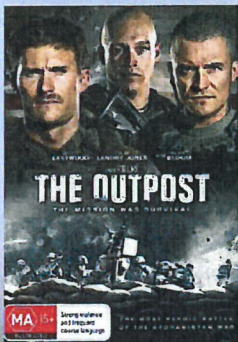
