<u>Char-grilled BBQ Chicken</u> <u>Skewers with Couscous</u> Salad

Ingredients:

¼ cup (60ml) BBQ sauce
1 ½ tablespoons red wine vinegar
¼ cup (60ml) fresh orange juice
500g chicken breast fillets
2 red onions, cut into wedges
1 cup (190g) wholemeal couscous
200g snow peas, trimmed, thinly sliced
2 carrots, peeled, coarsely grated
½ cup (55g) dried cranberries, coarsely chopped
½ cup chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley

1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil

Method:

toss to combine

Combine BBQ sauce, vinegar and orange juice in a shallow dish. Add chicken and turn to coat. Cover to marinate for at least 30 minutes

Thread chicken and onion, alternately, on 8 wooden or metal skewers. Heat a barbecue or chargrill over medium-high heat. Lightly spray skewers with oil and barbecue for 6-8 minutes, turning, or until chicken is golden and cooked through

Meanwhile, place couscous in a large heatproof bowl. Add 1 cup (250ml) boiling water and stir to combine, cover and set aside to steam for 3 minutes. Separate grains with a fork. Add snow peas, carrot, cranberries and parsley.

Combine remaining orange juice, vinegar and olive oil. Add dressing to salad and gently

Serve barbecued skewers with the couscous salad

Sticky Date Pudding – you're my favourite and always will be. Also known as Sticky Toffee Pudding, the simple trick that makes all the difference is to pour some Butterscotch Sauce over the warm cake when it comes out of the oven. It makes it ultra moist and gives it that intense dark colour. Plus, more sauce to serve, of course!

Ingredients:

280g / 9oz pitted dates , roughly chopped 1 tsp bi carb soda 1 cup / 250 ml boiling water 40 g / 1/4 cup brown sugar, loosely packed 80 g / 6 tbsp unsalted butter, softened 2 eggs, at room temperature 1 1/4 cups / 185 g plain flour (all purpose) 1 1/2 tsp baking powder

Butterscotch Sauce:

200 g/ $1 \frac{1}{4}$ cups brown sugar, loosely packed 375 ml ml / $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups thickened cream (heavy cream)

1/2 tsp vanilla extract
70 g / 5 tbsp unsalted butter
Place ingredients in a saucepan over medium
heat. Once butter is melted, stir, then bring to
simmer.

Simmer for 2 minutes, stirring once, then remove from heat. Serve warm.

Serving:

Ice cream or dolloping cream

Method:

Place dates in a bowl, sprinkle over baking soda. Pour over boiling water. Stand 10 minutes, then mash well.

Beat butter & Sugar, add eggs and beat till creamy.



Gently fold in flour and soda, then stir in dates. Pour into cake pan, smooth surface. Bake 35 minutes or until skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. While still hot, poke about 40 holes all over the surface using a skewer. Pour over 1/2 cup Butterscotch Sauce, leave to soak for 10 minutes.

Garden Snippets...





Tarty Rhubarb...

Rhubarb is one of those rare plants that provides as much aesthetic value in the garden as it does tasty ingredients for the kitchen-and it's hard to decide which purpose is more important. In the garden, the dramatic green leaves bring contrast and architectural structure to the landscape. In the kitchen where rhubarb is stewed and used as fillings in pies, strudels, crumbles and compotes it offers tart contrast to sweet desserts.

The whole rhubarb plant is a herbaceous perennial growing from short, thick rhizomes (or crowns) which have a long life span. It produces fleshy, edible stalks which are cooked but the leaves are considered inedible due to their high concentration of oxalic acid, which can cause vomiting and diarrhoea. Rhubarb is a vegetable, but in 1947 it was classified as a fruit in the US to save on tariffs, as vegetable tariffs were much more costly than those for fruit.

Many gardeners are fortunate to have inherited this worldly veg from Grandma's garden or a previous homeowner. But you can start your own tradition by purchasing a "crown" from garden centres.

How to Grow: Due to it's long life span, choose a permanent position in the garden, preferably with full sun. Enrich soil with well-rotted manure or compost. Plant crowns in spring, just below the soil surface, allowing room for growth as plants can reach 1-1.5m.

Water new plants regularly and established plants only when needed – usually during hot dry months.

Harvest in early spring and summer. Avoid picking during the first year as rhubarb needs time to establish prior to harvest, and never pick more than a third of the stems, selecting the strongest, healthiest ones to cook. Harvest by pulling and twisting to remove the entire stem from the base. This reduces the likelihood of any disease or infection in the crown. Store your fresh, uncut stems in the fridge for up to a week, or in an airtight container in the freezer for up to 12 months.

Rhubarb can be divided in late winter every 4-5 years to maintain healthy plants and good sized stalks. Be gentle and split into individual crowns with a decent portion of rhizome and foliage attached. Replant or pot up as a gift.

Long-lasting and easy to grow, a striking foliage plant and a brilliant last-minute dessert, Rhubarb certainly deserves a permanent place in every garden.













ADULT FICTION THE BOUNDARY FENCE - ALISSA CALLEN
