Christmas Treats

Gingerbread Men

Ingredients

125g butter, softened

2/3 cup brown sugar

1/4 cup maple syrup

1 egg, lightly beaten

2 1/2 cups plain flour

1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

1 tablespoon ground ginger

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1 cup white chocolate melts

Silver cachous, coloured icing etc, to decorate



Method

Using an electric mixer, beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add maple syrup and egg. Beat to combine. Sift flour, bicarbonate of soda, ginger and cinnamon over butter mixture. Using a wooden spoon, stir until just combined and a soft dough forms. Place dough on a lightly floured surface. Knead gently until smooth. Shape into a disc. Wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate for 1 hour or until firm.

Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fanforced. Line 3 baking trays with baking paper. Roll dough between 2 sheets of baking paper until 5mm thick. Using a 6.5cm-long, 7cm-wide gingerbread man cutter, cut shapes from dough. Re-roll dough scraps and cut to make a total 30 gingerbread men. Place, 2cm apart, on prepared tray.

Bake 1 tray at a time for 20 to 25 minutes, or until just firm to touch. Stand on trays for 5 minutes.

Transfer to a wire rack to cool.

Place melts in a heatproof, microwave-safe bowl. Microwave for 1 to 2 minutes, stirring every 30 seconds or until smooth. Spoon into a small snap-lock bag. Snip off 1 corner. Pipe faces and buttons onto gingerbread men. Decorate with coloured icing, cachous etc. Set aside to set.

Individual Christmas puddings

Ingredients

Melted butter, to grease 750g mixed dried fruit 1/3 cup brandy 1/3 cup fresh orange juice 200g butter, at room temperature



120g (2/3 cup, lightly packed) brown sugar 2 eggs, at room temperature 115g (3/4 cup) plain flour 2 teaspoons mixed spice 105g (1 1/2 cups) fresh breadcrumbs) 100g good-quality dark chocolate, finely grated

Method

Preheat oven to 150°C. Brush eight 250ml (1-cup) capacity muffin pans with melted butter to lightly grease. Place the mixed fruit in a large bowl. Place the brandy and juice in a small saucepan over low heat. Cook for 2 minutes or until heated through. Pour over the fruit and stir to combine. Set aside for 30 minutes to soak. Use an electric beater to beat together the butter and sugar in a bowl until pale and creamy. Add the eggs, 1 at a time, beating well between each addition.

Sift the flour and mixed spice over the butter mixture. Add the breadcrumbs, chocolate and fruit mix, and stir until combined.

Divide the mixture evenly among the prepared muffin pans. Use the back of a spoon to smooth the surface. Cover each pudding with a disc of non-stick baking paper. Bake in oven for 35-40 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centres comes out clean. Set aside in pan for 10 minutes before turning onto a wire rack to cool slightly.

Brandy cream

- 1 cup cream
- 1 tablespoon icing sugar mixture
- 2 tablespoons brandy. To make the brandy cream, use an electric beater to whisk together the cream and icing sugar in a small bowl until soft peaks form. Add the brandy and stir to combine.
