

### COMMUNITY SPORTING AND RECREATION FACILITIES FUND (CSRFF) 2022/23 FEBRUARY SMALL GRANTS **FUNDING ROUND**

The CSRFF 2022/23 February Small Grants round and Club Night Lights Program is now open for projects with a value of \$300,000 or below.

To be eligible, prospective Wheatbelt applicants must contact the DLGSC Wheatbelt Office to discuss eligibility for funding, advice, assistance in preparing the submission and to obtain an application form.

Applications must be submitted to local governments by the applicant (if not the local government) and subsequently submitted electronically to the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries no later than Thursday 31 March 2022.

Each application is judged on its merits and relative to other applications received in that round. A previous approval for one type of project does not mean that an application for a similar project will be approved. Applications for projects that are ineligible, are incomplete or have unconfirmed financial components will hinder a project's ability to proceed. A checklist is provided with the application form and applicants must include all the required documentation to be eligible for funding.

It is very important that applicants can demonstrate that their project will be completed and the grant satisfactorily acquitted within the proposed timeframe. Applicants must take into account potential delays in construction and escalating building costs as part of the application process. It is expected that applicants will complete their projects on time and deferrals should not be expected because of delays in the construction process or cost escalation.



Make sure you prepare yourself with essential

medicines, supplies, contact lists and meals.

### COVID 19- Get you COVID kit ready

In the coming months, it's likely that you will be exposed to COVID-19. In most cases, fully vaccinated people will only experience a mild illness that can be managed while isolating at home. If you do have to isolate, it's important to be prepared. Now is a good time for country communities to prepare a COVIDready kit. Here are some of the essentials we recommend you have available:

- Pain relief medication and electrolytes (available from your pharmacy)
- Your regular medications
- A thermometer
- Masks, hand sanitiser and gloves
- Stay at home activates to keep you entertained
- A plan for who can look after your children, pets or people in your care if you have to go to hospital
- Phone numbers for people outside your home that you can call for help if you need
- A plan for how you'll get food and essentials for seven days

There are other things you can do now to prepare for a rise in cases of COVID-19 across WA. Vaccination remains the most effective way to avoid hospitalisation and serious illness from COVID-19. Anyone over the age of five can now be vaccinated. If you haven't been vaccinated, or are due for your third dose, visit a clinic near you. Making simple infection prevention measures part of our daily routine will also help manage the spread of COVID-19. So, when you're in public,

keep 1.5 metres away from others. Wash your hands often with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitiser. Remember to cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or your elbow and stay at home if you're unwell.It's up to each of us to protect all of us.

## Chome A Excess fruit!!!! Make jam

### Plum Jam

2.5kg dark plums

1 litre water

3kg sugar

Remove any stalks and wash the plums to remove bloom (powdery deposit) and cut in half.

Place into stockpot with water.

Cook until the fruit is soft and well pulped.

Add sugar and stir over a low heat until sugar dissolves.

Bring to boil, boil rapidly removing stones as they come to the surface, use a slotted metal spoon to allow the juice to run back into the saucepan, and boil until setting point is reached.

Allow to stand for 5 minutes, stir gently to disperse fruit.

Put into sterilised, warm, dry jars.

Seal with Kleer-View Covers or warm paraffin wax. Label and store in cool, dry place.



2kg ripe figs

34 cup orange juice

¼ cup lemon juice

2 tablespoons sweet sherry

1kg granulated sugar

Wash and dry figs. Cut off stems, discard.

Finely chop figs

Place in preserving pan with orange and lemon juice and sherry.


Bring to boil. Simmer gently until figs are soft.

Add sugar, stirring until dissolved.

Bring back to boiling point, boil gently for 25 minutes or until setting point is reached.

Pour into sterilised, warm dry jars.

Seal with Kleer-View Covers or warm paraffin wax. Label and store in a cool dry place.



Put a plate in the freezer at the beginning of your cooking time. Once you think that your jam has reached its setting point or has thickened, spoon a bit of the jam on the cold plate and tilt it vertically so the jam runs. You are aiming for a slow descent.

### WHEATBELT SPIDER'S STORY TOLD ON THE INTERNATIONAL STAGE


On May 1st 2018, the "Washington Post" celebrated the life of a small brown spider that lived it's life under a jam wattle in the WA Avon Wheatbelt.

Why would this spider attract such international attention? Because this is the story of the oldest recorded spider in the world, who died several years ago at the age of 43.

Scientists were left "miserable" after the world's oldest spider died.

It is also the story of the Wheatbelt's own amazing environmental scientist, Barbara York Main, affectionately known as the "Spider Woman", studying this spider from 1975.
