



Country Stargazing

with Carol Redford and Donna Vanzetti, Astrotourism WA

Early Morning Dance of the Planets!

Early morning risers will be treated to another impressive display of the planets as they continue to come together throughout April.

Early April, Venus is shining brilliantly in the east and makes an easy point of reference. Saturn and Mars lie just above Venus, and on the 5th, sit side by side, as if 'touching', from our perspective here on Earth. Jupiter joins the three, lower on the horizon, to form a showcase of the four planets.

They will continue their beautiful dance throughout all of April and this will culminate with another special grouping late in the month, when the Moon joins the party. From the 25th and into May, Jupiter has moved closer up towards Venus and on the 28th, the pretty thin slither of the Moon forms a striking conjunction with Jupiter and Venus, fitting into a 10° circle together.

On May 1st, Jupiter and Venus are very close and also appear as if they are 'touching' in the sky.

When to look: Just before sunrise, all April.

Which direction to look: Very low to the eastern horizon

You will need a low horizon and

it will be well worth getting up early to enjoy this dance of the planets.


SPORT REPORT




ADULT FICTION JAMES PATTERSON - THE HORSE WOMAN

ADULT FICTION DAVID ALLAN-PETALE - LOCUST SUMMER



Baked sweet potato soup with blue cheese toast

Ingredients

1kg sweet potato

1 onion (unpeeled), halved

1 garlic bulb, halved crossways

4 cups (1L) vegetable stock

1/2 cup (80g) smoked almonds, chopped

1/2 cup firmly packed mint leaves, finely chopped, plus extra

leaves to serve 4 x 1.5cm-thick slices seeded sourdough

120g blue cheese, thinly sliced

Method

- Preheat the oven to 180°C. Grease a baking tray and line with baking paper.
- Prick sweet potato all over with a fork and place on prepared tray with onion, cut-side down. Roast for 30 minutes, then add garlic, cut-side down, and roast, turning halfway, for a further 1 hour or until vegetables are tender.
- Remove onion skin and discard. Squeeze garlic flesh from skin into a blender. Working in batches, add onion, sweet potato and stock, and whiz until smooth. Transfer to a saucepan over medium-high heat and cook, stirring occasionally, until hot.
- Combine almond and mint in a bowl and set aside.
- Meanwhile, to make the blue cheese toast, preheat oven grill to high and line a baking tray with foil.
- Place sliced sourdough on prepared tray and grill, checking regularly, for 2 minutes or until toasted. Turn and grill, checking regularly, for 90 seconds or until almost toasted. Top with blue cheese and grill, checking regularly, for 90 seconds or until cheese starts to melt.
- Divide soup among serving bowls and scatter almond mixture over toast and soup. Top soup with extra mint leaves and serve immediately.

Hot Cross Buns

Ingredients:

cups plain flour 1/4 cup caster sugar

pinch of salt 40g butter

2 eggs, lightly beaten Flour paste:

4 to 5 tbsp water

Glaze: 2 tbsp caster sugar

2 x 7g sachets dried yeast 1 1/2 tsp mixed spice

1 1/2 cups currants

300ml milk

1/2 cup plain flour

1/3 cup water Butter, to serve

Method

Combine flour spice, salt and currants in a large bowl. Melt butter. Add milk. Heat until lukewarm. Add warm milk mixture and eggs to currant mixture. Use a flat-bladed knife to mix until dough almost comes together. Use clean hands to finish mixing to form a soft dough.

Turn dough out onto a floured surface. Knead for 10 minutes, until smooth. Place into a lightly oiled bowl. Cover with plastic wrap. Set aside in a warm, draught-

free place for 1 to 1 1/2 hours, or until dough doubles in size.

Line a large baking tray with non-stick baking paper. Punch dough down to its original size. Knead for 30 seconds on a lightly floured surface until smooth. Divide into 12 even portions. Shape each portion into a ball. Place balls onto lined tray, cover with plastic wrap. Set aside in a warm place for 30 minutes, or until buns double in size. Preheat oven to 190°C or 170°C fan-force.

Make flour paste: Mix flour and water together in a small bowl until smooth. Spoon into a small snap-lock bag. Snip off 1 corner of bag. Pipe paste over tops of buns to form crosses. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes, or until buns are cooked through.

Make glaze: Place water and sugar into a small saucepan over low heat. Stir until sugar dissolves. Bring to the boil. Boil for 3-4 minutes. Brush warm

glaze over warm hot cross buns. Serve warm or at room

temperature with a butter as desired.



Garden Snippets....





Create a Colourful Hanging Basket..

Hanging Baskets full of colour make a wonderful focal point many areas of your garden, and can be hung from wherever you wish to hang one.

The secret to creating a glorious hanging basket is to use trailing plants such as Ivy-leafed pelargonium, Trailing Petunias, Verbena, Swan River Daisies and Fuchias or even fruits such as strawberries – The list is endless.

To create a Stunning flower display, plant into the sides of the basket as well as the top. For quicker results use advanced seedlings.

First, Gather your Supplies. You will need:

 Wire Basket-This is the best choice to allow planting into the sides to create a "Ball Effect"

Fibre liner

Sharp knife

Seedlings

Potting Mix

Trowel or scoop

Slow-release Fertiliser

Here's How:

- 1. Fit liner into the basket and cut slits around the lower portion of the basket. Carefully plant seedlings through the slits by feeding the rootball from the outside and covering with potting mix, part-filling the basket.
- 2. Cut more planting slits around the upper portion of the basket and repeat planting seedlings as above.
- 3. Plant more seedlings around the top. Plant an "upright grower" in the centre and trailing plants around the outer edges.
- 4. Fill in all remaining gaps with potting mix, water in and add some slow release fertiliser. Water again, drain and hang.

A sunny spot is best for hanging, but remember that hanging baskets dry out very quickly so it is best to avoid the hot afternoon sun (and wind if possible) so a "morning to midday sun" position is kinder to your basket of blooms.

Ensure you have a secure hanging point as the baskets can become heavy with growth and watering.

The most crucial aspect for success is to give your basket regular watering as they can be thirsty creations with so many plants so closely crammed into one container. That, along with slow release fertiliser at planting time should ensure a glorious, colourful result in a short time.
