BlazeAid continues to need your support in our local area.









BEST MOBILITY EXERCISES FOR SENIORS



Overhead Side Stretch

- 1. Stand straight with your feet hip width apart
- 2. Raise your hands over your head. For more stretch, interlace your fingers.
- 3. Keep your torso long and gently lean left.
- 4. Hold for 15-30 seconds.
- 5. Repeat up to 3 times on each side.



Stair Climbing

- 1. After you walk upstairs, turn around, go back down and walk up again.
- 2. Do repeated "ups and downs" on the bottom step. For example, step up left foot, step up right, step down left, then step down right.
- 3. Bring your knees high each time you take a step.



Foot Taps

- 1. Stand with your feet hip width apart at the bottom of a staircase or in front of something to step on.
- 2. Optionally, put your palm on the wall or hold a chairback for balance.
- 3. Use your hand for balance only, not to assist the movement.
- 4. Slowly lift your foot, tap the stair with your toe and put your foot back down.
- 5. The slower the motion the more your balance is challenged.
- 6. Do 15-20 taps with each foot.





Knee Push-ups

- 1. Lie on your stomach with your palms up the floor under your shoulders.
- 2. Optionally, raise your lower legs and cross your ankles.
- 3. Leaving your knees on the floor, straighten the elbows and push yourself up.
- 4. Keep your back straight. Don't let yourself hunch.
- 5. Come back down until your chest touches the floor, but don't let it rest on the floor.
- 6. Do 2-3 sets of 10-15 push-ups.

DOGS

Stray dogs continue to be a nuisance in our community. ALL dogs MUST be registered with the Shire of Wickepin. The shire's ranger has been ordered to collect all stray dogs and impound them, and will only be released upon payment of pound fee AND payment of registration fee, if unregistered.





2022 Influenza Vaccines

Free adult influenza vaccines are now available at the Wickepin Health Service for eligible clients

The following individuals in WA are eligible to receive government-funded vaccine:

- individuals 65 years or older
- · pregnant women (any trimester)
- Aboriginal people 6 months and older
- individuals with medical conditions that place them at risk for complications of influenza, including:
 - cardiac disease
 - chronic respiratory conditions
 - chronic neurological conditions
 - o impaired immunity
 - diabetes and other metabolic disorders
 - renal disease
 - haematological disorders

Lemon Chicken

Ingredients

- 500g skinless, boneless chicken breast tenderloins
- 4 lemons juiced and seeded
- 1 cup cornflour
- 1 litre sunflower oil



Instructions

Cut chicken into thin strips. Place in a bowl add lemon juice and zest. Marinate for 2 hours. Add the cornflour, the mix should resemble a batter, if too runny add a little more cornflour. Heat the oil in a small, deep saucepan, fry a few pieces at a time, 4 to 5 minutes turning to evenly cook.

Give the oil enough time to regain heat in between.

Place chicken on a tray with absorbent towel to remove any excess oil.

Season with salt and cracked pepper then serve.



Easy no-bake LEMON SLICE recipe makes for a delicious morning tea.

Ingredients

125g (1/2 block) Copha,

chopped 250g (1 packet) Arnott's Milk Coffee Biscuits

80g (1 cup) desiccated coconut

160g (½ cup) sweetened condensed milk

Method

- 1. Grease and line a 20cm x 30cm slice tin. Make sure the paper has a 2cm overhang
- 2. Melt the Copha in a microwave on high or in a saucepan until fully melted. Using a food processor process the biscuits and coconut until they resemble fine breadcrumbs
- 3. Add the melted Copha and sweetened condensed milk and mix together. Press the biscuit mixture firmly into the tin, using the back of a spoon. Put in the fridge to set for 10 minutes

.... Garden Snippets



One of the main drawbacks in starting a collection of house plants is the price. The way out of this is to propagate your own plants from pieces. It is easy and very fulfilling to strike a small cutting from a piece of the stem, leaf or root from the parent plant, and have it grow into a full-sized specimen of your own.

Here's How:

Choose a strong healthy shoot, cut it off the plant making a clean cut with a sharp knife or secateurs across the stem, just below where a leaf joins the stem (node). This is from where the new roots will form.

Dip the end into water, then into a root-forming hormone powder.

Plant firmly into a pot of sandy soil or potting mix for cuttings. Place as many cuttings in the pot as will fit, water well and pull a plastic bag over the top, sealing with string or tape around the pot. You can also use a plastic water bottle over the top of the cuttings.

Place the pot in a warm position, out of full sun.

Each cutting has a collection of specially active cells which, under these conditions, and with the aid of the rooting powder, should begin to multiply and gradually form minute roots. At first these roots are very delicate, then they will grow more strongly. With many species, roots will form round the base of the stem within a fortnight, but can take a lot longer, depending on the variety of the plant.

As soon as the roots are well formed, tip them out of the pot and carefully tease the plants apart to pot individually, using normal potting mix.

Almost all house plants respond to this type of propagating method, and can be used for Ivies, Vines, Philodendrons and Monsteras.

African violets and Rex begonias will form roots from leaves.

Cut a leaf off of the parent plant leaving a half inch piece of stem attached.

Bury the stem and the lower edge of the leaf in sandy compost, and in a few weeks time the leaf will form roots and new plants will form at the soil line.

Even easier is Layering.

Take a long stem, make a small cut on the underside and peg it down with a hair pin or small stone in a pot of sandy soil alongside the parent plant.

In this way, the new plant forms its own roots while it is still attached to the older plant. When the roots are formed, simply sever the stem with a sharp knife or secateurs and the new plant can be separated from the parent plant and will grow strongly by itself.

Spring and Summer are, in most cases, the best time to take cuttings, but in a warm house, or sheltered position, and with the help of root-forming powders, cuttings can be taken at almost any time.

DAVIES SLAMS FEDERAL LABOR PLAN TO END LIVE SHEEP TRADE

5 May 2022

Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies has slammed Federal Labor's plan to ban the live export of sheep.

The Nationals WA leader said it was disturbing to see reports the Australian Labor Party had revealed its position on live export in a survey from Australian Alliance for Animals.

"The Federal Shadow Agriculture Minister has confirmed Labor's position is to phase out live sheep trade, showing their true colours when it comes to support for the agricultural industry," Ms Davies said.

"It only reinforces the fact that Labor Governments can't be trusted with the livelihoods of farmers and regional families."

Shadow Agriculture Minister Colin de Grussa said roughly 80 per cent of live sheep were exported from WA.

"Labor's plan to ban live exports would not only see a viable and sustainable industry shut down and have ramifications for our primary producers and trading partners," Mr de Grussa said.

"Unfortunately, this revelation has come as no surprise, given Labor's history of putting an abrupt halt to the live cattle trade.

"Today's news that Labor plans to repeat its mistakes of the past, with scant regard to the families and jobs they will devastate, should ring alarm bells for many West Australian farmers and producers.

"The Nationals WA will always back in regional and farming communities, but this plan to ban live export by Labor means they can't be trusted to do the same."
