

DAVID ASHLEY WILSON - 17/10/1978 - 20/6/2022

Born 27/10/1978 at Glengarry Hospital in Perth.





David was a cheeky child who loved to get his hands dirty building things.

Attended primary school at Balga Primary before the family decided to hitchhike back to the eastern states. They spent the days walking Great Eastern Highway and slept on the side of the road at El Caballo where the little house is. The next day they were hitchhiking and were picked up by a truck driver by the name of Mick and dropped in Northam. This is where they ended up staying for the next 11 years. Robyn married Mick on the 9th April 1988, David was the groomsman.

We had a new dad and David loved to stir him up. One time David was in trouble, Dad said "come here" (he was going to give him a smack) but David was always a little bit cocky, so he said come and get me old man ... he thought there was no way Dad would catch him ... so it was on! Guess what ... Dad caught him and David got his smack too!!

David was always right into cricket. Debbie and David played regularly as kid and boy was David mean when he bowled to her! There was no holding back. One day Debbie had enough of it and karate chopped him in the nose making it bleed ... he was a bit kinder after that! David continued to play cricket winning cricketer of the year twice at the Koorda Cougars cricket club. As a young boy David also enjoyed basketball.

David finished primary school at Northam Primary School and completed high school to year 10 at Northam Senior High School.

David's first car was a panel and from there he bought his beloved VL Commodore. He definitely loved that car, and also loved trying out the power regularly if you know what I mean.

David also loved motorbikes, building one with his brother in-in-law David for Christmas one year and after that his love was stronger ... regularly riding with Shannon up and down the railway line in Seabrook.

David's first job was at Woolworths in Northam. He went from Woolworths to The Shamrock Hotel where he enjoyed working as a yardman, from then on David enjoyed farm work with a small stint on CBH in Cleary and from then on he went farming in Wickepin.

We spent many family holidays fishing at Moore River and Greenhead. I remember a couple of funny trips, one time we were fishing off the small jetty in Greenhead and David's line took off ... he was struggling to reel it in. He looked up and he had hooked the seagull that was flying past as he cast. Also In Greenhead he was snorkelling between the two reefs of Dynamite Bay. Next minute he was swimming super fast out to the furthers reef. He jumps on top of the reef and shouts out to Mum and Dad "there's a shark". He stayed on the reef for what seemed like forever – Dad went out to get him and they swam back without getting eaten.

David's kids were born Sarah – 10th June 1999, James – 5th May 2000, Mark – 14 February 2002, Ryan – 27 November 2006 and Claudia – 18 September 2010. Sarah was the apple of David's eye when she was little. Such a Dad's girl. They lived in Cleary with mum and dad, then came James and Mark – David loved his kids. In 2006 Ryan was born and in 1920 – Claudia, his little Chicken was born.

David lost our Uncle Norm on 15thApril 1998.

On the 27th September 2008, AFL Grand Final day, David's world was shattered when he list his best friend, the person he looked up to and loved with all his heart – passed away. Our Mum was our rock and losing her was definitely the hardest day. What made it a little easier for David was that his believed Hawthorn played in and won that day with a margin of 26 points. Mum obviously pulled some strings for her favourite child.

On the 1st October 2011, AFL Grand Final Day, David's hero, our amazing Pop passed away followed by our Nan on June 25th 2015. Our Aunty in December 2016 and our amazing sister Tanya on the 26th June 2017.

Dad recalls the time at the Carnarvon jetty when they broke in and caught a shark, they couldn't reel it in so they cut the line, rejigged it and cast again and they were pretty sure they caught the same shark. They reeled it in to the surface but couldn't bring it up. By this time there were lots of boats watching them wondering what they had caught.

Dad loved watching David play cricket at Wickepin, he enjoyed playing golf at Yealering with him, Dad says. He was a reasonable golfer but couldn't beat dad. He could hit a ball a long way but wasn't very accurate. When he was working at Kolindale Dad and David used to go shooting. The dog would bring back more foxes than they could shoot.

Coonacking at Kolindale and a big storm came through, all coonack nets got lost because of so much rain.

We got to know each other for awhile and then in 2009 not long after chicken was born Dave and old pop were on holidays in Carnarvon and Dave flew us up to join him and old pop. We all drove back together and Dave then moved in with Leanne, Aaron, Taylor, Brody and chicken in Wickepin. Dave took on all the kids as his own and they loved him as their dad. There was good times and some hard but Dave taught them everything he could. Dave's life was for his kids and family and would do anything for myself and the kids. He was such a loving caring man.

James, Aaron, Taylor, Brody and chicken knew Dave as "dodgie Dave"

Dave loved his cricket. He was also known as dinkum. He played in Wickepin for around 20 years. He won many trophies for many reasons. He was a very competitive player. Not only did he love playing cricket he was also a great player.

Every chance Dave got we would all go fishing. Dave started a tradition, each time we went fishing with the family he would tell them he would give \$10 to who ever would catch the most fish and \$10 who could catch the biggest. We had many holidays all together and at times we had old pop join us which was great for all cause old pop would make us laugh and also the boys made him laugh too. Dave enjoyed the holidays with everyone together at different times different family members joined us so was always nice.

A few times Dave and I snuck off on our own to go fishing or to spend time together. One time we went away we went to green head and the weather wasn't the best and showers were going thru all day but we decided to battle the weather. Anyways we went out and went fishing. Everytime it rained we sheltered under a rock ledge till it blew over the continued fishing. Turned out to be one of the best days of fishing for us both as we caught loads of good size skippy. Dave cooked them on the BBQ that night and turned out a great day. Many times we went away we would just spend the day with our line in the water not really concerned if we did catch anything or not but just enjoying or time together and relaxing.

Dave worked at Gary Langs for around 10 years. Dave enjoyed working at Gary's. Gary was a great boss and great friend to Dave. The kids spent time with Dave out the farm and learnt lots from him and enjoyed their timeout there. I remember Dave always talking about Rick Clint or someone at work and the photos he had of one of them bogged badly or pulling them out,

Dave was a handyman and could fix anything and if he didn't know how he googled that. Dave was good at what he did and was proud of what he did. Dave was kind and caring and would do anything for anyone.

2014 Dave and Leanne married. Close family and friends attended. It was a small wedding but that was perfect for Dave and myself. That was the first and last time I saw Dave in a suit and he looked perfect and it was a perfect day.

Dave was a big softy really. He was always saving animals, he added 2 cats to our collection and bought many lambs home to be saved.

I remember the time I was bitten by a snake and was taken to hospital in the ambulance. On the way they rang Dave to let him know what happened, Dave was working at Gary's at the time. By the time I arrived there Dave turned up 2 mins later. Dave said he needed to be there for me so he got there as soon as he could and he did. I think he was panicking more than me. He was such a caring man and had so much love for me as did I.

One of Dave's favourite songs was "Eye of the Tigers". He would sing away and tell us all no one could sing better than him.

As the boys got older with getting licences and cars Dave would be constantly going out pulling them from a bog or picking them up or taking them wherever to buy a new car and would spend hours or days fixing their cars. But as much as he complained about it to them he also enjoyed helping them and doing what he could for them. And they loved and respected each other for it.

Dave called Claudia "chicken" or "beautiful" that was his nickname for her. According to him she could do no wrong and was a softie towards her. They were always so cheeky to each other. Dave and chickens thing

they had together was her netball. If Dave could he would take her to trainings and to her games. They would talk about the game all the way in and all the way home. That is just what they did.

Dave had a fear of heights but in 2018 while in Queensland he decided to do the sling shot. He got Brody to go with him and though he said it wasn't so bad I thinks the video showed it really was.

Though our time together ended way to soon and all the plans we had will never be, I am grateful Dave was in my life and the kids life for the time we had. He will always be a part of us all...always.

And sure enough he started too but me and James were laughing too much at the fact that he was standing there like a criminal. The other thing I'll remember is wedding just near Yealering and the tractor ran out of diesel and it was raining, my ute obviously was at the opposite end of the paddock so I thought hmmm... who would come out and pick me up and my first thought was Dave. I called him and asked him to come take me to my ute and without hesitation he asked "where are you and how do I get there" I'll miss the bloke I used to call all the time to ask for help with mechanical issues or anything I needed help with because I think we all know he was a jack of all trades bloke. He was the bloke I could talk to about anything and he'd try his best to help. He would either spend hours on the iPad googling stuff that helps. Melting lemon potatoes

An easy side dish for main meal

1.5kg desiree potatoes, scrubbed, cut into slices 50g butter melted 2tbsp extra virgin olive oil



1 cup chicken or vegetable stock 14 lemon juice 2tsp finely grated lemon rind 3 garlic cloves, crushed 2 tbsp chopped fresh oregano

Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan forced. Grease a large roasting pan with oil.

Place the potato in the pan. Drizzle over the butter and oil. Toss until coated. Spread out to an even layer. Roast for 30 minutes.

Turn potato and rearrange layers, moving the bottom layers to the top. Whisk together the stock, lemon juice, rind, and garlic in a jug. Pour over and around the potato. Bake for a further 30 minutes or until the liquid has reduced and the potato is tender and golden.

Season, sprinkle with oregano to serve.

Moist Lemon cake

250g butter, at room temperature

1 cup caster sugar

1 tbsp finely grated lemon rind

4 eggs

1 + 2/3 cups self-raising flour

100ml fresh lemon juice

1 ¼ icing sugar

1 tbsp lemon juice plus ½ tbsp extra

Finely grated lemon rind to sprinkle

Preheat the oven to 180C/160C fan forced. Grease a 20cm (base size) round cake pan. Line the base and side with baking paper.

Use electric beaters to beat the butter, sugar and lemon rind in a bowl until pale and creamy. Add the eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition until well combined.

Use a spatula to fold the flour into the butter mixture until almost combined. Add the lemon juice and fold into mixture until just combined. Transfer to the prepared pan. Smooth the surface. Bake for 50 minutes or until golden and cake springs back when lightly touched. Set aside in pan for 10 minutes to cool slightly before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

To make the icing, sift the icing sugar into a bowl. Add 1 tbsp lemon juice and stir until combined. (Add the extra 1/2 tbsp juice if necessary to reach a smooth, spreadable consistency). Spread over the cooled cake and sprinkle with the lemon rind, if using. Set aside for 2 hours or until icing sets. Serve. Recipes taken from www. taste .com

Lemon Curd


125g unsalted butter Juice and zest of 3 lemons 1 cup caster sugar

6 egg yolks



Melt butter in saucepan and whisk in lemon juice, zest and sugar Add the egg yolks and whisk until mixture is smooth continue to heat and stir for 15 minutes. Look for consistency to coat a wooden spoon.
