RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

The restricted burning season commences 1 October 2022 and goes through to 13 November 2022.

This means that no burning can be carried out unless you have a permit from your local Fire Control Officer. From the 14 November 2022 through to the 7 February 2023 burning is PROHIBITED.

2022/23 FIREBREAK NOTICE - TOWNSITE LAND

All lots within the townsites of Harrismith, Tincurrin, Toolibin, Wickepin and Yealering are required to be cleared and maintained free of all debris or inflammable material. Failure to comply with these requirements renders the owner or occupier liable to a penalty not more than \$400.

A complete list of Fire Control Officers and Bush Fire information plus Council's Firebreak Notice is located on the opposite page of these notes.

HARVEST BAN ALERTS

The SMS (text) alert service will again be in operation over the coming harvest/bushfire period.

If you would like to register your number to receive these messages or have your number removed from the system, please contact the office or email your details to admin@wickepin.wa.gov.au.

BUSH FIRE UNIFORMS

Bush fire uniforms and personal protective goggles and respirators for Volunteer Bush Fire Brigade officers are available from the shire administration office, with one free uniform on registration with a local brigade.



DOG CONTROL

Council has recently received a number of complaints in relation to roaming dogs. It is an owners responsibility to keep their dog limited to their properly unless being walked on a leash. The Dog Act requires all dogs to be registered with the shire if it is 3 months or older. The registration period is 1 November to 31 October, registration renewals for 22/23 have been issued.

All dogs must be microchipped before registration. Copies of microchipping papers must be provided on registration.

All dogs found roaming will be impounded and the owners fined. For the release of an unregistered dog the registration must be paid along with the fine.



MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

Mental Health Week is a national week celebrated each year in October scheduled around World Mental Health Day on 10 October.

Coordinated by the Western Australian Association for Mental Health, with support from the WA Mental Health Commission, Mental Health Week (MHW) provides a prime opportunity to address and highlight the important connection between social determinants and mental health; and promote effective prevention strategies to keep people mentally healthy.

In 2022, Mental Health Week in WA will be held over 8-15 October with the theme: 'Where we live. How we live. What we've lived.'

Understanding how the body, mind and environment intersect is essential to overall wellbeing. Physical health — both inside of us and in the world around us — has a major impact on mental health. The nutrition we consume, movement of our bodies, the health of the planet and quality of our housing and neighbourhoods all play a part in building health communities and individuals.

Our bodies keep physical score of what we experience – it's important to encourage a trauma-informed lens in trying to understand challenging behaviours, intrusive thoughts and reactions. Learning how to process, heal and grow from negative experiences shapes our resilience, access to new opportunities, coping skills, strong connections and relationships, and quality of life.



Fire danger ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start.

They are important because they provide people with information so that they can take action to protect themselves and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of bushfires.

From September 1, Australians will have a simplified, action-oriented Fire Danger Rating System.



- The AFDRS will also introduce 'off' for those days where no proactive action is required by the community. On these days, you will still need to abide by local seasonal laws and regulations, but there is little or no risk of a fire that starts spreading in a dangerous or life-threatening way.
- The AFDRS is informed by one of Australia's largest social research projects which found that most Australians do not understand the current system, and would prefer a simpler, action-oriented set of fire danger ratings.
- The AFDRS is being implemented consistently across Australia and will mean that wherever you are across the country, you will be able to understand the threat posed on any given day and make appropriate decisions to keep you and your family safe.



CHANGING THE SCIENCE:

- The current Fire Danger Rating System is largely based on science that is more than 60 years old. New technology and research have greatly improved our ability to accurately predict fire behaviour and the potential threat to the community.
- The AFDRS uses the latest scientific understanding about weather, fuel and how fire behaves in different types of vegetation to improve the reliability of fire danger forecasts. This strengthens the ability of those working in emergency services to be better prepared, make improved decisions, and provide better advice to the community.
- The new fire danger rating system is designed to be continuously updatable so that the system can take advantage of improving science, data and information into the future.
- By better understanding fuel types and fire behaviour on any given day of fire risk, agencies will be in a stronger position to respond to fires, adopting specific firefighting suppression strategies.



BENEFITS:

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) Program is redesigning the forecasting of fire by:

- Improving the scientific accuracy behind fire danger predictions.
- Providing government and industry with better decision-making tools.
- Improving the way that fire danger is communicated.
- Reducing the costs associated with bushfire impacts.

The key benefit is a more prepared and resilient community resulting in a reduction in loss of life, property, and human harm.

The AFDRS calculates fire danger at a finer geographic scale than ever before so more relevant and specific information can be provided.

Significant cost savings are expected due to improved fire danger information leading to better decisions and more appropriate and timely action. It will also improve cross-border operations and support sharing of firefighting resources.

This is a national program funded by the Commonwealth and all the States and Territories and delivered by local implementation teams. The AFDRS is being coordinated by NSW RFS and AFAC (the National Council for Fire and Emergency Services), with support from the Bureau of Meteorology.

A National Program Board, with representation from each of the State and Territories' fire agencies, is overseeing the program.







When strawberries come into season, they are wonderfully sweet and juicy. Here are a couple of recipes to try......

Melt-and-mix strawberry yoghurt cake

Ingredients:

21/2 cups self-raising flour

250 grams strawberries, chopped coarsely

3/3 cup golden caster sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla bean paste

2 eggs, beaten lightly

1 cup greek-style yoghurt

125 grams unsalted butter, melted

½ cup roasted almonds, sliced thinly

1 cup greek-style yoghurt, extra

Macerated strawberries

250 grams strawberries, halved or quartered

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1 tablespoon golden syrup

Combine ingredients in a small bowl; stand for 20 minutes.



Method:

Preheat oven to 180°C/350°F. Line base and side of a 22cm (9-inch) springform pan with baking paper. Sift flour into a bowl; stir in strawberries, sugar, vanilla paste, egg, yoghurt and butter until just combined. Spoon mixture into pan; smooth the surface. Sprinkle with almonds.

Bake cake for 50 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Leave cake in pan for 10 minutes. Release ring; transfer cake to a wire rack to cool.

Meanwhile, make macerated strawberries.

Serve cake topped with macerated strawberries and extra yoghurt.

Almond and strawberry friands **Ingredients:**

6 egg whites

185 gram butter, melted

1 cup ground almonds

1 1/2 cup icing sugar

1/2 cup plain flour

100 gram strawberries, sliced thinly

1 teaspoon icing sugar, extra


Method:

Preheat oven to 200°C/400°F. Grease 12 x ½-cup oval friand pans; stand on oven tray.

Lightly whisk egg whites in medium bowl with a fork until combined. Add butter, ground almonds, sifted icing sugar and flour; using a wooden spoon, stir until just combined. Divide friand mixture among pans; top with strawberry slices.

Bake friands about 25 minutes. Turn, top-side up, onto wire rack to cool.

Serve friands warm, or at room temperature, dusted with extra sifted icing sugar.





Garden Snippets....



...Plant Some Passion

A favourite in warm temperate to tropical Australian gardens where they can grow year-round, the Passionfruit originates from South America. This lovely climber has it all; lush foliage, beautiful flowers and delicious fruit!

Planting Passionfruit: In warmer zones with mild winters, passionfruit can be planted throughout the year. In cool or cold zones, plant only during the warmer time of year - from October to March. Passionfruit vines usually fruit around 18 months after planting. Generally, they will produce two crops per year — one in late autumn and another in late spring, so be sure to begin fertilising at the end of summer and again at the end of winter. This can be done with either a Foliar Fertiliser or just use a single dose of Fruit and Citrus Plant Fertilizer for a bumper crop of fruit. Fruit should mature in under three months and be best tasting when fully ripe and about to fall off the vine. In circumstances that may be detrimental to the fruit, such as adverse weather conditions, ripening fruit can also be removed from the vine and allowed to ripen indoors. Healthy vines should be good bearers of fruit for 3-5 years. After this time, they should be replaced.

Passionfruit positioning: Passionfruit are not especially prone to disease and healthy, vigorous vines should have few problems. However, sometimes they may fruit poorly, so it is first advisable to examine their growing conditions. Correct planting and positioning of your vine can help it flourish and produce plenty of fruit. Passionfruit is sensitive to extended dry periods and frosts, which can adversely affect fruit yields. Fruiting can also be poor if the vine is exposed to strong winds or constant, heavy rain at the flowering time. Passionfruit needs full sun all year round and good airflow, so allow enough space around the vine and don't allow them to be smothered by other crops or hedging plants planted too close to them. Soil should be slightly acidic and have good drainage, which can be achieved by mixing plenty of organic compost into the soil before planting. If your soil is heavy clay, don't dig deeper into the soil. Instead, build up mounds of soil mixed with compost on top of the existing ground and use this for planting. This will prevent the roots from becoming water logged.

Pests and diseases: In warmer areas, fruit fly attack can be identified by the presence of corky, raised patches on the fruit's skin. Attach fruit fly traps according to the instructions to control this problem. Always pick up and dispose of any fallen fruit from your passionfruit plant or other fruit trees. This can prevent fruit fly from appearing in the first place. Leaf and fruit spots can be recognised as brown spots on the leaves surrounded by yellow. Eventually, affected leaves will fall off the plant. This problem can be controlled by applying Mancozeb as directed. Passionfruit woodiness virus is spread by aphids and has no cure. The good news is that it is rather rare. The leaves of affected plants will become rough and crinkled looking with raised, yellow veins. Fruit will become wrinkled, its skin very thick and the pulp bland and undeveloped. In such cases, the only treatment is to cut the vine out and replace it.

Watering passionfruit: Passionfruit vines need regular watering. When watering, water along the length of the plant not just where the stem and ground meet, as their roots extend along the entire dripline.

Passionfruit planting tip: Passionfruit have shallow roots which can be susceptible to drying out, so keep them well mulched and be careful not to disturb the roots by digging or planting around the base. Many of the passionfruit varieties available at your local grocery store are also available to be grown in the home garden, so do a taste test to help you decide which varieties to grow! Passionfruit needs to be planted near a strong structure like a fence, pergola, verandah or trellis as they can become very heavy when laden with fruit. The most common problem for passionfruit grown in home gardens is poor fruit or flower set, which is generally due to a lack of pollinated flowers.



The proceedings of the world-wide 192nd Semi Annual General Conference Held over October 1st and 2nd 2022 of The Church of JESUS CHRIST of Latter-day Saints are now available at the Church website https://www.churchofjesuschrist.org/?lang=eng

Have you ever wondered what the scriptures are, and where they come from? -The scriptures are a record of Gods dealings with man whenever He has established a covenant people upon the earth. He invites us to find out for ourselves the treasures they contain, and how they can bless us through all generations.

The scriptures in the early part of the **Old Testament** of the Bible are preserved portions of records, dating back through 6000 years, containing the first five books of Moses - of the great patriarchs, and records of the Hebrews, with the history, promises, covenants, exhortations and warnings, later the Judges, then reigns of the Kings and prophets of the **Twelve tribes of Jacob - Israel.**

The **Ten Northern tribes** –the greater majority of Asher, Dan, Gad, Naphtali, Issachar, Simeon, Joseph- (Ephraim, Manasseh,) Reuben, Zebulun, some of the tribe of Benjamin and their Kings and prophets were taken captive <u>first</u> between **735-720 BC**, when Israel generally forgot God, by the Assyrians, then became 'lost' to history, but it is recorded in the **Apocryphal** record that The Father led them away for His own purposes in order to preserve them, **to bring their remnants forth in the Latter days.** They have their own prophets and records.

The remainder of the scriptures in the Old and New Testaments are primarily records that have survived written by the House of Judah, and have been compiled in the format we are blessed to have, love and know as the Holy Bible today. The House of Judah, (and a small remnant of the eleven other tribes, including the Levites or Temple priests of the House of Levi,) with their Kings and prophets were taken into captivity second - initially into Assyria, then later around 597-580 BC – Jerusalem's inhabitants were carried captive into Babylon after a period of rebellion against God, but returned after 70 years for a while to Jerusalem,- fulfilling the prophecy of Judah being the lineage through whom Christ would come, - and were scattered after the horrific siege of Jerusalem under Titus in AD 70. The Jews have retained their distinctive identity as a people throughout all of their long dispersion or Diaspora.

The House of Joseph (Ephraim and Manasseh) was the <u>last</u> of the houses of Israel to be scattered and smitten. Joseph was the recipient of a particular Patriarchal Blessing given by his prophet father Jacob – Israel, (Genesis 49) that some of Joseph's branches of his descendants would run over into a distant land beyond Africa, from that of his family, - a land that would be characterised by long mountain chains and as the great prophet Isaiah foresaw, filled with rivers, (Isaiah 33) and would appear like the shape of wings (Isaiah 18 -the Americas and later, islands of the seas, chiefly Pacific and Atlantic). They kept their own records that were to be hidden up and come forth from the earth and speak 'from the dust' (Isaiah chapter 29) long after many of their people were destroyed in horrific fratricidal wars.

Isaiah, Ezekiel, Jeremiah and other prophets also saw the day of Restoration and Temples and a great people in the <u>"tops of the mountains"</u> with swift messengers going with the gospel to all the people of the world. Joseph's records we have had a small portion of for around 200 years since 1820 AD- and were kept by a series of prophets and abridged by the prophet historian Mormon in about 385 AD. This record testifies of Christ repeatedly. These prophets foresaw our day and the challenges we would face. These prophets also foresaw that the Bible would be defended, preserved and made available to the poorest and working classes of people through the years of the <u>reformation</u>, commencing in the 16th century, and eventually carried to their descendants by the people of the Gentile nations of Great Britain and Europe. They also saw the need for gathering the remnants of the various Houses of Israel and any others that wanted to join with them to a place of peace, safety, refuge, protection and defence in the latter days.

All scriptures are replete with the witness that <u>Jesus is The Christ</u>, the Saviour and Redeemer of the world, the very Son of God. They are also filled with the prophecies of the scattering of the various houses of Israel and the promise of <u>the Ingathering and Restoration of the House of Israel</u> and the blessings that will come to the people in the days of the <u>Restoration</u> throughout the world in the <u>Latter-days</u> preparatory to the Return of The Son Of God, Jesus Christ in Glory.

First the tribe of Joseph would begin to be gathered with their prophets and scriptures, commencing in 1820. Isaiah's prophecies are full of the latter day gathering, and indicates it would be hastened in the days of trains, cars, swift air travel and technological advances in communications. (Isaiah 60) Second the Tribe of Judah would begin to return to their promised lands as they have begun gathering post World War 2, after the proclamation by David Ben Gurion on 14 May 1948. Lastly the Ten Tribes will at some future time make their appearance with their prophets and scriptures, thus fulfilling the scripture that the last will be first and the first will be last.

The reading and study of the scriptures is a fascinating adventure and we can each find ourselves enlightened as the voice of the Spirit invites and speaks to us individually and collectively, and of course no one ever read all of the scriptures except they do it one page at a time.

You might even be surprised to learn that you too could be a descendant of one of the globally scattered Houses of Israel! **Great are the blessings of the Lord to all those who embrace Him and His gospel!** We are all God's children, and as such we can all become qualified to lay claim upon the rich blessings He delights to pour out upon us should we desire to do so.
