Chris Moore provided a few "old" items for attendees to guess what they might have been in their day.









Free mammograms for women in Wickepin

BreastScreen WA's FREE screening mammogram service is coming to Wickepin from 16/12/2022 - 21/12/2022 and the mobile clinic will be located at:

Wickepin Sports Club, Wogolin Road

Women 40 years and over with no symptoms are eligible for a FREE screening mammogram.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and 1 in 7 women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should contact her doctor immediately.



Going to the farmers market and talking with people who work on the farm inspires me to make recipes like this one, a quiche loaded with veggies. Great for packed lunches at harvest time.

FARM FRESH QUICHE:

INGREDIENTS:

1/4 cup olive oil

1 bunch broccoli, cut into florets

1 small onion, finely chopped

3 cups chopped fresh greens or spinach

3 garlic cloves, minced

1 sheet refrigerated pie crust

4 large eggs

1 cup milk

1 tablespoon minced fresh rosemary or

1 teaspoon dried rosemary, crushed

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

1/2 cup shredded smoked cheddar cheese,

1/2 cup shredded

Swiss cheese.

METHOD:

Preheat oven to 375°.

In a large skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add broccoli and onion; cook and stir until broccoli is crisp-tender. Stir in greens and garlic; cook and stir 4-5 minutes longer or until greens are wilted.

Unroll crust into a 9-in. pie plate; flute edge. Fill with broccoli mixture. In a small bowl, whisk eggs, milk, rosemary, salt and pepper. Stir in 1/4 cup cheddar cheese and 1/4 cup Swiss cheese; pour over vegetables. Sprinkle with remaining cheeses. Bake 30-35 minutes or until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Let stand 15 minutes before cutting.

Also great for lunch boxes: APPLE & SOUR CREAM SLICE

INGREDIENTS:

125 g butter melted
200 g (1 ⅓ cups) self-raising flour
150 g (¾ cup) caster sugar
65 g (¾ cup) desiccated coconut
2 tsp vanilla extract
2 eggs
250 g sour cream
2 apples peeled and thinly sliced
2 tsp ground cinnamon

METHOD:

Preheat oven to 180 degrees celsius (160 if using a fan forced oven). Grease and line a 20cm square cake tin with baking paper.

Place the melted butter, caster sugar, coconut and vanilla extract into a medium sized bowl. Sift over the self-raising flour. Mix until smooth and creamy.

Press mixture into the tin and bake for 15-20 minutes or until lightly golden.

Take the slice out of the oven and layer the thinly sliced apple over the top.

In a bowl, beat the sour cream and eggs together until well combined. Pour the sour cream mixture over the top of the apple. Sprinkle the ground cinnamon over the top (or cinnamon sugar). Place back into the oven for another 20 minutes or until the sour cream has set in.

Allow to cool in the tin before placing into the fridge to cool completely.

Cut into slices when completely cold.

DECEMBER 2022 COUNCIL MEETING

SHIRE DEPOT ACCESS

Members of the public are reminded that the Shire Depot is not to be entered without prior appointment.

Access to the Shire Depot is only granted when appropriate footwear (enclosed shoes) and high vis clothing is worn. Thank you for your understanding.

DOG CONTROL

Council has recently received a number of complaints in relation to roaming dogs. It is an owner's responsibility to keep their dog limited to their property unless being walked on a leash. The Dog Act requires all dogs to be registered with the shire if it is 3 months or older. The registration period is 1 November to 31 October.

ALL dogs must be microchipped before registration. Copies of microchipping papers must be provided on registration. ALL dogs found roaming will be impounded and the owners fined. For the release of an unregistered dog the registration must be paid along with the fine.
