The Village volunteer and buddy system

The Village is comprised of a wide range of people who are willing to support one another and receive support to enjoy living at home, safely in the community, with minimal cost, for as long as possible. The Village has 146 members across Wickepin, Cuballing, Wandering and Pingelly – and growing.

We are now about to launch The Village volunteer and buddy system. It must be safe for both the volunteer and the member receiving the assistance

Some say it has been a long time coming and they are correct.

Originally, this aspect of The Village was to operate simply between members via an app that all members could download. The app would have enabled any member to put out a call for assistance for small tasks they needed help with and other members could respond via the app indicating that they were available and would like to help.

The development of this app became too complex, costly and was taking too long so the decision was made to use the telephone. Members can call the concierge and the concierge will facilitate the connection between the member and a suitable volunteer or buddy.

In doing this, the concierge has sought additional insurance, developed policies and procedures and a Volunteers Handbook.

There is also a requirement for the concierge to take steps to ensure that all potential volunteers and buddies are registered with the concierge, have a police clearance and knowledge about The Village volunteering policies and procedures.

In the meantime, members have been surveyed about the services they need help with now and into the future, as well as how they would like to provide some volunteer service within the Village. This information will assist the concierge to facilitate the connection between those members needing some help and those willing to provide help.

Members (and non-members) who would like to volunteer to assist people to stay living in their own homes, in the community as they age will be asked to register as a volunteer and attend a short orientation session which will be advertised in the next week or two. If they do not have a police clearance, the concierge can assist in this process.

This is not to be confused with the paid employment people are registering for under the Community Coordinated Home Support Service (CCHSS). These people are paid as contractors to provide ongoing or one off care and support to an older person who has a funded Home Care Package or Disability Plan. You can also contact the concierge if you wish to register for employment or need ongoing care and support via a Home Care Package or Disability Plan.

Members will not be able to use the volunteer and buddy system if they receive funding from the government to pay for the services they need via a Home Care Package or Disability Plan.

This service should not in any way prevent members from making personal arrangements with family, friends and neighbours. The Village volunteer system kicks in for a member without other options for the assistance required.

We aim for our volunteer and buddy system to be mutually beneficial to all – creating opportunities for new friendships to develop between volunteers and members receiving the service as they participate in social activities and events, share experiences, and discover mutual benefits.

We hope it will provide opportunities for members receiving services and volunteers alike to feel appreciated and have a pleasant, rewarding and quality experience whilst bringing enjoyment and meaning to belonging to The Village.



Free mammograms for women in Wickepin

BreastScreen WA's FREE screening mammogram service is coming to Wickepin

from 16/12/2022 - 21/12/2022

and the mobile clinic will be located at:

Wickepin Sports Club, Wogolin Road

Women 40 years and over with no symptoms are eligible for a FREE screening mammogram.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and 1 in 7 women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should contact her doctor immediately.

White Christmas pudding

Ingredients

. 225g (1 1/2 cups) plain flour

125g (1 1/2 cups) fresh white breadcrumbs

120g (3/4 cup) dried cranberries

100g (1/2 cup) red glace cherries

100g pistachio kernels

180g pkt white chocolate, chopped

175g salted butter, chopped, at room temperature

125ml (1/2 cup) sweetened condensed milk

100g (1/2 cup) caster sugar

3 eggs

180g white chocolate, melted, cooled

Vanilla custard, to serve

Method

In a large bowl, combine flour, breadcrumbs, cranberries, cherries, pistachio kernels and chopped white chocolate.


Use an electric beater to beat butter, condensed milk and sugar in a bowl until pale and creamy. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add the melted chocolate and beat until well combined. Use a wooden spoon to stir butter mixture into flour mixture until well combined. Spoon mixture into prepared pudding basin. Cover with a sheet of baking paper, then a sheet of foil, allowing paper to overhang side by 3-4cm. Secure paper and foil with a large rubber band, or tie tightly with kitchen string. Place in a large saucepan. Pour in boiling water to come three-quarters up the side of the basin. Cover. Cook over low heat for 4 hours, topping up the water when necessary, or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Set aside, in basin, for 15 minutes to cool slightly before turning onto a serving plate.

Serve with vanilla custard.

Quick choc mousse

Ingredients

100g dark chocolate, chopped 300ml thickened cream, chilled 1/2 cup (165g) Coles Smooth Hazelnut Spread Crumbled Cadbury Flake chocolate bar, to serve



Method

Place dark chocolate in a heatproof bowl over a saucepan of simmering water (make sure bowl doesn't touch the water). Stir with a metal spoon for 3-4 mins or until chocolate just melts. Set aside for 5 mins to cool slightly.

Use an electric mixer to whisk the cream in a large bowl until soft peaks form. Add the choc-hazelnut spread and whisk until the mixture is just combined. Add the melted chocolate. Use a large metal spoon to gently marble.

Spoon the mousse evenly among serving glasses. Sprinkle with Flake bar and serve immediately.

Garden Snippets...



...Happy Hedging

Spring into Summer is the time of the year when everything is growing crazy – especially hedges and shrubs that are "hedge-types"- so now that the danger of frost (and snow) has passed, it's time to give them a spruce up. Regular trimming and clipping helps to thicken up hedges, keeping them dense and bushy, clothed in fresh new growth and, in some cases, encourages flowering stems and brightly coloured new leaves – And (of course) it helps to keep your hedge in the nice shape that you want.

Why Clip and Trim?- Hedge clipping helps to improve the air flow through the plant, increases sunlight reaching the inner branches and stems and lets in the rainfall direct to the trunk and roots. This helps to keep plants healthy and green inside and out.

At the end of each growing shoot of your shrub is a hormone, which tells the shoot to keep growing in that direction. Once you remove the tip of a growing shoot, that growth hormone rushes backwards into the branch. The hormone has to go somewhere, and so it goes out of the sides of the branch to create new side-shoots – thus the plant becomes more dense and bushy.


Clipping should be done with caution to avoid unsightly stumps of branches. Light trimming through the growing months will give a nice leafy finish, but over-enthusiastic clipping can leave you with a dead-looking bush for a few weeks or more. Try to choose hedging plants to ultimately suit the size that you require. If you need a 2m privacy screen, it is wise to choose a variety that reaches 2-3m fully grown and be patient. This is far wiser that choosing one that reaches 4-5m, that may reach your perfect height sooner, but always needs cutting back to size.

Hard Pruning – If you haven't clipped your hedges in a while, if you're rescuing a neglected garden, or if your shrubs are getting a bit overgrown, many will tolerate a heavy prune by cutting back hard into the old woody trunks and branches to help rejuvenate old bushes and bring young flowering stems down closer to eye level. If you are in doubt about hard-pruning, just look for leaf buds on your old plant then cut one branch to see if it re-generates. If it does, then you are good to prune.

Fertilize to Thrive - Your newly pruned plant is going to want to put out new shoots as a result of the pruning, which will require energy to grow, so follow pruning up with fertilising and watering to promote the new growth. Fresh mulch is also beneficial, just like a cup of hot sweet tea after a shock.

Talking about tea, It's time for a well earned cuppa for yourself after all of that great work!!









Avoid disappointment, get on top of Christmas shopping early

Christmas is an exciting and magical time of year but the lead up to the big day can often be chaotic and stressful. With online shopping scams and delivery delays, Western Australian shoppers are urged to get on top of their Christmas shopping early to avoid disappointment.

Online shopping is an easy and convenient choice to buy Christmas gifts, but Western Australian shoppers should be aware of scammers looking to trick unsuspecting victims into buying a product they may never receive.

Already in 2022, WA ScamNet reports 354 Western Australians have lost a total of \$1,074,637 to online shopping scams through a range of fake websites and social media pages.

To be cyber safe when shopping online, look at the overall quality of the website or social media page. If there are grammatical errors, poorly edited images and no address for their location, it could be a scam.

Another red flag is the method of payment requested, only pay by credit card or a secure payment method like PayPal. That way, if something goes wrong, you can get your money back much easier. Don't be fooled into paying via electronic funds transfer, money order, pre-loaded money card or crypto currency as it is unlikely you will get your money back through this method if you don't receive your goods.

With record numbers of Australians shopping online, deliveries are already surging so it is recommended to do online shopping and post your Christmas gifts early. Check the guide on the Australia Post website for when to post parcels so they arrive in time for Christmas.

Online retailers should provide a timeframe for delivery and if your goods fails to arrive by the timeframe indicated (or within a reasonable amount of time if no timeframe was indicated), your Australian Consumer Law (ACL) rights mean you can ask for a refund or credit.

For goods that don't arrive, you can seek a chargeback from your financial institution if you paid via credit card. If you paid by PayPal you can lodge a dispute for a refund.

The best advice to ensure your Christmas gifts make it under the tree this year, is to shop in local brick and mortar stores or give preference to Western Australia online retailers.
