

Country Stargazing **Planetary Conjunctions**

with Carol Redford and Donna Vanzetti, Astrotourism WA

Just as our daylight skies are ever-changing, with new sunsets and cloud formations, our evening skies are constantly changing too, as the star patterns move across the sky throughout the year. And amongst the stars are a few brighter ones that seem to wander on their own path. These are of course the planets of our solar system. The word planet means "wanderer", given by the ancient Greek's who studied the night sky and began to understand their orbits.

As the planets continue their never-ending path around the Sun, their orbits can sometimes bring the planets together forming incredible conjunctions, from our perspective here on earth.

Between the 22nd of February and 8th of March, head outside just after sunset and watch the planets in motion! Jupiter and Venus will approach each other before beginning to move further apart from our perspective! The Moon will even join in on the 22nd and 23rd!

Jupiter and Venus Conjunction.

Adding to the spectacle, on 28th Feb, Mars makes a close approach to the Moon. Visible as a red star, Mars can be easily seen with the naked eye. Don't confuse Mars for the nearby Aldebaran and Betelgeuse stars however, as the three red objects and the Moon make a large triangle in the sky.


When to look: Just after sunset 22nd February to 2nd March

Which direction to look: Low to the western horizon for Jupiter and Venus. For the Moon and Mars, north north-west in the early evening.


In closing, I would like to wish everyone a wonderful and successful year ahead.





Garden Snippets....



...Marvellous Melaleucas

Melaleucas, or Honey Myrtles, are a genus of shrubs in the Myrtaceae family, and contains over 150 species, most essentially Australian, with the exception of a few which extend to Papua New Guinea, New Caledonia and Melanesia.

Sizes range from small shrubs to tall paperbark trees, and are found in places from swamps and bogs to dry sandy plains. They grow to various sizes, are hardy and are often used as fast-growing screening plants in the home garden as they are very adaptable.

In Melaleucas' flowers, the stamens are longer than the petals and this characteristic is used to separate it from many genera; and although the melaleuca genus is very similar to the callistemon and kunzea (also genus of shrubs in the family of Myrtaceae), it differs by having the stamens united in bundles opposite to the petals.

Cultivation:


- ® Propagate melaleuca from seeds or cuttings, or purchase from the local nursery
- Will grow in any soil, and they can endure bad drainage and saline soil conditions
- Plant in full sun to encourage flowering, but will tolerate part shade as well
- After planting, mulch and water well.
- Prune after flowering to encourage compact growth habit
- Tolerant of light frost and moderate drought once established
- Being so diverse, there will be at least one variety for any aspect of your garden

Some Varieties:

The bracelet honey myrtle, *Melaleuca armillaris*, is resistant to salt spray and will accept most soils and aspects. It is used as a street tree in many suburbs, and bears white flowers in spring and summer.

The oval-leafed honey myrtle, *Melaleuca elliptica*, is an erect shrub to 2 metres and is reliable in most well-drained soils, but does require full sun. It has red bottlebrush-like flower spikes from spring through to autumn.

The scented honey myrtle, *Melaleuca squarrosa*, is a dense round shrub to 3 metres which enjoys moist conditions. It bears profuse cream flowers in early summer which are showy and sweetly perfumed.







Tiramisu

Ingredients

2 tablespoon instant coffee

3/4 cup (180ml) boiling water

1/2 cup (125ml) marsala

1/4 cup (60ml) kahlua (coffee liqueur)

3 eggs, separated

1/2 cup (110g) caster sugar

500 gram mascarpone

2 tablespoon marsala, extra

1/4 cup (55g) caster sugar, extra

1/3 cup (80ml) thickened cream

375 gram small sponge-finger biscuits

1 tablespoon cocoa powder, approximately

Method

Combine instant coffee and boiling water in a shallow bowl. Stir in marsala and Kahlua.

Beat the egg yolks and sugar in a medium bowl with an electric mixer until light and fluffy (for about 4-5 minutes).

Fold in the mascarpone and add the extra marsala into the egg yolk mixture until just combined.

Beat egg whites and extra sugar in a clean, small bowl with an electric mixer until soft peaks form.

Gently fold egg white mixture into mascarpone mixture and then fold in the thickened cream.

Dip half the biscuits, one at a time, for 1-2 seconds only, into coffee mixture and arrange biscuits in a single layer in a 2-litre (8-cup capacity) square or rectangular dish.

Spread half the mascarpone mixture over the biscuits. Repeat with remaining biscuits and mascarpone mixture. Cover, refrigerate overnight. Just before serving tiramisu, dust the top with sifted cocoa.

Passionfruit and mango cheesecake

Ingredients

Base

250 gram digestive biscuits

125 gram butter, melted

2 teaspoon ground ginger

Filling

170 gram can passionfruit pulp

2 teaspoon finely grated lime rind

3 teaspoon gelatine

1/3 cup (90g) grated palm sugar

500 gram cream cheese, softened

1 cup (250ml) thickened cream, whipped


1 medium (430g) mango, sliced thinly


3 fresh passionfruit


Method

Process biscuits until fine. Add butter and ginger, process until combined. Press mixture over the base of a 22cm springform pan. Refrigerate 30 minutes.

Meanwhile, make filling: Strain the syrup from the canned passionfruit into a small heatproof jug. Discard the seeds. Add lime rind, then sprinkle over the gelatine. Stand jug in small saucepan of simmering water. Stir until gelatine dissolves. Cool 5 minutes. Stir in palm sugar to jug. Beat cream cheese in a medium bowl with an electric mixer until smooth then beat in the gelatine mixture. Fold in whipped cream. Pour filling into springform pan over base. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Serve cheesecake topped with sliced mango and fresh passionfruit pulp.







Can Collection


