Tomato Sauce (No2)

6kg ripe tomatoes

1 1/2 litres vinegar

1 tbsp. salt

2tbsp. peppercorns

7 large onions

1 tsp. cayenne 1 1/2kg sugar

2 tbsp. allspice.



Boil tomatoes and onions for two hours. Strain. Add other ingredients (tie peppercorns and allspice in a muslin bag). Boil 2 ½ hours. Discard spice bag, bottle, and seal.

Tomato Relish (No2)

1 1/2 kg ripe tomatoes

500g sugar

2 tbsp plain flour

1 tbsp salt

500g onions

1 1/2 tbsp mustard powder

1 tbsp curry powder

vinegar

Cut up the tomatoes and onions finely and sprinkle with salt. Leave overnight. Next day drain well and put in a pan with sugar. Almost cover with vinegar and boil for 5 minutes. Mix flour, mustard, and curry to a paste with vinegar and add.

Mix well and boil for 1 hour. Bottle while hot.

Tomato Chutney (No2)

6kg ripe tomatoes

750g onions

3 kg apples

750g sultanas

15g cloves

1 1/2kg sugar

125g salt

750ml vinegar

15g cayenne pepper

15g allspice

Boil tomatoes to a pulp, then strain. Add to the liquid, the vinegar, and spices in a cloth.

Boil for ½ an hour, then add all ingredients, and boil about 4 hours.

Sterilising Jars and bottles

Jars, bottles, and lids must be sterilised before using.

An easy way to sterilise is to wash them in detergent and rinse thoroughly.

Put the jars on an oven rack upside down and heat for about 15 minutes.

Best to keep them in the oven until ready to use, as the jars need to be warm when filled.

Instead of lids preserve covers can be used. Don't forget to label and date your produce.
