What is the story behind hot cross buns?



Today, **hot cross buns are not just enjoyed in Australia**. Since the bun originated in England, most countries where Englishmen settled have the custom of eating the bun. This includes Ireland, Canada, New Zealand, South Africa, and of course Australia. 5 Feb 2021

It is most important that truck drivers be looked after in their difficult job.

Trucks entering Wickepin townsite from the East have a fairly steep hill to travel down immediately, from about the Bowling Club.

Changing the speed limit two thirds of the way down near the swimming pool is not a good idea.

"J" brake must be employed to avoid heating the main truck brakes.

Speed limit must be established on the flat section of the road just prior to the town boundary, not far from the Bowling Club.

Taken from Shire of Wickepin Council Meeting Minutes - 20 October 2021

Recommendations:

- That Council request Main Roads WA to reduce the speed limit in the main street of Wickepin, Wogolin Road, from 50kph to 40kph
- That Council request Main Roads WA to place a pedestrian crossing in the main street of Wickepin, Wogolin Road.

Voting Requirements:

Simple majority

Resolution No 201021-20

Moved Cr Astbury/Seconded Cr Mearns

That Council request Main Roads WA to reduce the speed limit in the main street of Wickepin, Wogolin Road, from 50kph to 40kph.

Carried 7/0

This is the refusal by the Main Roads Department. Refusing the request of our Shire Councillors, which, if it had been allowed, would have made us and our own children safer.

Speed Zone Wogolin Road

Mr Ben Doman, Network Operations Co-ordinator Wheatbelt Region (Northam) Central & Northern Regions Main Roads forwarded the following email to the CEO on the 3rd December 2021 regarding the request for the speed zone on Wogolin Road to be reduced from 50kmh to 40kmh.

Speed limits across the network are continually assessed to ensure that all WA roads continue to meet driver expectations whilst also achieving a balance between traffic safety, land use amenity and transport efficiency. To achieve this balance many factors are taken into account during the speed zoning process including the road function, traffic volumes, types of road users, abutting roadside development, the frequency and type of intersections, reported crash data and prevailing traffic speeds. Main Roads has assessed the current speed limit on Wogolin Road (in the vicinity of the new children's playground).

Wogolin Road is classified as a primary distributor road within the functional road hierarchy. During onsite inspections it was found that:

- 1. There is sufficient formalised car parking provisions on each side of the children's park and that there would be an expectation that children not yet competent in making safe crossing decision (young children) will be brought to the playground by their parents who will park in the available car parking bays;
- 2. Unobstructed pathways were provided to the car parking area;
- 3. On 2 separate site inspections, no children were seen in the playground, identifying that use will be sporadic;
- 4. The kerb ramp at the front of the playground connecting to the pathway directly in front of the Wickepin Hotel had restricted visibility due to the placement of signage; and
- 5. There is a pavement width of approx. 9mts, which does not support a 40km/h zone or promote a low speed environment.

MRWA speed zoning policy identifies that speed limits should not be reduced for isolated hazards, and that treatment should be by way of warning and/or advisory signage.

It is considered that the current speed limit is appropriate for Wogolin Road and it is not proposed to reduce the speed limit to 40km/h.

Page 109

The Main Roads Department owns 18,000kms of Main Roads. This is as it should be; correct.

It is only just that every town owns its streets inside its towns boundary.

Wickepin does not own its central street.

We have no rights over our street.

The street is used by all vehicles regardless of size.

The concept that our Shire Councillors are obligated to go to an outside entity to ask for change is archaic, medieval.

It is obviously undemocratic.

We must own our street!

Think of our tourist visitors from interstate and overseas, who come to immerse themselves in the history of Wickepin, and our famous son, Albert Facey.

They should have a better and safer experience when turning their caravans and trailers in a slower central street.

There is a wonderful booklet written and created by Rose O'Sullivan that is for sale at the CRC for six dollars. A booklet highly recommended for everyone to read, hopefully purchase a copy.

It is titled "A Town Is Born".

It could be argued that Wickepin is not yet fully born when our central street is owned by an outside entity.

The Main Roads Department owns and manages 18,000kms of Main Roads. It has eleven hundred employees and is based in a city of two million people, located some distance from our village.

Most of this large number of people have never heard of Wickepin. The few that have, are busy; with their own lives to live.


They do not have the time spare, to think about Wickepin and its inhabitants.


It is beholden on those who live in our Shire and town, to take care of our own.





Large Print Fiction - The Girls Who Disappeared: Claire Douglas





We have also been allocated a new School Psychologist who will be commencing at WPS on Friday 24 March and attending the school on a fortnightly basis. We can also access services such as CAHMS, O/T and assist with Paediatrician referrals.

Unfortunately, although having our funding approved for a Chaplain, we have still yet to be allocated a person. I hope that this is resolved sooner rather than later as this valuable human resource is sadly missed at the school.

If you have any concerns around your child and think they may need some assistance please discuss this with their classroom teacher so that we can help you support them.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN is done and dusted for another year. This year was a brand new process and much earlier in the year. My understanding is how it will be presented to you as parents will also look different. A huge thank you goes to Mrs Michelle Hull for all her assistance getting this implemented and also Ms Tarnelle Wyllie for offering to supervise the remaining Year 4 & 6 students.

Recipes for Easter

Salmon and quinoa salad

Ingredients:

1 cup quinoa

3 cup water

200 gram snow peas, trimmed, sliced

thinly lengthways

1 lebanese cucumber, halved lengthways,

sliced thinly crossways



Combine quinoa and the water in a large saucepan; bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low; cook, covered, for 15 minutes or until liquid is absorbed and quinoa is tender. Rinse, drain well.

Place snow peas in a heatproof bowl. Cover with boiling water; stand for 2 minutes. Refresh under cold running water; drain well.

Place quinoa and snow peas in a large bowl with cucumber and mint; toss to combine.

Season to taste. Add combined juice and oil; toss to coat.

Serve salad topped with salmon and rind

Semolina-crusted fish with fresh tomato salsa Ingredients:

2 medium Roma tomatoes, seeded, chopped finely

1/4 cup (40g) kalamata olives, pitted, sliced thinly

2 tablespoon drained baby capers, rinsed, drained

2 tablespoon finely chopped flat-lead parsley

1/3 cup (80ml) lemon juice

1/3 cup (80ml) extra virgin olive oil

1 cup (100g) fine semolina

1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh dill

12 (650g) whiting fillets (or other thin white fish fillets)

60 gram butter, chopped

pan-fried zucchini batons, to serve

steamed broccolini, to serve

Method:

Semolina-crusted fish with fresh tomato salsa

To make the salsa: combine the tomato, olives, capers, parsley, juice and oil in a small bowl. Combine the semolina and dill in a wide bowl and season with sea salt and ground white pepper. Toss the fish in the semolina; transfer to a plate.


Heat a large non-stick frying pan and add the butter. When the butter has melted and is beginning to froth, add the fillets in batches. Pan-fry for about 2 minutes on each side or until just cooked through. Cooking time will depend on the thickness of the fish.

Transfer fish to 4 warm plates and spoon over the tomato olive salsa. Serve with pan-fried zucchini batons and steamed broccolini, if desired.


