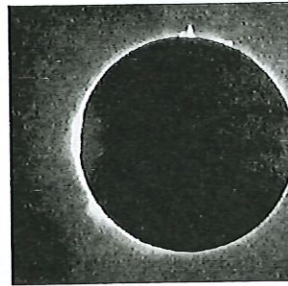

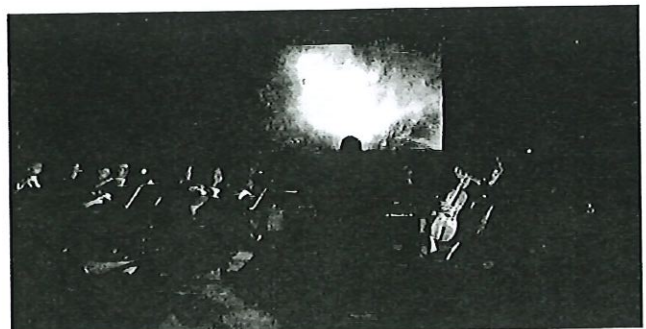

The music was choreographed to fit the images of space which was narrated by Venusian Volcanologist, Dr Antony Brian who explained the theory of the beginnings of our Universe, the gas planets, the rocky planets, the sun and the moon and were images taken as recently as 2021 and were, well, out of this world.

The art installation took up the entire side wing of the hall and transported viewers through the solar system, and has been a four month project and were all created by St Matthews Primary school, Yealering and Wickepin schools and the Narrogin Art group. 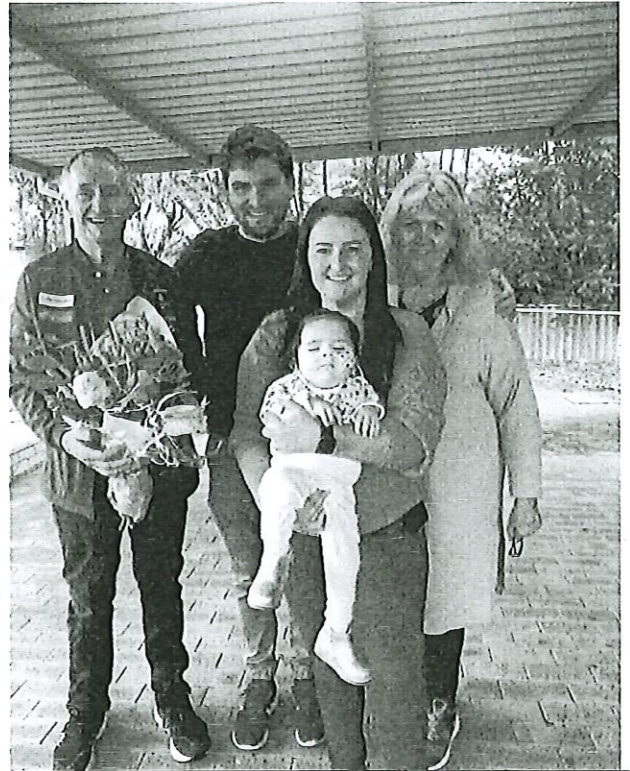
Fundraiser for Everleigh

ANZAC SERVICE 2023

Welcome & Prayer-Cr Russell welcomes all to the Service

Good Morning Ladies & Gentlemen, Girls & Boys, and welcome to our ANZAC Day Ceremony for 2023.

For over a Century Australian Defence Forces have served with distinction in conflict and in peace around the world, protecting Values of Freedom and Democracy.

Each year on ANZAC Day we commemorate this Service and the great debt we owe to the Men, Women and Animals of our Australian Defence Forces - the Army; The Navy and The Air Force - for their courage and sacrifice.

In World War 1 the ANZAC Spirit was forged 108 years ago today on 25 April 1915 when 16,000 Australian and New Zealand soldiers landed at Dawn at what is now called Anzac Cove on the Gallipoli Peninsula, with the intention of forcing Germany's ally, Turkey, out of the war. By that evening 2,000 young ANZACS had been killed or wounded. The Gallipoli campaign ended on 9th January, 1916.

Australia was involved in 29 of the Many battles of WW1 on the Western Front, which ran across the Industrial Regions of France and Belgium, and across Europe.

At dusk on 31st October 1917, the 10th Australian Light Horse Brigade charged the town of Beersheba (in the Middle East) using their bayonets as swords, and taking the Turkish Defence by such surprise that they were able to secure the town and clear the way for the British to successfully advance for the third time on the city of Gaza in Southern Palestine. This secured the town's water wells, which gave and maintained adequate water supplies for the men and their horses in the large number of mounted troops.

Between June and October 1918 Australian troops fought resolutely along the Western Front in Northern France. 100 days of war included the battles of Hamel; Amiens; and others and made significant contributions towards paving the way towards the Armistice on November 11th, 1918 – thus bringing WW1 to an end.

One million Australians, both men and women, served in the Second World War - fighting in campaigns in Europe, the Mediterranean and North Africa against Germany and Italy, as well as in south-east Asia and the Pacific against Japan.

Between 1950 and 1953 18,000 of our servicemen and women served, as Australia was one of 21 countries that supported South Korea against an invasion by communist North Korea.

The Vietnam War (1955-75) was the second of the Indochina Wars, and was fought between South Vietnam (being backed by the United States) and the Viet Cong, (the communist-led insurgent force supported by the North Vietnamese Army).

The Viet Cong wanted to unify the country after the partition that resulted from the first IndoChina war of 1946-54.

Australian support for South Vietnam was in the context of a desire by the United States, and other nations, to stop the spread of communism in Europe and Asia.

Whilst Australia didn't enter the war until 1962, it was to become our longest conflict of the 20th century.

In total, more than 60,000 Australian ground troops, air-force and naval personnel served in Vietnam; of which 523 were killed and more than 3,000 were wounded. Plus civilians, including those providing medical and dental aid, education, construction and agricultural assistance to the Vietnamese people.

Australian forces were withdrawn in 1971, with the last arriving home in March of 1972.

In January 1973, 50 years ago this year, Australia officially issued a proclamation to mark the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War.

Not many people understood The Vietnam War, including the introduction of a selective conscription scheme, and it was the cause of significant social and political dissent. As Time has moved on, and from those of us who remember that period, we give our deepest respect and grateful thanks to all who served our Country and wore our uniform, in all of the conflicts of the Vietnam War.

For more than a Century the Australian and New Zealand Defence Forces have served side by side in countries around the world and this ANZAC Day we commemorate this mateship.

We gather to Remember the Sacrifices of the Original ANZAC's, and to Pay Respect, and Give Thanks, to our Service Men, Women and Animals who have served, and continue to serve Our Nation;
And we take this opportunity to Remember Those Who are No Longer With Us.

Please welcome Irene Moore, who will read "**Anzac Reflection**", followed by "**the Prayer of Remembrance**".

You may have noticed, as you walked up the steps, there are some new additions to our Memorial Gardens, in the form of 2 x Wickepin District Honour Roll Boards, with lighted silhouettes.

The board on the West side has etched into the stainless steel, the names of all servicemen and women from our District who served in World War 1.

Similarly, the board on the East side has etched into the stainless steel, the names of all servicemen and women from our District who served in WW2; Korea; Vietnam; and Other Service Volunteers from 1939 to 1995.

It has been long desired for our war time honour boards to be upgraded, so this project was undertaken by the Shire's Research Team, and the names have all been meticulously researched, spell-checked and collated by Steffie Green who worked alongside the Community Development Officer at the time, Karen Langford.

The project was enthusiastically supported and funded jointly by the Department of Veteran's Affairs and the Honorable Darren West, MLC to whom we are extremely grateful as the cost was quite significant.

Installation into the Memorial Gardens was carried out by our own Shire Works Crew.

Grateful Thanks are extended to all parties involved in this project, which took some time to achieve, and has resulted in the memories of the servicemen and women from our whole district over the many years becoming a part of our memorial gardens and so are more readily available for public viewing.

Please take a look as you pass by.

In closing, I would like to thank those who organised our Commemorative Service today, and those who have participated, assisted and contributed in any way.

I would also like to Thank Everyone who has attended, and Invite you all to the Town Hall to share in Morning Tea.

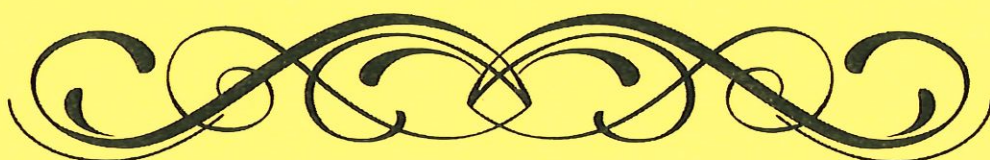

We came together as a community to commemorate all Australian and New Zealanders who served and died in all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations. We remembered the contribution and suffering of all those who have served. We will remember them so their sacrifices were not in vain.

Thank you to all those who braved the cold and contributed to the ceremony and the community morning tea. It was wonderful to see so many of you there.

A special thank you to our Shire President, Cr Julie Russell for her words and to Mrs. Irene Moore, for sharing her ANZAC reflection and reading the Prayer of Remembrance.

Our tradition of our Shire Freeman, Mr. Murray Lang reading the Ode to Remembrance and the Last Post being played by Mr. David Koppers continued, with an emotive and heartfelt effort.

The children from Wickepin Primary School represented their school beautifully and should be very proud of their contribution, and Colin Plumb for the raising of the flag.

On concluding the ceremony, Cr Russell acknowledged the completion to the upgrade of the Memorial Gardens, which includes the installation of 2 stainless steel Honour Roll Boards along with 2 soldier silhouettes.

The boards have the names of all servicemen and women from our district who served in WW1, WW2, Korea, Vietnam, and Other Service Volunteers from 1939 to 1995, etched in to them.

Thank you to Mrs. Stefie Green who meticulously researched and collated the names, working alongside our Community Development Officer at the time, Mrs. Karen Langford, and shire staff to bring this significant project to fruition, resulting in the memories of the servicemen and women of our district, being more accessible for public viewing. 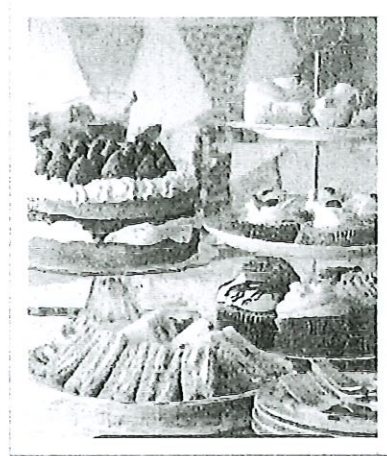

2023 Influenza Vaccines

Free adult influenza vaccines are now available at the Wickepin Health Service for eligible clients

Monday drop-in clinic 9:30am – 12:30pm

The following individuals in WA are eligible to receive government-funded vaccine:

- individuals 65 years or older
- pregnant women (any trimester)
- Aboriginal people 6 months and older
- individuals with medical conditions that place them at risk for complications of influenza, including:
 - cardiac disease
 - chronic respiratory conditions
 - chronic neurological conditions
 - impaired immunity
 - diabetes and other metabolic disorders
 - renal disease
 - haematological disorders

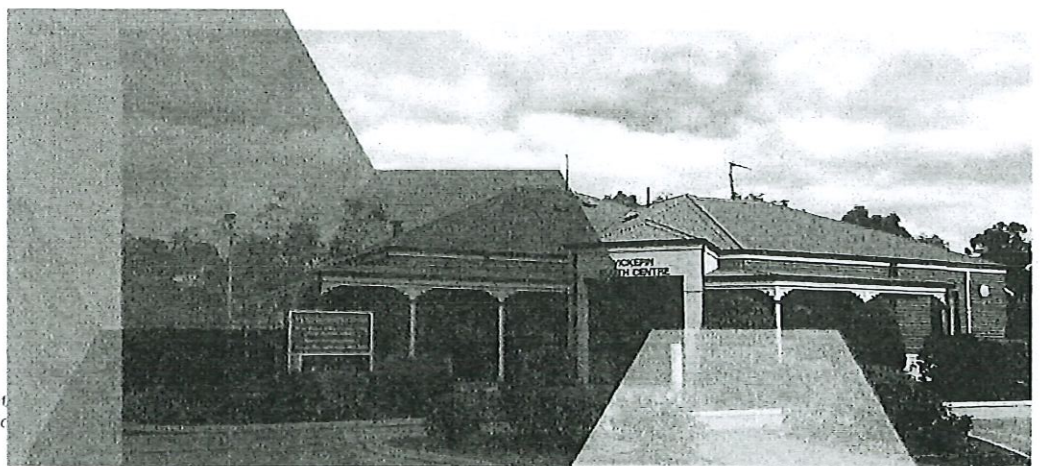

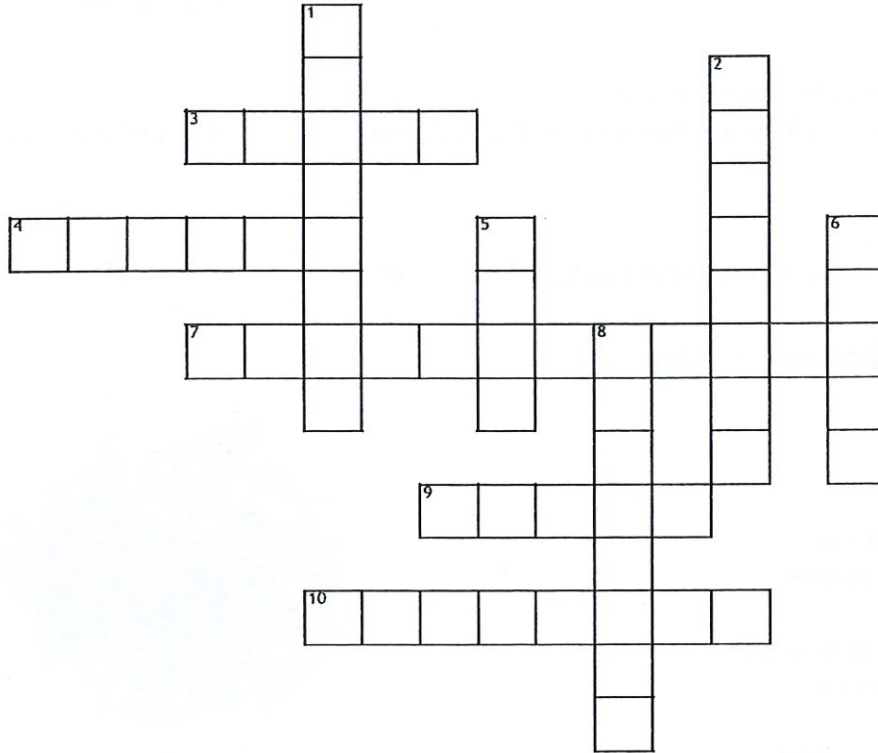

Easy recipes to make for Mothers Day

Homemade pancakes

- 2 1/2 cups milk
- 1 1/2 cups plain flour
- 1 1/2 cups self-raising flour
- 2 eggs

Combine all ingredients in a bowl and whisk until the mixture is no longer lumpy.

Spray a pan with non-stick spray and heap 1/4 cup of mixture at each corner of the pan at medium heat until pancake mixture bubbles.

Flip and cook the other side.

Repeat with remaining mixture.

- 1/4 cup sweet chilli sauce
- 2 tbsp sweet soy sauce
- 2 tbsp oyster sauce
- 2 tbsp peanut oil
- 600g Beef Rump Steak, thinly sliced.
- 1 large red onion, cut into thin wedges
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 bunch baby broccoli, cut into 5cm lengths
- 450g pkt' microwavable jasmine rice
- 100g snow peas, trimmed
- 3/4 cup (120g) cashews, toasted, chopped

Combine the sweet chilli sauce, soy sauce and oyster sauce in a small jug.

Heat 2 tsp of the oil in a wok or large frying pan over high heat. Stir-fry half the beef for 2-3 mins or until brown.

Transfer to a bowl. Repeat with 2 tsp of the oil and remaining beef. Wipe the wok or pan clean.

Heat the remaining oil in the wok or pan. Add the onion. Stir-fry for 2 mins. Add the garlic and broccoli. Stir-fry for 2 mins or until just tender.

Meanwhile, heat the rice following packet directions.

Return the beef to the wok or pan with the snow peas, cashew and soy sauce mixture. Stir-fry for 1-2 mins or until heated through and well combined. Serve with the rice.



Scrunchy apple pie

Kids of all ages will enjoy making this fun fruity pie ... and they'll love eating it, too!

- 4 large granny smith apples, peeled, cored, cut into thick wedges
- 1 tbsp water
- 1 tbsp caster sugar
- Pinch of ground cinnamon
- 4 sheets filo pastry, halved crossways
- Olive oil spray
- Icing sugar mixture, to dust
- Cream, to serve

Preheat oven to 190°C. Place the apple and water in a large saucepan over high heat. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low and cook, covered, for 10 minutes or until apple softens. Remove from heat. Stir in the sugar and cinnamon. Set aside for 30 minutes to cool.

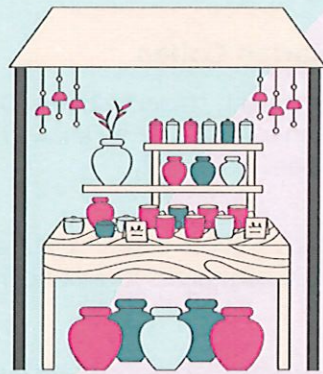
Spoon the apple mixture into a 1.25L (5-cup) capacity ovenproof dish. Place filo on a clean work surface. Cover with a clean tea towel, then a damp tea towel (this will prevent it from drying out). Lightly spray 1 filo sheet with olive oil spray. Fold in half crossways. Scrunch into a rosette shape. Place on the apple mixture. Repeat with remaining filo. Bake for 15 minutes or until golden. Dust with icing sugar. Serve with cream.
