

Country Stargazing

Have You Seen the Emu In The Sky?

One of the most incredible objects to see in the night sky is the Aboriginal constellation of the Emu In The Sky. It lies within the band of the Milky Way and its shape is outlined by dark areas of the night sky, not the stars. The Emu is best seen throughout winter in dark country skies and is spectacular, spreading right across the evening sky.

To find it, first locate the Southern Cross constellation above the southern horizon. Two bright stars directly above due south are, "the Pointers" to the Southern Cross. The Southern Cross is to the right of "the Pointers".

On the left-hand side of the Southern Cross, try to find a dark oval shape, called the Coalsack Nebula. This is the head of the Emu with the beak pointing downward. The long neck stretches to the left through the middle of "the Pointers". The body and legs of the Emu stretch halfway across the horizon towards the east.

When to look: 8.30pm, mid-June.

Which direction to look: South.

South Western Australia's Indigenous people lived by six seasons. When the Emu is seen high in the sky, it indicates weather is changing and getting colder and wetter. This season is called Makuru and was a time to move inland for sheltered locations. Campfires formed the heart of communities, providing warmth and a place to gather for music and storytelling.

Another beautiful cosmic view to enjoy will be on the 22nd June when Mars, Venus and the Moon make a close approach together. The three celestial objects will form an almost perfect equilateral triangle in the western sky. The evening star Venus, the red planet Mars and the lovely thin slither of the Moon will make a spectacular site in the twilight sky.

When to look: Sunset to 8.00pm on the 22nd June. Which direction to look: North west.




THE DAY I BOGGED THE UTE






Proposed Outbuilding (Storage Shed)



The Albert Facey Homestead Committee oversaw the relocation of the Homestead and have continued to hold meetings for the running, maintenance and upkeep of the Homestead.



Cheesy corn muffins

Ingredients:

2 1/2 cups SR Flour

2 spring onions – sauteed with bacon

1 carrot grated

½ cup grated cheese + extra for topping

2-3 strips Bacon, finely chopped

420g tin creamed corn

1 cup milk

3 tablespoons oil

3 eggs



Method:

Combine SR flour, spring onions, carrot, cheese and corn.

In a small bowl lightly beat egg, milk and oil.

Make a well in centre of SR mix and pour in milk and egg mixture. Stir well.

Put in muffin trays, put cheese on top.

Cook at 2000 for 25 - 30 minutes.

Sweet potato and feta muffins

Ingredients:

1 1/2 cups SR flour

1 tsp baking powder

1 cup rolled oats

1 tbsp brown sugar

1/3 cup olive oil

1 1/4 cups plain yoghurt

2 eggs

250g sweet potato, peeled, coarsely grated

2 tbsp chopped fresh chives

100g Persian feta, crumbled

2 tbsp LSA

2 tbsp pepitas

20g butter, chilled, chopped

Method:

Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan forced. Line twelve 80ml (1/2 cup) muffin pans with paper cases. Sift the flour into a bowl. Add the baking powder, 3/4 cup oats and 2 teaspoons brown sugar. Stir to combine. Make a well in the centre. Add the oil, yoghurt, eggs, sweet potato, chives and 60g of the feta. Stir until just combined. Divide among the prepared cases.

Combine remaining oats, sugar and feta in a small bowl. Add the LSA, pepitas and butter and rub with your fingertips until combined. Divide mixture over muffins. Bake for 30-35 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre of a muffin comes out clean and the muffins are golden. Serve warm or cold.

Blueberry cream cheese muffins

Ingredients:

2 1/4 cups SR flour, sifted

1/2 cup caster sugar

100g butter, melted, cooled

2/3 cup milk

2 eggs, lightly whisked

1 tsp vanilla extract

150g fresh or frozen blueberries

60g cream cheese, cut into 12 cubes

1 1/2 tbsp blueberry jam

Method:

Preheat oven to 200°C. Lightly grease a 12-hole 1/2-cup capacity muffin pan.

Combine flour and sugar in a bowl. Make a well in the centre. Whisk butter, milk, egg, and vanilla in a jug. Pour into well. Add blueberries and gently fold until just combined. Half fill muffin holes with mixture. Top each muffin with a cream cheese cube and 1/2 teaspoon jam and cover with remaining mixture. Bake muffins for 15 to 20 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the top half of muffins comes out clean. Stand in pan for 5 minutes. Turn muffins onto a wire rack to cool slightly. Serve warm.

Garden Snippets...



...Bizarre Bulbs

The bizarre and spectacular Paintbrush Lily – Haemanthus coccineus – bursts forth with an unusual flower cluster that resembles a big, red shaving brush. This hard-to-find exotic South African bulb is related to the Amaryllis and Crinum. Just the oversized, tongue-shaped leaves alone make this plant worth growing! They can reach up to 20 inches long and 6 inches wide, and usually have attractive red markings underneath. The flower stems also have beautiful red markings.

Haemanthus coccineus usually grows in winter and spring, and goes dormant for the summer.

In late summer the bare flower stalk emerges from a split in the top of the large flattened bulb, just before the leaves, similar to Amaryllis belladonna. It grows 6-15 inches tall, and usually has reddish, leopard-spot markings along the lower half. The scarlet bracts open to reveal dozens of golden anthers.

Following the flower, 2 (sometimes 3) fleshy leaves appear from the bulb head.

Eventually the bulb multiplies into an impressive colony of plants, but even if you only grow a single plant in a pot - it is a real eye opener!

How to grow: During summer dormancy, leave the bulb in the ground or pot, but don't water it until the growth pattern starts, after which it should only be watered if the winter is very dry of normal rainfall. Do not let the ground get soggy, otherwise bulbs will rot away.

Where to grow: These bulbs will grow well in both filtered sun or morning sun, but the leaves will grow largest in a shadier position. In warmer climates some protection from hot afternoon sun is a good idea. These bulbs are very long living, so permanent positions in the garden bed, at the base of a tree, or in large pots are all ideal as long as the soil is free draining and not water-logged.

If grown in pots then make sure the soil is free draining by adding some perlite, gravel stones or bark into the potting mix to make more chunky.

Fertiliser: Very little, if any, fertiliser is needed.

Propagation: Is very easily done by division of the small pups which grow alongside the larger bulbs. Just divide them off the mothers carefully and re-pot them into their own pots. Division can be done every 5-6 years which will improve the growth of the bulbs.

Propagation is also possible from freshly collected seed that is sown directly after collection.

Other Haemanthus species: Includes H. albiflos which has smaller, furry leaves and white paintbrush flowers with yellow stamens, followed by red fruit or berries that can be collected for propagation. It is a lot smaller than H. coccineus and prefers a more shadier site either in pots or in a free-draining garden bed. H. carneus (pink flower), H. barkerae and H. humilis are also available, but are a bit harder to obtain.

Somewhere out there, someone knows exactly why a woman has died. And in this deep, dark wilderness, there's a killer on the trail . . .


Adult Fiction The Half Brother - Christine Kieighery


The bonds of sisterhood were unbreakable. Until him.



Non-Fiction Women and Whitlam - Michelle Arrow

The Whitlam government transformed Australia. And yet the scope and scale of the reforms for Australian women are often overlooked.

The Whitlam government of 1972-75 appointed a women's advisor to national government - a world first - and reopened the equal pay case. It extended the minimum wage for women, introduced the single mother's benefit and paid maternity leave in the public service, ensured cheap and accessible contraception, funded women's refuges and women's health centres, introduced accessible, no-fault divorce and the Family Court, and much more.

Women and Whitlam brings together three generations - including Elizabeth Evatt, Eva Cox, Patricia Amphlett, Elizabeth Reid, Tanya Plibersek, Heidi Norman, Blair Williams and Ranuka Tandan - to revisit the Whitlam revolution and to build on it for the future.



COVID-19 and Free RAT Tests


