



COUNCIL NOTES



26 JUNE 2023

Annual Report and Annual General Meeting of Electors

Council received the Annual Report at a Special Council Meeting held on 15 June 2023. The Auditor's congratulated Shire officers on the quality of the financial statements. The date of the Annual General Meeting of Electors was also set at this meeting. To comply with legislative requirements the meeting has been set for 10:00am Friday 30 June 2023 at the Shire of Wickepin Administration Office.

Fees and Charges 2023-2024

Each year Council is required to consider the level of imposition of fees and charges for any good or services it provides. Council has agreed to increase fees and charges by approximately 5% for the 2023-2024 noting this is likely to be lower than the actual cost of providing the goods or services. Entry fees for the Wickepin Swimming Pool will remain the same as last summer to continue to encourage the high level of patronage this facility enjoys.

District Fire Break Notice Approval 2023-2024

Council recently endorsed the 2023-2024 Fire Break Notice which includes modification to recent years. Fire Control Officers recommended a change to the notice, which was endorsed by Council, for the need to ensure firefighting equipment is present when engaging in stubble crunching. Additionally, the penalty for failing to keep townsite properties cleared and maintained free of all debris or inflammable material has increased to \$5,000, which is in line with legislative changes.

Appointment of Bush Fire Related Officers 2023-2024

Each year Council appoints Bush Fire Related Officers for the District. Mr Trevor Leeson has been appointed as the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer and Mr Luke Lansdell to the role of Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officer. A full list of Fire Control Officers and other Bush Fire Related Officers will be posted at a later date closer to bush fire season.

Slow cooker recipes

Slow-cooker beef rogan josh

Ingredients:

1 tbsp olive oil

1 brown onion, sliced

1/3 cup rogan josh curry paste

600g diced gravy beef

2 medium potatoes, peeled, cut into 2cm pieces

1 large carrot, peeled, cut into 1cm-thick slices

1 cup Massel beef stock

270ml can Coles Coconut Milk

2 tbsp brown sugar


1 tbsp fish sauce

1 tbsp lime juice

1 cinnamon stick

Fresh coriander leaves, to serve Roasted unsalted peanuts, to serve

Cooked brown rice, to serve



Method:

Heat oil in a large frying pan over medium heat. Add onion. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until softened. Add curry paste. Cook, stirring, for 30 seconds or until fragrant. Add beef to pan. Cook, stirring, until just browned. Transfer mixture to bowl of a 5.5-litre slow cooker.

Add potato, carrot, stock, coconut milk, sugar, fish sauce, lime juice and cinnamon stick. Stir to combine. Cover. Cook on low for 5 hours or until beef and vegetables are tender.

Remove and discard cinnamon stick. Cook, uncovered, for a further 30 to 45 minutes or until sauce thickens. Sprinkle with coriander and peanuts. Serve with rice.

Hearty slow cooker lamb casserole

Ingredients:

Olive oil spray

1kg diced lamb

2 brown onions

2-3 cloves garlic, chopped

1 cup red wine

1 cup boiling water

2 tbsp tomato paste

3/4 cup pearl barley

4 large potatoes, cut into 4 or 8, depending on size

1 large sweet potato, cut into 2cm cubes

1 tbsp Massel chicken style stock powder

1 tsp dried oregano

1 tsp dried rosemary

2 bay leaves

Salt and pepper, to taste

Method:

Spray your slow cooker with spray oil.

Place all ingredients in the slow cooker. Cook on HIGH for 1 hour.

Turn down to LOW and cook for further 5-6 hours, stirring occasionally.

Slow cooker pulled Mongolian lamb

Ingredients:

1 tbs vegetable oil

1 brown onion, chopped

2 garlic cloves, crushed

2 tsp finely grated fresh ginger

½ tsp Chinese five spice

80ml (1/3 cup) hoisin sauce

60ml (1/4 cup) soy sauce



60ml (1/4 cup) Shaoxing wine 2kg lamb shoulder (on the bone)

2 tsp sesame oil

Steamed rice, to serve


Broccolini, to serve

Method:

Heat vegetable oil in a frying pan over medium heat. Add onion. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until soft. Add the garlic and ginger. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute. Stir through the five spice, hoisin, soy and wine. Place the lamb into the slow cooker. Add onion mixture. Cover and cook on Low, turning lamb halfway through, for 8 hours or until tender.

Carefully transfer the lamb to a chopping board. Trim fat then pull the meat off the bone. Shred with a fork or leave in chunks, if you like. Use a lade to skim the fat from the surface of the sauce in the slow cooker. Return the meat to the slow cooker. Stir through the sesame oil. Top with shallot. Divide among serving bowls. Serve with rice and broccolini.

Garden Snippets....



Cymbidium Orchids....

Orchids are among the most beautiful and unusual flowers in the world. Cymbidiums are natives of Northern India, South East Asia and Australia. They grow in moderate climates, so similar to those in which we humans feel most comfortable. They can be grown in pots using very coarse, free draining potting mix, and in the garden bed — also by ensuring soil is free-draining and friable.

Growing Conditions: Cymbidiums require at least 50% of light. They will do well outdoors under trees where there is filtered light to moderate shade. Insufficient light will result in minimal flowering, yet direct sunlight will burn the foliage.

Very good air circulation is most important as it reduces fungi and bacterial problems. If the orchids are in pots, keep the pots off the ground by placing them on bricks, as this assists in air circulation and drainage, and also prevents grubs and snails from breaking down the potting mix or eating the plant. If orchids are in the ground, then incorporate chunky bark, coal or the like into the ground to promote free-drainage soil.


All Orchids must be protected from direct strong, direct winds.

Watering: Vary your watering according to climatic conditions. Cymbidiums like to be kept Moist, but Not Wet. During mid-Spring to early-Autumn, watering in the evening is preferable. In late Autumn, Winter and early-Spring, watering in the morning is best. Water about once a week in cooler times, with every other day - or every day watering - during hot weather.

Flowering: Cymbidiums can flower for up to 8 to 12 weeks each year. When the flower sheath swells and the buds emerge, bring the plant out of the weather (if in pots) and keep the flowers dry to prevent bruising.

Repotting: When the plant grows over the side of the pot, remove the plant and, if necessary, divide it. Always have three bulbs – the lead bulb and two bulbs behind it in a clump. If this is not possible, do not divide the plant, just repot it as is into a larger container. Use a specialised Orchid potting mix and put charcoal, polystyrene or bark into the bottom of the pot to assist with drainage. Place the plant into the container with the oldest bulbs at the edge of the pot and the new growth in the middle. The plant should be at the top of the mixture, not buried in it. Place a stake into the pot and tie the plant loosely to it for support. The best time to repot is in Spring or after flowering.

Fertilising and Pest Control: Feed regularly to promote healthy growing and boost flowering with liquid potash prior to flower bud development. Scale, Thrips and Red Spider Mite can be deterred with periodic spraying of Malathion and White Oil Spray, whilst pellets will control slugs and snails.


Adult Fiction For You and Only You - Caroline Kepnes
