


The clubhouse was "abuzz" with laughter and song with everyone enjoying a few drinks, great food, live music and good company.



Retailers must act honestly on extended warranties

It's a familiar scenario for many shoppers – you're about to pay for a new car or appliance, then the salesperson tries to 'upsell' you with an extended warranty for things that may go wrong after the manufacturer's warranty expires.

As the end of financial year sales roll around, we want consumers to seriously question whether buying this type of insurance policy means paying for rights they already have for free under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL).

These rights require retailers to help you if a product breaks within a reasonable period of time, regardless of any extended warranty purchased or if the manufacturer's warranty has lapsed.

In the last 12 months, Consumer Protection has received 420 enquiries and 113 complaints about extended warranties, mostly relating to the purchase of motor vehicles. We also heard from consumers who encountered issues after buying extended warranties on washing machines & dryers, televisions, microwaves, furniture, and even on an air-con remote controller.

The main issues involved consumers being unable to seek a satisfactory remedy after a fault developed, or unaware their particular issue wasn't covered under the policy.

A recent investigation by consumer advocacy group CHOICE found 91 per cent of major electrical stores visited by a mystery shopper were trying to upsell customers with extended warranties that offered no more for the customers than their rights under the ACL.

Nobody likes wasting money – so next time you're offered an extended warranty in a shop or car dealership, ask the salesperson directly about the benefits over and above your existing rights under the ACL to a refund, replacement or repair if the product is faulty.

Also ask whether the policy has any important exclusions and restrictions, or special requirements to ensure the extended warranty policy remains valid, such as a cleaning regime or regular servicing of a vehicle with the selling dealer.

Failure due to fair wear and tear may not be covered, so consider whether the cost of an extended warranty is worth it compared with the cost of the product and its likely lifespan.

It is against the law for a retailer to mislead you or use unfair tactics to pressure you into buying an extended warranty, so report any instances of this to Consumer Protection via our <u>website</u> at <u>www.consumerprotection.wa.gov.au</u> or email consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au or call 1300 30 40 54.





The following individuals in WA are eligible to receive government-funded vaccine:

- · individuals 65 years or older
- pregnant women (any trimester)
- · Aboriginal people 6 months and older
- individuals with medical conditions that place them at risk for complications of influenza, including:
 - cardiac disease
 - o chronic respiratory conditions
 - o chronic neurological conditions
 - impaired immunity
 - o diabetes and other metabolic disorders
 - o renal disease
 - haematological disorders

Clients who do not fit the criteria for a free Health Department influenza vaccine are encouraged to see their GP or local Pharmacy

She's never sure whether he actually likes her, or if she's just a pawn in one of his twisted games which he enjoys so much.

Scones for these cold frosty mornings

Plain scones

2 cups self-raising flour

2 heaped tablespoons icing sugar

2 dessert spoons of butter

1 egg

milk (to a soft dough)

Sift flour and icing sugar into a bowl, add butter and rub in, then the egg. Mix with a knife and add enough milk to form a soft dough.

Roll onto a floured surface with your hands and use a scone cutter to shape the dough. Put close together on a tray lined with baking paper and cook in a hot oven for 12 minutes. A family recipe

Pumpkin scones

40 g butter, softened

1/4 cup caster sugar

1 egg, beaten lightly

3/4 cup cooked mashed pumpkin

Preheat oven to 240°C Lightly grease two 20cm round cake pans.

Beat butter and sugar in small bowl with electric mixer until light and fluffy; gradually beat in egg.

Transfer mixture to large bowl.

Stir in pumpkin, then dry ingredients and enough milk to make a soft sticky dough. Knead dough quickly and lightly on floured surface until smooth.

Press dough out evenly to 2cm thickness. Dip 5cm round cutter into flour; cut as many rounds as you can from the piece of dough.

Place scones side by side, just touching, in pan. Gently knead scraps of dough together; repeat pressing and cutting out of dough. Place rounds in pan; brush tops with a little extra milk.

Bake scones about 15 minutes.

Date scones

2 cups self-raising flour

2 teaspoons caster sugar

15 g butter

1 cup milk, approximately

1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour

1 cup white self-raising flour

1 cup finely chopped pitted dried dates

Preheat oven to 240°C. Grease 20cm-round sandwich pan or oven tray.

Sift flour and sugar into medium bowl; rub in butter with fingertips. Stir in dates.

Make well in centre of flour mixture; add milk. Using a knife, "cut" the milk through the flour mixture to mix to a soft, sticky dough. Knead dough on floured surface until smooth.

Press dough out evenly to 2cm thickness. Dip 5cm cutter into as many rounds as you can from piece of dough. Place scones side by side, just touching, in pan. Brush tops with a little extra milk.

Bake scones about 15 minutes or until browned.

Tips for scone making-

Don't over knead the dough

Put on a tray close together to help them rise

Pre heat the oven and cook in a hot oven

Best eaten when freshly made
