

COUNCIL NOTES



TEMPORARY ARRANGEMENTS AT WICKEPIN WASTE SITE

In light of the continued fire suppression efforts at the Wickepin Waste Site and the associated risks to public safety, the Wickepin Shire has activated a contingency plan to establish a temporary waste site for use by local residents.

The temporary waste area is situated within the existing waste site boundaries, specifically to the north of the current tipping area. Access to this temporary area remains unchanged, utilizing the same entrance road off the Wickepin Pingelly Road.

To ensure the safety of users, fencing has been installed, restricting access to areas under active fire suppression. It is imperative that individuals do not circumvent the fencing and enter restricted zones within the waste site, as these areas pose a significant danger.

Key Information:

- **Opening Hours:**
 - Saturdays: 7.00 AM to 11.00 AM; 12.00 PM to 4.00 PM
 - Sundays: 7.00 AM to 11.00 AM; 12.00 PM to 4.00 PM
- **Supervised Access:**
 - A supervisor will be onsite to direct waste disposal and ensure public safety.
 - Limited opening hours are necessitated by the associated costs of employing a supervisor.

Conditions of Use/Rules for the Temporary Waste Area:

- All directions given by the supervisor must be fully complied with, including directives on waste disposal. Different areas are designated for various types of waste.
- Waste separation before arrival is required. Specific areas are allocated for steel, timber, mattresses, furniture, and garden waste. Only household waste is permitted in the designated waste cell (pit).
- Tyres cannot be accepted.
- Asbestos cannot be accepted; residents may dispose of asbestos at the Narrogin waste site with prior notice to the Shire of Narrogin (disposal fees apply).
- Access to the temporary waste area is restricted to Shire of Wickepin residents only. Proof of
 - residency, such as a rates notice, driver's license, vehicle registration, or other bona fide evidence, must be presented to the supervisor at the entrance. Non-Shire residents will not be permitted access.



Mango Cheesecake

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup cold water
- 1 tbs gelatine powder
- 125 g plain biscuits
- 75g butter, melted
- 500 g cream cheese softened
- 2/3 cup caster sugar
- 500 g mango diced
- 300 ml thickened cream
- 1 mango sliced *to serve



Method

Grease a 22cm-round (base) springform cake pan. Line side with baking paper, extending paper 1cm above edge of pan.

Place water in a small heatproof jug. Sprinkle over gelatine. Microwave on HIGH (100%) for 20 to 30 seconds or until gelatine is dissolved, stirring halfway through cooking. Set aside to cool.

Meanwhile, process biscuits until fine crumbs. Add butter. Process until combined. Press biscuit mixture over base of prepared pan. Refrigerate while preparing filling.

Wipe processor clean. Process cream cheese, sugar and half the diced mango until smooth and combined. Add cream. Process for 30 seconds or until combined. With motor running, gradually add cooled gelatine mixture, processing until combined. Transfer to a bowl. Fold in remaining diced mango. Pour over prepared base in pan. Refrigerate overnight or until set.

Serve chilled cheesecake topped with sliced mango.

PREMIER DUCKS QUESTIONS ON POWER & TELECOMMUNICATIONS

14th February 2024

Member for Central Wheatbelt Hon Mia Davies MLA has accused the Labor Government of continuing to pass the buck on failures to essential services in the Wheatbelt in the wake of the massive January storms that swept through the region.

In Parliament this week Ms Davies asked the Premier if the Minister for Emergency Services had briefed him on the unacceptable risk to lives and communities as a result of the telecommunications failures and lack of access to triple zero that occurred during the prolonged

She also pressed the Premier on when more standalone power systems would be deployed to the Wheatbelt to prevent ongoing outages across the region.

"The Premier's response was wholly unsatisfactory, saying there would be yet another review and more conversation with telecommunications companies," Ms Davies said.

"He also made sweeping statements about the Government's program of delivering standalone systems across the State, ignoring the question of when more would be delivered to the Wheatbelt.

"There are communities that have been advocating for alternative power solutions in the electorate who have met brick wall after brick wall and it's simply not good enough."

The Premier refused to acknowledge if action to remedy the power and telecommunications issue had ground to a halt under the State and Federal Labor Governments.

"When asked to confirm that improving the resilience of regional telecommunications networks should be a priority but that nothing had changed under this state or federal Labor Government despite recommendations from multiple bushfire reviews, including the recent Corrigin-Wickepin bushfires, he avoided the question," Ms Davies said.

"His undertaking was merely to continue working with the Commonwealth to ensure that we have a much more resilient telecommunications system in the context of bushfire or power outage events."

Ms Davies said she would be holding the Premier to his word and asking for regular updates on progress to deploy improved power solutions for the region, along with greater resilience across the telecommunications network.

"People living in regional WA deserve a Government that cares about basic and essential infrastructure and services," she said.

"With a massive budget surplus it's not too much to expect reliable power, water and mobile communications."

Narrogin Hospital Rehab Service helping people to achieve their goals

After sustaining a fall and a fractured ankle Karen was transferred to the Narrogin Health Service Inpatient Subacute Service from a Perth tertiary hospital for ongoing rehab. "This service allows patients to receive the care they need close to home without the extended stay in Metro sites" reports Subacute Coordinator Stacy Forrest.

During her stay, Karen worked closely with the allied health team to ensure she meet all of her goals before discharging home stating the team "Were professional and included me in all decisions relating to my ongoing treatment. They always kept me updated regarding my progress". One of her highlights during the stay was the daily Physiotherapy sessions "as I never felt that I was being pushed too hard, but at the same time, I noticed how well my strength progressed at each session" reports Karen.

On reflection of her time in the Subacute Service Karen reports "I have no hesitation in recommending this program to others. In fact, without it, I feel that I would have been very disadvantaged in my recovery" and "everything about my experience with the service was positive."

Operating since July 2020, the Narrogin Inpatient Subacute Service has been able to assist over 95 patients in a setting close to home. "Having family and friends able to visit can really help to improve mood and engagement in therapy. Being closer to support networks and familiar surroundings often leads to greater functional outcomes" says Stacy.



How to save over \$1,000 on your fuel bill

We know every dollar counts to Western Australian families right now. I want to share the news that savvy motorists could save more than \$1,200 a year by using the FuelWatch website to shop around before they fill-up.

Independent retailers dominated the top cheapest outlets across WA in 2023. Selling the cheapest fuel in the South West region was Liberty Dalyellup, with an average ULP price of 177.3 cents per litre (cpl). In the Peel region it was Liberty Pinjarra with the cheapest at 172.4 cpl and in the Wheatbelt Burk Williams came in cheapest at 179.8 cpl average.

For those who travel to Perth, FuelWatch data has also revealed independent retailers Vibe, Atlas Fuel, FastFuel 24/7 and Liberty outlets occupied all spots in the top ten of cheapest non-membership outlets across the Perth metropolitan area.

Costco outlets at Perth Airport and Casuarina topped the cheapest list overall, but an annual membership is required to access these sites.

The overall average ULP price in WA last year was 187.4 cpl and for diesel we saw an average of 203.3 cpl. When it comes to diesel, we found country areas often pay less than Perth motorists due to competition. But it's always worth shopping around by using the FuelWatch service.

Long gone are the days of not knowing if the cheap fuel you saw on the way to work will be the same price on the way home. The '24-Hour-Rule', established over 20 years ago, means retailers must tell Consumer Protection by 2pm each day what their fuel price will be for the following day. They must keep that price unchanged for 24 hours from 6am the following day making FuelWatch the only service in Australia that gives you the opportunity to access tomorrow's fuel prices today.

When FuelWatch was introduced in 2001, it also required WA regional fuel retailers to display their prices on visible price boards. This is another way FuelWatch continues to help WA motorists by making sure there are no surprises when they get to the bowser.

We are currently in a weekly petrol price cycle, with Tuesday being the cheapest day to fill up but there are always bargains to be found. It's worth noting, diesel does not follow a price cycle.

It takes less than 30 seconds to check out the FuelWatch website at www.fuelwatch.wa.gov.au to find the best deal near you, it's also worth considering signing up for personalised alerts or you can access FuelWatch through the State Government's ServiceWA app.





In 2023 the P&C raised \$8666.40 and contributed \$9555.14 to the school which helped pay for; the tech students use every day, a small camp contribution per child, funds to help run the school swimming & athletic carnivals plus an annual book award to name a few.

MINING ON PINJARRA/WILLIAMS ROAD

I live in Quindanning and am a member of a group called LEAP which stands for Locals for Environmental Action and Protection, and am very concerned about the mining of the Quindanning Timber Reserve (QTR) which is the home of the endangered Quindanning Spider Orchid. (Caladenia Hopperiana). It is also the eastern edge of the Northen Jarrah Forrest. The Jarrah Tree is endemic to south west, Western Australia, it becomes wandoo country as you travel further east. It is also home to The Forest Red Tailed Black Cockatoo, Chuditch, Red Tailed Phascogale all classed as vulnerable. Brush Tailed Phascogale classed as conservation dependent. Baudin's Black Cockatoo, Camaby's Black Cockatoo, Numbat, Woylies all classed as endangered. South West Barking Owl, South West Masked Owl classed as priority three. Quenda, Tamar Wallaby, Western Brush Wallaby, Western False Pipistrelle, Water Rat classed as priority four.

As the Pinjarra/Williams road is a very busy through way for people travelling from south and south east of Williams through to Mandurah, Kwinana, Rockingham and Fremantle, I wish to make you aware that although South 32 have permission to mine some of the QTR, they are seeking permission from the government to extend their mining footprint. The expansion will cross Albany Highway and continue up to Brookton. At this time they are in the middle of constructing an overpass for their haul trucks and mining equipment to reach the tree QTR on the eastern side of the Pinjarra/Williams Road. The clearing you can see now is for the overpass and haul roads. When they start mining the visual pollution and destruction will be much worse.

South 32 also wish to increase their water allowance from 500 mega litres (500,000,000 litres) to 900 mega litres (900,000,000 litres) a year, to primarily spray on roads for dust suppression. To fulfill this they wish to put more bores down in the QTR. As climate change is such a high item in all our minds and we cannot survive without water this scares me enormously.


In the Worsley Mine Expansion (Revised Proposal environmental review document, June 2022, they measure visual pollution by how long it takes to pass an area of concern. If it takes five seconds to pass a visual pollution site then they class that as very low impact because it is in our sight for such a short time. Apparently they feel we won't remember the impact as it is so quick. Goldfish swimming in a bowl pops into my mind.

This mining company is causing distress and despair to our community. They do not have social license to destroy the forrest.
