#### YEALERING, HARRISMITH & TINCURRIN LANDFILLS

The Yealering, Harrismith, and Tincurrin landfills are now locked on the weekdays and open 4pm Fridays for the weekend and will close at 8am on Mondays. The Shire of Wickepin will then transition to fully staffed landfills, including Wickepin landfill, later in 2024. Further details including set times will be provided closer to the time of the permanent transition.

#### TEMPORARY ARRANGEMENTS AT WICKEPIN WASTE SITE

The temporary waste area is situated within the existing waste site boundaries, specifically to the north of the current tipping area. Access to this temporary area remains unchanged, utilizing the same entrance road off the Wickepin Pingelly Road.

#### Conditions of Use/Rules for the Temporary Waste Area:

- All directions given by the supervisor must be fully complied with, including directives on waste disposal. Different areas are designated for various types of waste.
- · Waste separation before arrival is required. Specific areas are allocated for steel, timber, mattresses, furniture, and garden waste. Only household waste is permitted in the designated waste cell (pit). Tyres cannot be accepted. Asbestos cannot be accepted; residents may dispose of asbestos at the Narrogin waste site with prior notice to the Shire of Narrogin (disposal fees

apply). Access to the temporary waste area is restricted to Shire of Wickepin residents only. Proof of residency, such as a rates notice, driver's license, vehicle registration, or other bona fide evidence, must be presented to the supervisor at the entrance.

Non-Shire residents will not be permitted access.

## Plants for Free....

Plants for Free by Cutting or Division can be done at any time of the year, depending on the plant you are working with.

In a Nutshell, It's not that hard to do.

1. Water your "Mother" plant the day before if possible

#### For Cuttings:

- 2. Select strong, disease free stems and each cutting should be long enough to have one "Node" above the ground and at least one, preferably more, "Nodes" below the ground when potted. (A "Node" is the growing point from where leaves and shoots originate)
- 3. Trim the top of the cutting to "just above a node" and trim the base to "just below a node".
- 4. Gently strip the cutting of leaves from lower half, and if the top leaves are large, then cut them in half to prevent moisture loss and force energy to the bottom to form roots.
- 5. Dunk cuttings in a very weak solution of vinegar or bleach for 10-20 minutes before planting to kill fungal spores and reduce infections.
- 6. Dip base in honey or hormone powder to encourage faster root development.
- 7. Plant in pot with potting mix, using a stick to make a hole, thus preventing wounds (and infections) to the cutting by just "pushing" it in.
- 8. Water in and cover with plastic bag, or a plastic water bottle with the neck cut off. This prevents drying out whilst the roots develop.
- 9. Watering should not be needed as long as mix stays "just moist". New growth should appear from 4-8 weeks (some take longer), when you can open the bag to reduce humidity and "harden off" your new plant, ready for Potting On into a bigger pot, or into your garden.

#### For Divisions:

Using a small spade or hand trowel, dig into the root zone of the mother plant and extract a clump. Lift and trim the foliage to about half, the re-plant and water in well.

If you are dividing a tuber or bulb from a potted plant, then tip the whole lot out of the pot and divide accordingly, then re-pot, trim leaves to half and water well. A great way of expanding your garden is to take "cuttings" or "divisions" from the shrubbery and bulbs you already have growing as you are pruning or tidying your garden.

Some shrubs to try propagating by cutting are (but not limited to): Escallonia, Diosma, Lavendar, Rock Rose, Geranium, Pelargonium, Duranta, Bottlebrush, Grevillea. By "division" of clumps of roots, many garden plants can be spread around to fill empty spots. Salvia, Iris, Clivea, Bromeliads, Cacti, English daisy and others can all be "divided" and re-planted in garden beds or pots.

For those of my generation who do not, and cannot comprehend why Facebook exists. I am trying to make friends outside Facebook while applying the same principles. Therefore, every day I walk down the street and tell passers by what I have eaten, how I feel at the moment, what I did the night before, what I will do later and with whom, I give them pictures of my family, my dog, and me doing the gardening, taking things apart in the garage, water the lawn, standing in front on landmarks, driving around town, having lunch and doing what anybody and everybody does everyday. I also listen to their conversations give them the "thumbs up" and tell them I "like them" and if it works for Facebook I already have four people following me. Two police officers, a private investigator and a psychiatrist.

#### STAYING IN PLACE EXPO - PINGELLY 8/9 MAY 2024

I attended along with Wickepin CRC Representatives Lauren & Zen the 2 day EXPO held at Pingelly Rec Centre. This event was attended by a packed house of over 170 representatives made up of local, State & Interstate attendees.

The event was opened by Pingelly Council President Jackie Mc Burney after Welcome To Country by local Indigenous representative Malcolm Jetta.

We then saw Keynote Speakers Prof Loretta Baldassar, ECU -Social Ageing amongst many "hats" she wears, address the large gathering then field many questions.

Over the next 2 days, there were breakout sessions covering the various facets of aged care from the perspective of that looking like, staying at home to receive rather than leaving home, loved ones etc & moving to Aged facilities.

The Pingelly CRC through in particular Helen Morton & Lee Steel have moved from almost 3 years ago establishing the Staying in Place program and Virtual Village with a "one off" funding to the present Mable. Mable is a play on words...I'm Able, becoming Mable. Mable to stay home. Mable seeks to provide a network of local resident/contractors to provide services enabling those within the community with special needs such as chopping wood, cleaning gutters, Getting to medical appointments, preparing meals etc to receive that without ever worrying about leaving their homes.

Wickepin CRC is now running the Staying in Place program in partnership with InCasa and Mable. It is early stages. Friday 10<sup>th</sup> May saw General Manager InCasa, Misty Morton, attend the Wickepin CRC in a follow up to the 2 day EXPO. I was thrilled to see 12 interested locals attend. Of these for several reasons, only one had or presently needed intervention. (I feel the next meeting may need to be held elsewhere as CRC venue is now being outgrown!)

Misty, amongst much sharing of information pointed out that although the first step to obtaining a "Aged care package" in rough terms identifying Levels of help from 1-4, taking several weeks, the wait time for funding these packages, mostly through bureaucracy has blown from 5 to 18 months. Her message is clear...if you feel you do or have expectations of needing help to Stay in Place then come see Lauren at our local CRC. Get the process under way.

In conclusion, Walpole has been in Mable for just 12 months. In that time, they have 23 Clients & 38 local Providers. First year alone, the services brought in almost \$500,000 money into the town, most of which previously would have gone to pay external contractors. Consider the return to Pingelly with over 70 using the services of locals. Another, Jurian Bay, also newly established already has 22 on program with 27 on waiting list.

I hope we in our area will embrace this opportunity and see those who have put so much into their community stay in their community.

# Hearty vegetable soup

#### Ingredients (12)

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 brown onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 4 shortcut rindless bacon rashers, chopped
- 1 zucchini, chopped
- 1 carrot, peeled, chopped
- 3 celery stalks, trimmed, chopped
- 1/2 (600g) cauliflower, cut into small florets
- 400g can diced tomatoes
- 1 litre beef liquid stock
- 1 cup dried mini penne pasta
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh basil leaves



#### Method

**Step 1** Heat olive oil in a saucepan over medium-high heat. Add brown onion, 2 garlic cloves, and 4 shortcut rindless bacon rashers. Cook, stirring, for 3 to 5 minutes or until bacon is golden. Add zucchini, carrot, celery stalks and cauliflower. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 5 minutes or until vegetables start to brown.

Step 2

Add can diced tomatoes, beef style liquid stock and 2 cups cold water. Cover. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Simmer for 20 to 25 minutes or until vegetables are just tender. Add 1 cup dried mini penne pasta. Season with salt and pepper. Simmer, uncovered, for 10 minutes or until pasta is tender. Stir in 1/4 cup chopped fresh basil leaves. Serve.



Garlic bread is a warm and aromatic side dish that adds a delicious flavour boost to vegetable soup. Toast slices of bread with butter and minced garlic, and serve alongside your soup for a scrumptious pairing.


National Walk Safely To School Day - Friday 10 May 2024



# FACEY GROUP UPDATE

The Facey Group AgREC team have been busy making the most of having a small plot seeder in-house and have started seeding our trials! As the team get familiar with their new piece of machinery, we would like to thank everyone who has given us guidance and wisdom on how to get the most out of it. The first trial sown this year with the small plot seeder, was the Time of Sowing Project, part of the RiskWi\$e project funded by GRDC. The Time of Sowing project aims to compare the upside reward of early sowing with the downside risk of frost and examine the impact that sowing time also has on exposure to late-season heat stress.

The team have also been out soil sampling and burning in preparation for the sowing

season. Facey Group successfully secured the tender for a GRDC-funded Deep Sown Oats Project. This project is situated on two sites, one in Merredin and one in Wickepin, recently sown with thanks by Living Farm. Collaborating with fellow grower group, Merredin & Districts Farm Improvement Group (MADFIG), the trial aims to better understand the potential of deep sowing stored moisture oats early into opportunities. also This project supported by InterGrain, providing both conventional and emerging seed varieties.
