#### 2024/2025 Annual Budget Notice

At the 21st August 2024 Ordinary Council Meeting, the Council unanimously adopted the 2024/2025 Annual Budget.

The \$5.64 million budget includes \$3.83 million in capital works involving road improvements, community infrastructure and essential plant replacement.

The Shire has continued to be supported by the Commonwealth's Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program by upgrades to roads, Harrismith Playground, Wickepin Community Changerooms and finishing the disabled toilet at the Swimming Pool. In light of the difficult economic conditions and rising inflationary pressures the budget includes a rate yield increase of 5% with the 10% discount to apply if rates are paid in full by the due date 30 September 2024.

Other buildings and facilities to be upgraded/renewed are CCTV, Pump shed roof at Swimming Pool, upgrade of lights at the Wickepin Tennis Club, erect the Toolseum Shed, renew Playgroup Gazebo, Yealering Cemetery Niche wall extension and Yealering Hall minor upgrades.

The Council through the Community Grants Program will be supporting the Wickepin District Sports Club, Wickepin Playgroup, Wickepin Historical Committee and the Harrismith Health Club in the 2024/2025 financial year.

# Lemon Garlic Salmon Tray Bake



#### THE SALMON AND PASTE INGREDIENTS

- **Salmon** 4 fillets of salmon 200g/70z It doesn't matter if it's skinless or skin on.
- **Dijon mustard** 1 tablespoon. This thickens the marinade into a paste that sticks to the salmon
- Garlic 2 garlic cloves grated finely or use minced garlic.
- Lemon Use both the zest and juice.
- Oil Helps give the salmon colour.
- Salt and pepper Fish likes salt! Don't short change yourself.

**Lemon garlic slather –** Mix the lemon, garlic, mustard paste ingredients together then slather onto the surface and side of the salmon.

Marinade for 1 hour if time permits, if not, proceed to the next step.

**Vegetables** - use asparagus and 1 standard punnet of cherry tomatoes because they cook in the same time as the salmon.

Toss the vegetables with olive oil, salt and pepper.

**Prepare tray** – Put the salmon on the tray with a bit of space between each one. Arrange the vegetables around it. Spray the salmon with oil.

**Oven grill -**for 11 minutes or until the salmon is cooked.



**To serve –** Transfer the salmon and vegetables onto plates. Grate parmesan over the vegetables, squeeze lemon over everything. Enjoy.

Happy Father's Day: Give the gift of safety

In 2021, Grandfather Maurice Wayne Matthews died of mechanical asphyxia from being crushed under a car.

He had decided to work on his car that morning but was killed due to the jack becoming unstable on a sloped surface, causing the vehicle to shift.

Repairing a vehicle at home carries the risk of death. While preventable, incidents continue to occur.

Over 100 Australians have died due to DIY car maintenance accidents since 2000, with many more hospitalised for injuries. Most fatalities occur when victims are working under a vehicle or using equipment incorrectly.

Don't let your Father's Day be ruined by a DIY car job gone wrong. Consumer Protection's Product Safety team wants you to protect yourself, your friends and family by using the following tips.

It is important to have multiple safety measures in place. Use a trolley jack to lift the car before lowering it onto vehicle support stands. Make sure these stands are not makeshift, for example don't use blocks of wood or bricks. Also ensure that you don't exceed the weight capacity of the jack.

Never get under a car that is only supported by a jack. Ensure it is sitting securely on support stands or ramps.

Make sure you apply the handbrake properly, and always perform maintenance on steady, level ground, not sand or a sloped surface.







## Create a Colourful Hanging Basket...

With Spring upon us, now is the time to be creative and start putting some instant colour around the garden to chase away the winter dullness. Hanging Baskets full of colour make wonderful focal points in many areas of your garden, and can be hung from wherever you wish to hang one.

The secret to creating a glorious hanging basket is to use trailing plants such as Ivy-leafed pelargonium, Trailing Petunias, Verbena, Swan River Daisies and Fuchias or even fruits such as strawberries — The list is endless.

To create a Stunning flower display, plant into the sides of the basket as well as the top. For quicker results use advanced seedlings.

First, Gather your Supplies. You will need:

- Wire (or plastic) Basket wire is the best choice if you want to plant into the sides to create a "Ball Effect"
- Fibre (or use shadecloth) liner
- Seedlings
- Trowel or scoop

Sharp knife

Potting Mix

Slow-release Fertiliser

#### Here's How:

- 1. Fit liner into the basket and cut slits around the lower portion of the basket. Carefully plant seedlings through the slits by feeding the rootball from the outside and covering with potting mix, part-filling the basket.
- 2. Cut more planting slits around the upper portion of the basket and repeat planting seedlings as above.
- 3. Plant more seedlings around the top. Plant an "upright grower" in the centre and trailing plants around the outer edges.
- 4. Fill in all remaining gaps with potting mix, water in and add some slow release fertiliser. Water again, drain and hang.

A sunny spot is best for hanging, but remember that hanging baskets dry out very quickly so it is best to avoid the hot afternoon sun (and wind if possible) so a "morning to midday sun" position is kinder to your basket of blooms.

Ensure you have a secure hanging point as the baskets can become heavy with growth and

watering.

The most crucial aspect for success is to give your basket regular watering as they can be thirsty creations with so many plants so closely crammed into one container. That, along with slow release fertiliser at planting time should ensure a glorious, colourful result in a short time.
