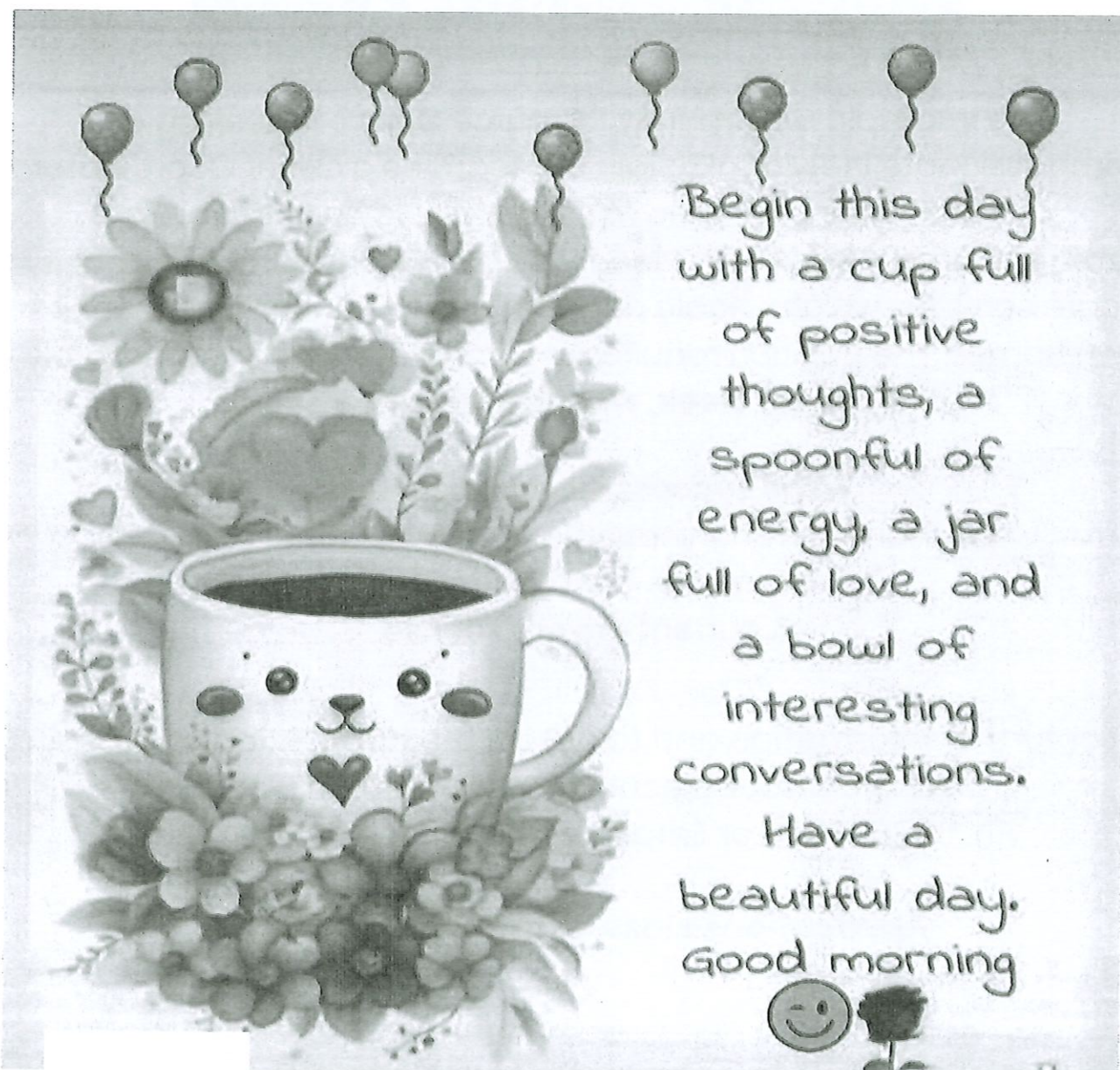

Following the service, community members came together to share a morning tea. Thank you to all who brought a plate and contributed to the sense of connection and remembrance.



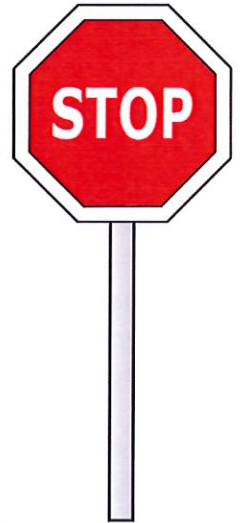


## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO MOTORISTS

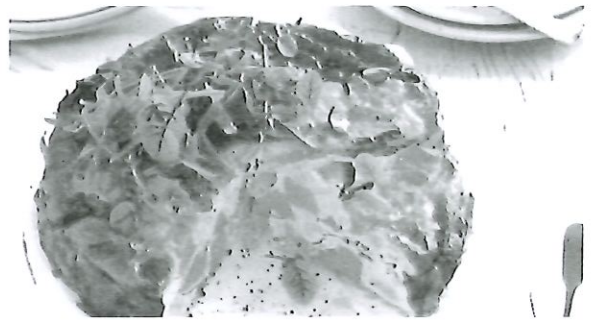




## Cake Tin Frittata

### Ingredients

600g sweet potato, peeled and cut into 2cm diced  
1 red capsicum, cut into 2cm chunks  
1 leek, white part only, cut into 1cm thick slices  
2 tablespoons olive oil  
Salt and pepper  
60g baby spinach leaves  
10 eggs  
375g smooth ricotta  
½ cup (50g) grated parmesan  
1 cup (110g) grated cheese  
1 clove garlic, crushed  
⅓ cup (80ml) thickened cream  
Rocket salad and spicy tomato chutney, to serve



### Method:

1. Preheat oven to 220°C/200°C (fan-forced). Grease and line the base and sides of a round 23cm (base measurement) springform cake tin
2. Combine sweet potato, capsicum and leek in a large roasting pan. Drizzle with olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Bake 30 minutes. Remove from oven. Toss baby spinach through warm vegetables to wilt. Set aside to cool slightly
3. Whisk together eggs and season with salt and pepper. Whisk in ricotta, parmesan, garlic, cream and half the cheese
4. Spoon half the vegetables into prepared pan and pour over half the egg mixture. Repeat with remaining vegetables and egg. Sprinkle with the remaining cheese
5. Reduce oven temperature to 200°C/180°C (fan-forced) and bake for 60-70 minutes. Cover the top with foil if browning too much. Remove from oven when the centre is just a little wobbly. Stand for 10-15 minutes before removing from the tin and serving. Serve with rocket salad and spicy tomato chutney

### Tips & Hints:

- This recipe is a great way to use up leftover vegetables from your roast dinner or clear out the crisper at the end of the week
- Use any vegetables such as potato, pumpkin, zucchini, asparagus and fennel
- Frittata can be made 2 days in advance. Cover and refrigerate. When ready to serve, warm in a low oven covered with foil until warmed through

## Vegan Avocado Cheesecake

### Ingredients

12 (250g) fresh Medjool dates, pitted  
125g pecans, roughly chopped  
1/3 cup shredded coconut  
1/3 cup coconut oil, melted and cooled  
3 avocados  
400ml can coconut milk  
¼ cup maple syrup  
2 large limes, finely grated rind  
(reserve some for decorating) and 1/3 cup juice  
1/3 cup chia seeds  
Fresh raspberries,  
strawberries, lime zest to  
serve



### Method

1. Grease and line base of a 20cm round loose bottom pan with baking paper.
2. Place dates, pecans, coconut and coconut oil in a food processor and pulse until finely chopped. Transfer to prepared pan and press evenly over base of pan. Place in refrigerator.
3. Place avocado, coconut milk, maple syrup, lime rind, lime juice and chia seeds into food processor and process until a smooth mixture forms. Pour over base and spread evenly. Place in refrigerator overnight to set.
4. Remove cheesecake from pan and place on a cake stand. Decorate with fruit and lime zest to serve.

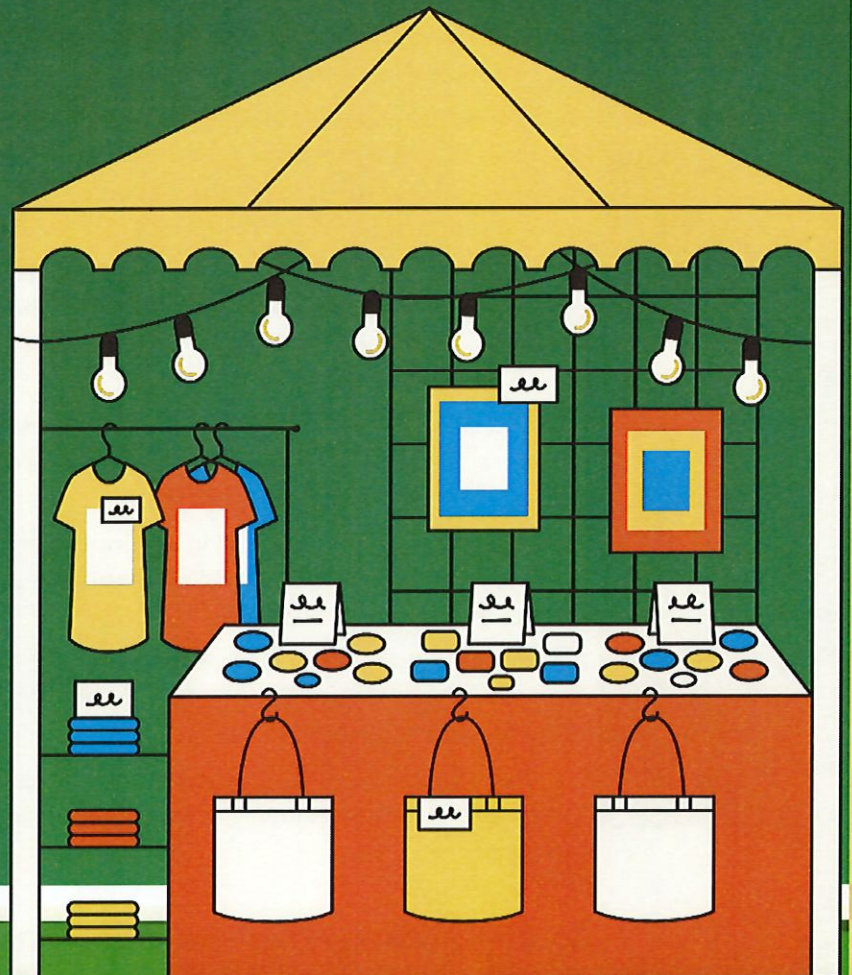

## BLOOD & INK

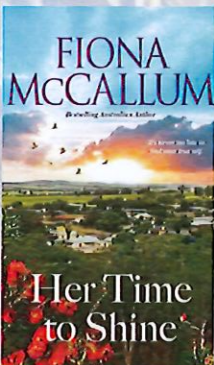


A HEART-STOPPING NEW CRIME NOVEL BY

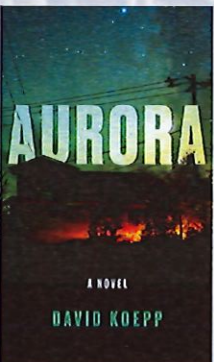


### ADULT AUSTRALIAN FICTION: *Her Time to Shine* - Fiona McCallum

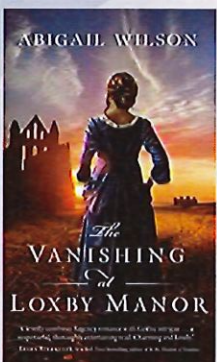
### ADULT THRILLER LARGE PRINT: *Aurora* - David Koeppe

But the complicated history between the siblings is far from over, and what feels like the end of the world is just the beginning of several long-overdue reckonings - which not everyone will survive . . .



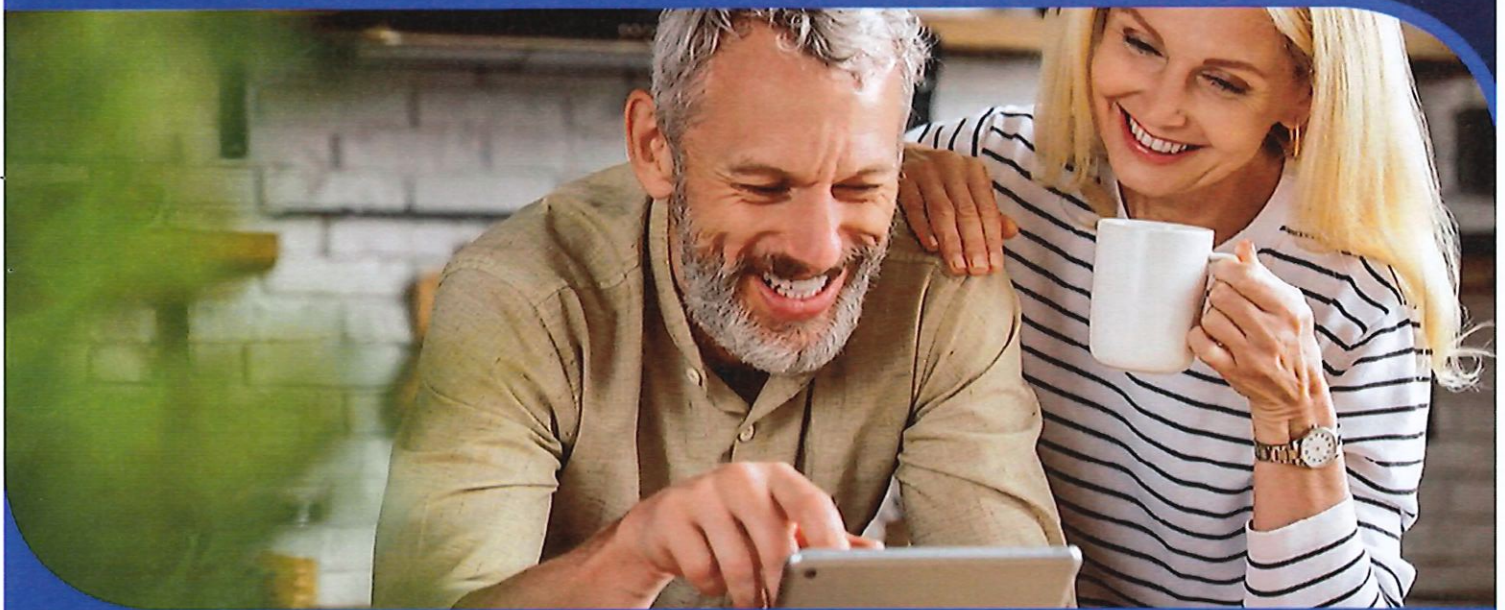
### ADULT HISTORICAL FICTION AUDIO BOOK: *The Vanishing at Loxby Manor* - Abigail Wilson

We had the great honor of attending and participating in the local ANZAC Ceremonies, both at Wickepin Primary on the last day of school, and the Shire event at the memorial. It's great to be part of our community and recognize our fallen and current service people.

Firearms licence holders – If you weren't aware there has been a "follow on" buyback announced effective 14th April covering firearms surrendered from the 17<sup>th</sup> of January this year so if you had surrendered them to Wickepin or other police stations, you can use the report number we provided to fill out compensation forms from the WA POLICE website.

Amounts to be paid into your bank account are also there with a list of FAQ's... we have notified some locals eligible, but in case we missed you, or any questions, please call the hotline on **1300 171 011** or head to the WAPOL Website links. This is ongoing till 14 January 2026, and will be handy if you have firearms you no longer utilize, or may not be able to comply with new requirements, storage, medical etc. Appointments can be made to attend Wickepin when available or Narrogin Police (M-F 8-4) so you don't have to drive around town with guns in the car only to find we're not at the station.

Good news and bad... We recently surprised the owners when we recovered a stolen boat ("High and Dry") following information about suspicious activity again, and were advised of farm equipment and tools being targeted again by opportunistic thieves around less frequented rural outbuilding - It may seem insignificant, but please be vigilant and report suspicious vehicles at the time, and take registration numbers or photos to assist us stopping these crimes – don't take things into your own hands or put yourselves at risk....

## Garden Snippet....



## ...Soda Garden

*Baking soda-Sodium bicarbonate-Bicarb soda-Carb soda – Call it what you will, but it is not only useful for many things in the family household, it is also a gardener's best friend as a helpful tool for various purposes including pest control, plant disease prevention, and soil health. It can be used to deter pests like ants and slugs, prevent fungal diseases of plants, raise soil pH, and even deter weeds. Here are some ways baking soda can be used in the garden:*

**Natural Fungicide:** Mix bicarb soda with water and liquid soap to spray on plants and combat fungal diseases like powdery mildew and black spot.

**Weed Killer:** Directly sprinkle bicarb soda onto garden weeds, or use a solution of bicarb with soap to kill small weeds, to eradicate them without harming surrounding plants.

**Soil Amendment:** DIY Soil Test – To test your soil's pH, add a pinch of bicarb soda to a small amount of soil. If it fizzes, the soil is acidic. Add some bicarb soda to the soil to raise the pH and neutralize the overly acidic soil. This will improve the environment for plant growth and make the soil more suitable for plants that prefer more alkaline conditions.

**Tomato Sweetener:** Sprinkle some bicarb soda around tomato plants to decrease soil acidity, resulting in sweeter tomatoes.

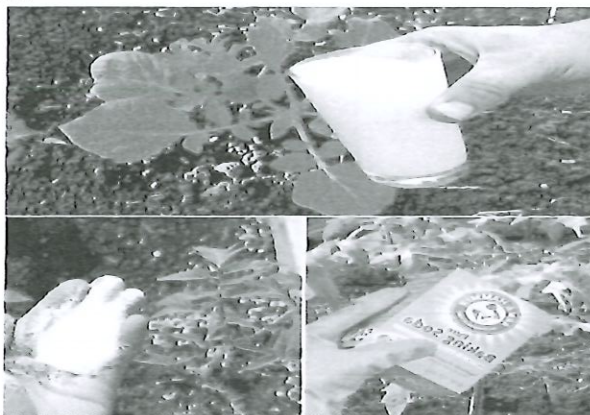
**Compost Enhancer:** Add bicarb soda to the compost pile to speed up the composting process, and improve its quality, by making the environment more alkaline.

**Odor Absorber:** Neutralize odors in areas like compost bins by sprinkling in some bicarb soda.

**Tool Cleaner:** Clean gardening tools by scrubbing them with a bicarb soda paste to remove dirt and rust.

**Seed Germination:** Enhance seed germination by soaking seeds in a bicarb soda solution before planting.

**Ant, Slug & Pest Repellent:** Deter ants and slugs by sprinkling bicarb around the plants or along ant trails to create barriers. A mixture of bicarb soda and flour can deter pests like cabbage worms and aphids when dusted on plants.
