
The She Shed, He Shed





Slow Cooker Creamy Ranch Chicken Breast

Ingredients

- I tbsp olive oil
- 4 medium chicken breast fillets
- 2 middle bacon rashers, cut in thin strips crossways
- I brown onion, finely chopped
- I garlic clove, crushed
- 125ml (1/2 cup) salt-reduced chicken stock
- I tsp onion powder
- Itsp garlic powder
- 65g (1/4 cup) sour cream
- 60ml (1/4 cup) ranch dressing
- 1 tbsp cornflour
- 1 tbsp chopped fresh dill



1 Heat oil in a large non-stick frying pan over medium-high heat. Add chicken and cook, for 3-4 minutes each side, until browned. Add the chicken to a slow cooker.

2 Add bacon to the frying pan Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until golden and crisp Transfer to a plate and set aside Add onion and garlic to the pan and cook, stirring, for 2 minutes or until starting to soften. Stir in chicken stock, onion powder and garlic powder. Bring to the boil. Add to the slow cooker, cover and cook on High for 2 hours (or Low for 4 hours).

3. Meanwhile, whisk sour cream, dressing and cornflour in a small bowl until smooth.

4. Stir the sour cream mixture into the chicken mixture. Cover and cook, for 15 minutes or until thickened. Season. Sprinkle with reserved bacon and dill to serve.

Overnight Carrot and Apple Bircher Ingredients

- 35g (1/3 cup) rolled oats
- · I small carrot, peeled, coarsely grated
- 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- · 1tbsp sunflower seeds
- 70g (1/4 cup) natural yoghurt
- 1/2 small apple sliced
- Maple syrup, to serve (optional)



Combine the oats, carrot, cinnamon, 3 tsp sunflower seeds and 125ml (1/2 cup) water in a bowl. Cover and place in the fridge overnight to soak.


Before serving, top with the yoghurt, apple, remaining sunflower seeds and a drizzle of maple syrup, if you like
