FIREBREAK INSPECTIONS

Fire Hazard Reduction inspections were carried out during the first week of October to ensure that all town properties within the Shire of Wickepin are compliant and free from long grass and other fire hazards ahead of the upcoming Bush Fire Season.

Properties that were identified as potential fire hazards will undergo follow-up inspections during the first week of November to ensure that the required works have been completed and that all properties are properly prepared for the fire season. Please keep in mind that if the necessary fire hazard reductions have not been addressed by this time, infringements of \$250 may be issued.

2025/2026 BUSHFIRE SEASON

Preparing for bushfire season is everyone's responsibility. Our volunteers, Shire staff, and the Department of Fire & Emergency Services work hard to keep us safe. Property readiness is essential for effective emergency response.

Residents in rural areas should understand their bushfire risk and develop a survival plan to protect their families and livelihoods. Consider factors like weather and proximity to emergency services. Communicate your plan with family, employees, and neighbours.



COMMUNITY FIRE SAFETY

It is crucial for our community to take proactive measures to mitigate fire risks. We urge residents to assess their properties, clear flammable materials, and create defensible spaces. Staying informed about local fire regulations and participating in fire safety workshops can greatly enhance our collective safety.

REPORTING A FIRE

To report **ANY** fire whether in a paddock, bush, townsite, house, roadside, etc

YOU MUST RING 000 FIRST.

You will need to provide the location of the fire to the Operator who will then contact our Chief Bush Fire Control Officer who will alert the Fire Control Officers.

Do not ring the Shire Office. This wastes valuable time.

POPPY SEED ANZAC BISCUITS

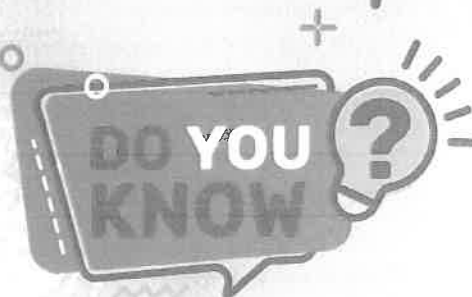
INGREDIENTS:

- 1 CUP ROLLED OATS
- 1 CUP PLAIN FLOUR
- $\frac{3}{4}$ CUP DESICCATED COCONUT
- $\frac{3}{4}$ CUP BROWN SUGAR
- 2 TBSP POPPY SEEDS
- 125G BUTTER
- 2 TBSP GOLDEN SYRUP
- 1 TSP BICARBONATE OF SODA
- 2 TBSP BOILING WATER



METHOD:

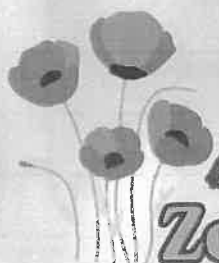
1. PREHEAT OVEN TO 160°C AND LINE BAKING TRAYS WITH PAPER.
2. MIX OATS, FLOUR, COCONUT, SUGAR, AND POPPY SEEDS IN A LARGE BOWL.
3. MELT BUTTER AND GOLDEN SYRUP IN A SMALL SAUCEPAN.
4. STIR BICARB SODA INTO BOILING WATER, THEN ADD TO THE BUTTER MIX.
5. POUR WET MIXTURE INTO DRY INGREDIENTS AND STIR.
6. ROLL INTO SMALL BALLS, FLATTEN SLIGHTLY, AND BAKE FOR 10-12 MINUTES.
7. LET COOL AND SHARE WITH FAMILY WHILE YOU TALK ABOUT WHAT "LEST WE FORGET" MEANS.



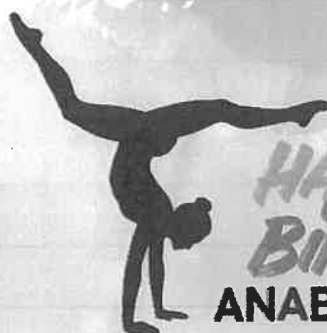

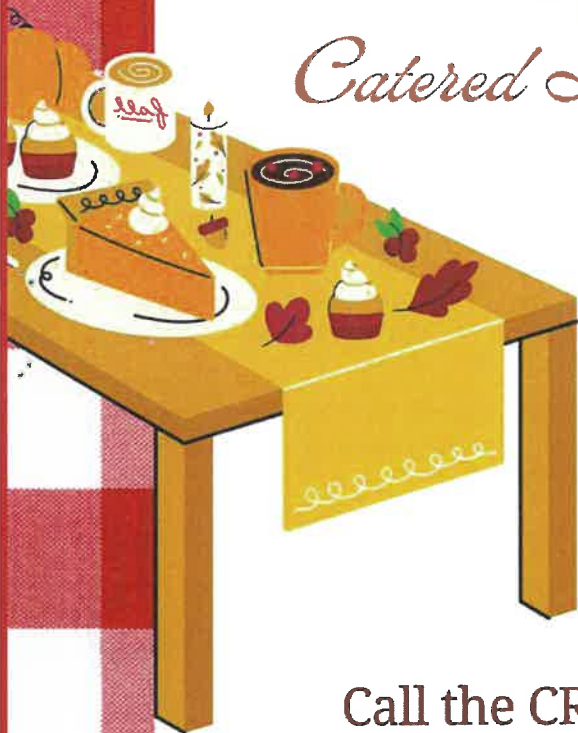

World Kindness Day 13th November 2025

World Kindness Day is celebrated each year on November 13th.

World Kindness Day was first introduced in 1998 by the World Kindness Movement. World Kindness Day is observed in various countries, including the United States, Canada, Japan, Italy, Australia, and the United Arab Emirates.

Ideas and Simple Ways to be Kind

Being kind doesn't need to look or be extravagant. Sometimes the simplest things make the most significant difference! Here are a few simple ideas and ways to be helpful on World Kindness Day in the workplace, at school, with your loved ones, or even while out running errands. Look for opportunities while you go through your day to infuse kindness into someone's day. It'll change their day and yours for the better!

Smile when you walk by others

Write positive messages on post-it notes and leave them for people to find

Call a relative you haven't spoken to in a while

4. Use a heavy or elasticised roller bandage to immobilise the whole limb. Start just above the bite, then wrap until the whole limb is covered. E.g. for a bite on the arm or wrist, start just above the fingers and move upwards on the limb as far as the collar bone.



5. Splint the limb. Include joints on either side of the bite.



6. Keep the person and limb at rest. If it is possible, indicate the site of the bite with a pen on the exterior of the Pressure Immobilisation Bandage and monitor the casualty while you await emergency services.

Get your **premium snake bite bandage**, with indicators that show when the correct level of compression is achieved, from [Fluid First Aid](#) or [First Aid Kits Australia](#), or a [Snake Bite Kit](#) with added dressing, marker pen, and treatment guide.

If you **can't use a pressure immobilisation bandage** because the bite is on the trunk or stomach, apply constant, firm pressure.

Paralysis

If the bite is venomous and the venom manages to travel to the bloodstream, it can have serious consequences on the nerves and respiration muscles which can then cause paralysis.

If a person is unconscious and NOT breathing normally or NOT breathing you must immediately **provide CPR**.

1. Roll them onto their back
2. Check there is nothing in their mouth and the airway is clear
3. Apply 30 compressions
4. Provide 2 breaths
5. Repeat compressions and breaths at a rate of 30:2 until help arrives or the casualty starts breathing

HOW TO PREVENT

During snake season it is important to always be aware of your surroundings and take the appropriate precautions. Snakes generally only bite humans if they are provoked, so steer clear and standstill to avoid aggravating the reptile if sighted.

- Always be aware of your environment
 - Do not try to handle or kill a snake if you are not a professional
 - Wear long pants and covered shoes if walking in bushland, long grass, remote areas or gardening

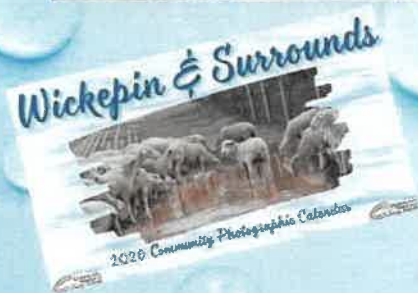

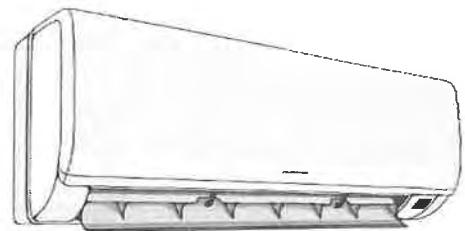
