This season watch out for the new signs at the centre.

The platform at the deep end of the pool has been lowered to comply with the latest ruling,S which considered it too high for a pool depth of only 1.8 metres. In fact, Pool Guidelines state that you shouldn't dive from the side of a pool into water less than 1.8 metres deep.

The gardeners have been busy beautifying the centre with a plantation of bushes and installing a reticulation system around the perimeter of the premises.

There are plans that discussion is underway for choosing some shade trees to be planted in the front car park; that will be another welcome improvement, even if we will have to wait a while to appreciate the full cooling effect and aesthetic pleasure of their foliage!

Don't forget the pool is equipped with a BBQ which everyone is welcome to use.







A word from the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer

With crops and winter grasses now drying off around the Shire, harvest will soon be upon us and the fire season will begin.

Currently we are in a Restricted Burning Period, so outdoor burning is permitted, but only if you have a burning permit. After November 13th, no outdoor burning is permitted in the shire at all, until February 8th 2014.

All firebreaks should be in place now, and looking around the Shire, there are many firebreaks that have fallen short of what would be considered ideal. It has been a difficult year to achieve a permanent grass kill, so well done to those who have managed to put in firebreaks that are up to standard.

There have been some questions raised about 'Harvesting and Vehicle Movement' bans, especially as to what exactly they apply to. Put simply, during a 'Harvest and Vehicle Movement' ban, no vehicle (including trucks and stationery engines) are permitted to be used on any private (or public) land, including farm roads. The only exemption to this Law is for essentially fire units carrying water to provide livestock with drinking water.

All vehicles are however allowed to operate on any registered public road. Your Fire Control Officers will all acknowledge that some aspects of this Law are impractical (such as the need to pick up kids from the school bus), however we ask that you continue to respect our intention of keeping everyone safe and avoid vehicle movements on farmland unless essential.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow Fire Control Officers, Shire staff and our many fire volunteers around the district for the work they have done in preparing for this summer. The good

season we have had will make controlling any fires that do start more difficult, it will be very important to get on to them quickly. I am confident we are as well prepared as we can be, and wish everyone all the best for their harvest.
