

75th Anniversary Commemoration Service of Brave Australian Nurses

It was with enormous pride Anthea Hodgson and Libby Heffernan were flag bearers at a recent service to honour the nurses involved in the Vyner Brook tragedy. They were representing their great Aunt, Sister Minnie Hodgson of Yealering. This service was held at Point Walter in February 12th to remember the 41 nurses who died as a result of the sinking of this boat. The Vyner Brook was a steamer that was used to evacuate 65 nurses and more than 200 patients, women and children at the fall of Singapore in February 1942.

This boat was attacked by Japanese fighters with survivors surrendering once ashore on Banka Island. The Japanese then ordered 22 Australian nurses into the sea, one of which was Minnie, where they were massacred by machine gun with only one nurse surviving to tell the story at the end of the war.


The remaining nurses and many others of mostly Dutch and English nationality were held in women's prisoner camps in appalling conditions with many not surviving.

The Applecross RSL sub branch held the service at the Vyner Brook Memorial at Point Walter and a descendant from many of the nurses laid wreaths in their memory.

Her Excellency the Honourable Kerry Sanderson AC, Governor of Western Australia was the guest speaker during the service. The choir sang 'Largo' with the arrangement as sung by the captives in the women's camp, which was depicted in the movie Paradise Road, and was incredibly moving.

The most poignant moment for the 17 Hodgson descendants who attended, was a quote from Matron Irene Drummond who was on the beach with her nurses as they were ordered into the sea.

"Chin up Girls. I am proud of you and love you all".


None of these existing members has an electoral office outside of Perth or south of Northam. If elected I commit to establishing an office in this area to better service the needs of people in this region.

The Queen's Baton Relay wants you!

Western Australia welcomes the Queen's Baton Relay in lead up to Gold Coast 2018
Commonwealth Games

Western Australia is looking for local legends to carry the Queen's Baton in Western Australia as part of the Queen's Baton Relay (QBR) in the lead up to the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (GC2018).

The Baton will arrive in Western Australia on Thursday 22 February 2018 and will spend six days travelling through 19 communities, highlighting the State's great diversity.

Thousands of people are expected to turn out to cheer the batonbearers on.

Local legends will carry the Queen's Baton from Albany, the departure point for WWI soldiers, north through areas including Manjimup, Bridgetown and Bunbury. After spending time in the metro area, showcasing our iconic coastline and meeting the odd quokka, the Baton will head north to Karratha for its last day on Tuesday 27 February 2018.

"A relay isn't a relay without people, so the Queen's Baton Relay is looking for people of all ages and abilities to run the Baton around our State," says Ron Alexander, Director General of the Department of Sport and Recreation.

"This is your chance to be part of one of the country's biggest community events – and you don't need to be an athlete to be nominated.

"We want people who represent all that's great about our communities: someone who has made a significant contribution to sport, education, the arts, culture, community or a charity.

Mr Alexander said the Relay was a chance to show off the best of Western Australia to the rest of the Commonwealth – from our oceans to the amazing outdoors, places of Aboriginal significance and proud communities which are part of who we are.

"The Baton's journey will also inspire community pride and build excitement for the largest event to be staged in Australia in a decade.

"On a bigger playing field, this is a chance for Australia to inspire and welcome the world: exploring and celebrating the links, traditions and people that connect Australian communities with the Commonwealth."

From today until 15 May 2017, anyone can nominate a person who inspires them to be great. Nominations can be made at gc2018.com/qbr.

GC2018 are looking for Australian citizens or people lawfully entitled to reside in Australia during the Relay period (25 December 2017 -4 April 2018) and one of the following:

- Have achieved something extraordinary or inspired others to achieve something
 extraordinary.
- Have made a significant contribution to sport, education, the arts, culture, charity or within their community.
- Have excelled or aspire to excel athletically or personally.
- Contribute to a fun, friendly, vibrant and inclusive community.
- Are at least 10 years old as at 25 December 2017.

Across Australia approximately 3,800 batonbearers are needed to share the dream of the friendly Games.

The Queen's Baton will travel through Australia for 100 days from 25 December 2017.

The Queen's message is held in the Baton and will be read aloud at the Opening Ceremony on 4 April 2018 to officially open the Games on the Gold Coast.

The Queen's Baton Relay will pass through Albany, Denmark, Manjimup, Bridgetown, Bunbury, Rockingham, Rottnest, Fremantle, South Perth, Burswood Park, Perth, King's Park, City Beach, Scarborough, Hillarys, Quinns Rock, Wanneroo, Guildford and Karratha.







HR-LR LICENCES

The Driver Trainers have advised they are unable to do an LR licence test. They can offer a HR Course - this licence would cover people to drive a bus. There are 2 different options available under the HR.

The HR-B is a synchromesh restricted HR and easier to learn as it does not require the double de-clutch method of changing gears, it is similar to a car gearbox with a split between low and high gears. This allows people to drive automatic and manual vehicles up to and including HR class, it does not allow them to drive a truck fitted with a Road-Ranger gearbox (double declutch method of changing gears).

The HR is an unrestricted HR but a bit more difficult to learn as it requires the double de-clutch method of changing gears, it is nothing like a car gearbox with a split between low and high gears. This allows people to drive all types of vehicles up to and including HR class, it does allow them to drive a truck fitted with a Road-Ranger gearbox (double de-clutch method of changing gears). 





APRICOT FRANCIPANI DESSERT CAKE

This is a great throw-together cake that can be made with any type of prepared cake.

Serves 6

INGREDIENTS


Roast Potato Salad

- 1 medium sweet potato, peeled and chopped into 3cm cubes
- 4 medium potatoes, skin on, chopped into 3cm cubes
- 2 tablespoons olive or canola oil Pepper, to taste
- 2 tablespoons low-fat mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon wholegrain mustard
- 1 clove of garlic (optional)
- 2 stalks celery, finely sliced





Draw A Blank

The reference here is to lottery tickets: only those with motifs or words printed on them win a prize. Buy a blank ticket, and you win nothing.

By coincidence, a very similar phrase — to draw blank — was used in hunting, with much the same meaning. To draw, in the language of hunting, is to scour a forest or hillside for game: to draw blank, sometimes to draw a blank, accordingly referred to an unsuccessful quest for quarry. Both idioms later passed into general use, though to draw a blank is now the more common form, to suggest a failure in any search or endeavour.

PAY THROUGH THE NOSE

The standard theory about the origin of this strange phrase refers to a 'nose tax' said to have been imposed by the Vikings on the Irish. The 'nose tax' in effect protected the taxpayer's nose: anyone who refused to pay up was liable to the painful penalty of having his nose slit with a knife.

From The Horse's Mouth

In the days when buying and selling horses was as common as buying and selling secondhand cars is today, it was as important to know the age of the animal you were buying as it is now to know the mileage of a car. A cautious buyer would always insist on learning the real state of affairs from the horse's mouth rather than the owner's. One glance at a horse's teeth can reveal how old it really is, since its teeth are worn away as it ages — the result of abrasion from its fodder.

If a horse were given as a present, however, it would be bad form to check its age before accepting it. Hence the proverbial expression, applying nowadays to all gifts and opportunities, Don't look a gift horse in the mouth.

One gift horse that should have been more closely scrutinised, as it turned out, was the *Trojan horse*, which concealed Greek enemy soldiers and helped to bring about the fall of the city of Troy.
