DON'T FORGET TO TEST YOUR SMOKE ALARMS THIS MONTH!

It is not enough to have a smoke alarm, they need to be tested and cleaned regularly and replaced after ten years.

Beep!

Research has shown that the majority of people have smoke alarms installed but most do not realise that they need to clean and maintain their smoke alarms regularly. Last year there were 670 accidental or cause unknown house fires in WA and a number of people suffered serious injuries, with one death.

DFES recommends installing smoke alarms in all bedrooms, living areas and along the path to an exit. If you do not have a smoke alarm or are upgrading, DFES recommends installing mains powered photo electric smoke alarms.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

The Shire of Wickepin is now in the Restricted Burning period 8 February – 14 April 2017. Permits are required to burn within this period and can be obtained from your local Fire Control Officer.

LICENSING YOUR TRACTOR OR SELF PROPELLED HEADER



So you've bought a tractor and need to licence it. There are a few details and documents required to complete your licensing request.

You will need to bring in your proof of ownership such as a detailed receipt. You will also need the details of your machine *including weight and width* to be able to process your application.

All the details required can be found on the Application for Agricultural Machinery Form VL18. Forms are available at the Shire Office or on the Department of Transport website. http://www.transport.wa.gov.au/licensing/licensing-resources.asp

These forms are considered a statutory declaration and your signature needs to be witnessed by a person such as the CEO, Police Officer or Post Office Manager.







WICKEPIN POLICE

Firearms Storage

As a rural community we have a large number of firearms licence holders, using them in their day to day business. Sometimes, because of this, we become complacent as to the rules and storage regulations required by law.

The provisions of Regulation 11A(1) of the Firearms Regulations 1974 apply in respect of security storage.

'A person entitled to possess firearms or ammunition of any kind is to ensure that the firearms or ammunition are stored in accordance with this regulation.

Firearms and ammunition are to be stored in a locked cabinet or container that at least meets the specifications described in Schedule 4 or in such other way as is approved".

Fips to remember when considering storage facilities:

- Be mindful of the location for firearm/ammunition cabinets! Do not place them at obvious locations where it is easily identified. A garage IS NOT a recommended location!
- Be mindful of anchoring and fixing bolts when installing firearm storages or containers.
- Consider installing a security alarm to cover the cabinet/storage/container location.

Viore information on specifications for storage cabinets or containers can be found, as well as on Schedule 1 of the Firearms Regulations 1974, within our Online Services at:

Please remember that safe storage deters your firearm ending up in the wrong hands and being used for criminal activity.


2-MINUTE NOODLE PANCAKES

by Renee Hissey

SERVES 3-4 TIME 10 MIN

- 85g packet vegetable flavour 2-minute noodles
- 5 eggs, lightly beaten
- 4 rashers bacon, diced
- ¾ cup grated potato
- onions, finely sliced
- 6 button mushrooms,





Coffee & Almond Meringues

SERVES 4 PREP 15 MIN - COOK 1HR 3 eggwhites % cup caster sugar 1 teaspoon coffee granules, crushed 1/2 cup toasted flaked almonds % cup thickened cream 2 tablespoons coffee flavoured liqueur, optional Chocolate Sauce, to serve (see below)

Preheat the oven to 130°C (110°C fan forced). Line a

large baking sheet with baking paper. Place the eggwhites into a bowl. Using electric beaters, beat until thick. Gradually add sugar and continue beating for 10 min. Fold through the coffee and almonds.

- 2 Drop four equal portions of mixture onto the baking sheet and bake for 1hr or until they are dry and crisp. Allow to cool in the oven.
- 3 Place thickened cream and liqueur into a small bowl and beat until soft peaks form. Serve meringues with liqueur cream and drizzle with Chocolate Sauce, Garnish with extra toasted flaked almonds.

CHOCOLATE SAUCE

Place 100g chopped **Cadbury Dark Cooking** Chocolate and 15g butter into a bowl over simmering water and stir until smooth. Remove from heat and stir through 2 tablespoons thickened cream and 1 tablespoon golden syrup.
