

ELIGIBILITY FOR PENSIONER AND SENIOR RATES REBATE

If you are the holder of a current and valid Pensioner Concession Card, Commonwealth Seniors Health Card or if you hold a current and valid WA Seniors Card you are eligible for a State Government funded Rate Rebate under the provisions of the Rates and Charges (Rebates & Deferments) Act 1992.

To be eligible for this rebate on a property, you must be the owner and occupier of that property on the 1^{st} July each financial year.

Applications for these rebates can be made by phoning the Water Corporation on 1300 659 951 or applying online at www.watercorporation.com.au

Please provide a copy of your concession cards to the Shire of Wickepin to verify your eligibility. The eligibility date will be that of your application lodgement date with either the Shire of Wickepin or the Water Corporation and can not be back dated.

WICKEPIN BIRD PARK OPENING

The Wickepin Sculpture Project engaged artist Neil Elliott in a 6 day residency based in Wickepin between September and October 2016. Neil facilitated a series of weekend sculpture workshops with local residents using repurposed wood, found objects, farm junk and recycled materials.

The workshops were held at a project art space created in the Wickepin She Shed He Shed community space. The art space was open to visitors and provided inspiration and the sharing of ideas between participants as well as a central place for discussions with the artist-in-residence. A key component of the project was to motivate and inspire those in the community and to create engagement and conversation.

Participants were able to work on their own individual sculpture project and a community sculpture component of the project. An important element of the sculpture residency was to create a community sculpture. Using the skills developed in the workshops, community members collected materials and used these to create an outdoor sculpture.

The community sculpture created has been called the 'Bird Park' and has been installed along the Wickepin Heritage Walk Trail. A series of local 'birds' has been created from the found and recycled objects. They have been attached to salvaged Western Power poles creating a striking upright sculpture.

Neil Elliott, artist-in-residence, provided a brief to the participants prior to the workshop explaining the focus on regional bird life and the idea of creating fun sculptural pieces. He encouraged community discussion on the subject matter. Neil provided photographs of completed projects to inspire community thought and interaction on an outcome. Neil worked closely with workshop participants and Shire of Wickepin staff throughout the weekends to help refine ideas and assist in determining the form of the community sculpture.

Spinach & Feta Snail

SERVES 6

PREP 25 MIN * COOK 50 MIN

- 1 tablespoon olive oil*
- 1 red onion, finely diced
- 1 bunch silverbeet, stems removed, leaves shredded
- 2 eggs*, lightly beaten
- 120g reduced-fat feta, crumbled
- 240g low-fat cottage cheese*
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh dill
- ¼ teaspoon nutmeg
- 12 sheets filo pastry*
- · olive cil sprav'
- 2 teaspoons sesame seeds
- 3 cups mixed saiad leaves, to serve
- fresh mint leaves, to garnish

LEMON SOUR CREAM SAUCE

- ⅓ cup extra-light sour cream
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons water

1 Preheat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan forced). Line the base of a 24cm round springform pan with baking paper. Heat clive oil in a large non-stick frying pan over medium heat. Add onlon and cock for 3 min.

2 Add sliverbeet and cock for 2 min or until just wilted. Remove from heat and cock.

3 Meanwhile, combine eggs, feta, cottage cheese, dill and nutmed in a bowl. Add silverbeet mixture and stir until combined. Divide the filling into 6 portions. 4 Place 1 filo sheet onto a clean surface, lightly soray with oil and place another sheet on top. Put one portion of the filling in a thin line, lengthwise. 4cm from the long pastry eage and roll up. ង Starting in the centre of the springform pan, carefully coll the filled filo length, seam-side down, to make a snall shape. Receat with remaining pastry and filling, joining each roll to the end of the last and coiling it around until the pan is filled. Spray the pie top lightly with oil and sprinkle with sesame seeds. Wicky vs All Blacks @ Wickepin 29/4/2017




