



SOUTH WEST A BUZZ WITH HELICOPTER INSPECTIONS

Western Power are reminding land owners, communities and drivers in the south west of the network that they are currently conducting helicopter line inspections on regional powerlines.

The choppers will be inspecting distribution lines in the York, Brookton, Beverley, Corrigin, Cuballing, Pingelly, Wandering, Warradarge and Albany areas over the coming weeks that cross farms and run along regional roadways.

Western Power's Head of Operational Services, Stewart Furness said that while there will be no impact on power supply, it can be distracting with helicopters hovering at low altitude near poles and powerlines.





"Western Power undertakes regular helicopter patrols throughout the year to inspect and maintain the electricity network when the weather conditions are favourable. Whilst it is a fantastic sight drivers should keep their eyes on the road, not in the sky," Mr Furness said.

"We also want to remind farmers in the areas that some inspections will be near paddocks. So they may wish to consider moving livestock away from pastures near powerlines."

If network maintenance is required during an inspection, highly skilled technicians safely repair the powerline while in the air by sitting on a platform located in the helicopter.

In some circumstances the helicopters may land for closer inspections.

KIDSPORT – AVAILABLE ONLINE



KidSport enables eligible Western Australian children aged 5-18 years to participate in community sport and recreation by offering them financial assistance towards club fees.

Up to \$200 per child per calendar year is available. The fees go directly from the local government to the registered KidSport clubs participating in the project. (No retrospective fees will be paid.)

You are now able to apply for KidSport online via www.dsr.wa.gov.au/kidsport. You will need to have a valid Healthcare card/Pensioner concession card handy. Further information is available from the shire office or via the KidSport link above.

LICENSING YOUR TRACTOR OR SELF PROPELLED HEADER



So you've bought a tractor and need to licence it. There are a few details and documents required to complete your licensing request.

You will need to bring in your proof of ownership such as a detailed receipt. You will also need the details of your machine *including weight and width* to be able to process your application.

All the details required can be found on the Application for Agricultural Machinery Form VL18. Forms are available at the Shire Office or on the Department of Transport website. http://www.transport.wa.gov.au/licensing/licensing-resources.asp

These forms are considered a statutory declaration and your signature needs to be witnessed by a person such as the CEO, Police Officer or Post Office Manager.



Keep scratching. There are more...


Double hand scratching after this one..


Pick a new spot to scratch, you're getting a bald spot..



IN THE KITCHEN



1½ cups Panko breadcrumbs 1 tblsp cajun spice mix grated rind and juice from 1 lemon

1/2 cup mayonnaise 2 tsp chopped parsley

4 x 125g thin boneless white fish fillets

1 x 59g egg, lightly beaten

1 baby cos lettuce 1 lebanese cucumber.

sliced into ribbons

4 bread rolls, cut in half Combine breadcrumbs, spice mix and lemon rind on a large plate. Mix lemon juice, mayonnaise and parsley together in a small bowl and refrigerate. Dip the fish fillets in beaten egg, then coat with the breadcrumb mixture. Shallow-fry the crumbed fish fillets in hot oil in a large frypan for about 2 minutes on each side or until golden. Remove from pan and drain on paper towel.

Layer the lettuce, fish fillets and cucumber ribbons on the roll bases, drizzle with lemon mayonnaise and replace roll tops.

Recipe is best prepared as required.



Spread a can of **pie apples**(or any type of drained canned fruit) over the base of an ovenproof dish. Crush about 14 **butternut cookies** in a plastic bag with a rolling pin. Melt 2 tablespoons **butter**. Add enough melted butter to biscuit crumbs to moisten, then sprinkle over apple. Bake in a 180C preheated oven for about 15 minutes or until crisp and golden. Serve with **ice-cream**.





MAKES 36 TIME 20 MIN, PLUS SETTING TIME

- 36 lollipop sticks
- 36 marshmallows
- 200g dark, white or milk cooking chocolate, broken into pieces
- · pink and white sprinkles
- pink and white lollies, for decorating
- **1** Push a lollipop stick into each marshmallow and set aside.
- 2 Place the chocolate into a microwave-safe bowl then microwave on high (100% power) for

1 min, stirring every 30 sec or until melted and smooth. Set the chocolate aside until cool but not set. If the chocolate is too hot the marshmallows will melt. 3 Dip the marshmallow pops into the chocolate, shaking off the excess. Decorate as desired using sprinkles, lollies or cachous. Stick the lollipops into a jar of sugar or a styrofoam box and allow to dry. Wrap each bite in cellophane and then tie with ribbons.

PETER RUNDLE MLA DEMANDS ANSWERS ON REGIONAL POLICE RESOURCING

The Labor Government has refused to confirm whether it will retain at least two sworn officers at country police stations.

Member for Roe Peter Rundle MLA confronted Police Minister Michelle Roberts in Parliament this week to demand answers on Labor's plan for regional police resourcing.

"The Minister was asked specifically if she would provide adequate resourcing for country stations, including retaining at least two sworn officers at each location, and she refused to directly address the question," Mr Rundle said.

"It appears we are heading back to the dark old days of the previous Labor Government where it shut six country police stations across regional Western Australia, including three in the electorate of Roe."

Mr Rundle said the three stations Labor shut in 2007 – at Cranbrook, Wickepin and Dumbleyung – were subsequently re-opened by the Liberal-National Government.

"Given Labor has ruled out examining a new revenue source or privatising assets it stands to reason that they will need to make cuts to achieve Budget savings," Mr Rundle said. "Labor's track record shows that when money is running thin they will look to siphon police resources away from the bush."

Mr Rundle said under questioning in Parliament the Police Minister ruled out closing regional stations yet he remained sceptical.

"The Nationals WA will hold Labor to this commitment," he said. "When Labor last shut country stations it caused great concern in the affected communities and it took the hard work and lobbying of The Nationals, along with the local governments, to get these vital pieces of community infrastructure reopened."

Mr Rundle said country police stations did not have the specialist support or backup enjoyed by the metropolitan area. "This is a key reason why the retention of staffing levels, and in some cases the improvement of staffing levels, is required," Mr Rundle said.






