IN THE KITCHEN

Marmalade

Home-made marmalade is not only infinitely better, it is also much cheaper and more flavoursome.

You can make delicious preserves from the many citrus fruits available or add apple or peaches for variety. You definitely can take advantage of the time when oranges, lemons, limes, grapefruit or mandarins are available at your local fruiterer or when your fruit trees are laden with juicy fruits.

Basic guidelines for making marmalade:

- 1 The peel must be tender before the sugar is added.
- 2 Add warmed sugar, this prevents the temperature from being lowered while bringing fruit back to the boil, and consequently over-cooking.

3 When the sugar has dissolved, and not before, boil briskly, stirring gently until the marmalade sets when tested.

To test marmalade:

Draw saucepan from heat, remove a teaspoon of marmalade from saucepan, place on a chilled plate or saucer, refrigerate for a moment. Then run your finger through the centre, and, if the marmalade is at setting point, the surface will crinkle and remain in two separate portions.

OR use a candy or confectionery thermometer.

Skimming:

(To remove scum)
If necessary marmalade should be skimmed to remove any scum from the surface. This should be done towards the end of the cooking, usually after testing for the setting point. As continuous skimming is wasteful and unnecessary.

Golden orange marmalade with whisky

6 small carrots
3 oranges
2 lemons
sugar
water
1 cup Scotch whisky



1 Peel the oranges and lemons.

2 Soak the skins in water overnight.

3 Next day chop the skins finely and discard the water.

4 Cut the orange and lemon pulp into slices.

5 Scrape the carrots and grate them finely.

6 Place the peel, chopped fruit and carrot into a large pan.

7 Cover with fresh water and bring to the boil. Cook until the carrot and fruit is tender — it can take up to one hour.

8 Measure the pulp and juice and for each cup and a half of juice and fruit, add one cup of sugar.

9 Bring to the boil and stir until the sugar is dissolved.

10 Cook rapidly until a little, when tested on a saucer, will set.

11 Add the whisky and cook for a further two minutes.

12 Cool, bottle and seal.

Three in one marmalade

4 kg approximately

1 grapefruit 1 large orange 1 lemon

2.5 litres (10 cups) water 2 kg granulated sugar

1 Wash fruit, cutting each one in half and then into wafer thin slices.

2 Place in large bowl, cover with the water and leave overnight.

3 Next day, place into a large preserving pan, bring to the boil, then add the sugar and stir over low heat until sugar dissolves.

4 Bring to the boil, boil rapidly until setting point is reached.

5 Allow to stand 5 minutes, stir gently to disperse fruit.

6 Pour into warm, dry jars.

7 Seal with Kleer View Covers or warm paraffin wax. Label and store in cool, dry place.

We still hold the top of the ladder with no losses, all games won bar 3 which were drawn. So please rug up and come down to our next game it will be great to see supporters there.




