

History snippet

Excerpt from Other Fortunate Lives.

Roberts Family

Yealering didn't exist then but the block chosen was only a few miles from a lake marked in the recently printed survey map. The family were among the first to arrive as farmers at Yealering. For the journey from Perth a horse and new trap were purchased, the trap seated 4 and all the belongings were piled on top. George rode his bike all the way from Perth or at least where the track was not too rough.

They stopped at Narrogin and got provisions and found that Boodi rats (Bilbies/Dalgytes) were plentiful that year as they kept getting into the cart whenever it stopped. They proceeded to Wickepin and it was about a week by the time they were welcomed to the district by the Lees at Kirk Rock. Mrs Roberts and the girls stayed with Mrs Lee while the men went to their block to erect tents.

George was keen to see the lake he had heard about and set out soon after they settled in to find it. He had trouble locating it in the thick scrub, but eventually was successful to find it dry as a bone. The following year however after good rains the lake filled up and water was often carted for domestic use. Families who had settled to the west often came for picnics and the women would do their washing and socialise at the same time.

FIREBREAKS 2017/2018

Council would like to remind residents of the Shire of Wickepin that they are required on or before 1 October 2017 and thereafter to 14 April 2018 to plough, scarify or otherwise provide and maintain firebreaks clear of all inflammable material at least 2.5 metres wide as follows:

Rural Land

Inside the boundary of all land held by each owner or occupier, their firebreaks need not follow the perimeter of any paddock but will be acceptable following land contours in an endeavour to overcome water erosion;

- To subdivide each holding into lots of no greater than 200 hectares; and
- To surround the homestead, out buildings and fuel storages on any such land.

Townsite Land

All lots within the townsites of Harrismith, Tincurrin, Toolibin, Wickepin and Yealering are required to be cleared and maintained free of all debris or inflammable material. Failure to comply with these requirements renders the owner or occupier liable to a penalty not more than \$400.

Clearing of Fence Lines

When clearing for new fence lines, landholders are asked to consider locating the fence three (3) metres inside their boundary to avoid any clearing on road reserves. Old fences should first be removed. If landholders wish to place their fence on the boundary, they may clear no more than one (1) metre beyond their boundary. This may be varied in special circumstances at the discretion of the CEO and Manager Works & Services. Any timber removed from the road reserve is to be pushed onto the owner's property.

Fencing of Road Reserves

Council encourages farmers to fence off road reserves running through their properties to protect trees on these reserves and to allow new growth of vegetation.

Burning on Roadsides

Should property owners wish to carry out burning of the road reserve adjacent to their property, it is necessary to obtain council approval prior to any burning taking place.

Burning Periods

Restricted Burning – 1 October 2017 to 13 November 2017; Prohibited Burning – 14 November 2017 to 7 February 2018; Restricted Burning – 8 February 2018 to 14 April 2018.

Harvest and Fire Ban 2017/2018 Season

Harvesting is banned on Christmas Day and New Years Day. Lighting of fires are banned on Good Friday and Easter Sunday.







IN THE KITCHEN

RED CURRY PORK WITH HERB NOODLE SALAD

SERVES 4
TIME 20 MIN

- 400g pork fillet, sliced on the diagonal
- 1 tablespoon each red curry paste and lite coconut milk
- 100g rice vermicelli noodles
- 1 Lebanese cucumber, deseeded and thinly sliced
- 1 cup julienned carrot
- 4 spring/green onions, thinly sliced on the diagonal
- 1 cup roughly chopped snow pea sprouts
- 2 cups chopped fresh herbs, we used mint and parsley
- Coconut & Lime Dressing, to serve (see below)

1 Place pork, curry paste and coconut milk into a glass or ceramic dish and toss to combine. Marinate for 10 min, then thread onto 8 bamboo skewers.

2 Heat a chargrill or frying pan over medium heat and spray with oil. Cook skewers for 7-8

min turning often or until lightly browned and cooked through. 3 Meanwhile, place noodles into a heatproof bowl. Cover with boiling water and stand for 5 min. Drain and refresh under cool water. Drain well. Roughly chop noodles then place into a bowl with cucumber, carrot, spring/green onions, snow pea sprouts and herbs, toss to combine. Pour over Coconut & Lime Dressing, Serve pork with salad.


395ml sweetened condensed milk

1/3 cup Coles Frozen Fruit Mixed Berries, thawed, pureed

150g fresh raspberries

1 Line base and sides of a 20cm round cake pan with plastic wrap and non-stick baking paper. 2 Using electric beaters, beat together cream and condensed milk until soft peaks form. Pour into prepared pan. Dollop berry puree over cream. Gently swirl over top with metal skewer. Cover with plastic wrap and freeze overnight. 3 Remove from freezer and gently ease cake out of pan and place on serving plate. Scatter over raspberries. Sit at room temperature for 5 mins before cutting into wedges to serve. Note: This ice-cream cake will keep in the freezer for 2 weeks. Serve with raspberries when required.
