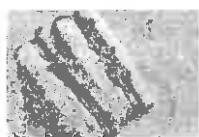

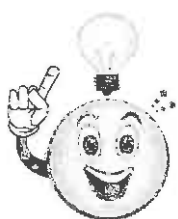

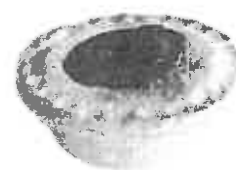

Congratulations to Neil Ballard for receiving an award of Honorary Doctorate to Murdoch University. Neil has made a valuable contribution and voluntarily provided his knowledge of seeds and legumes and design for machines for over 25 years, for the improvement to Agricultural Science.

Local farmer awarded Doctorate at Murdoch.

Recently, on 1^{4th} September, hundreds of Murdoch University students celebrated success at a Graduation ceremony at the Perth Convention Centre.

At this prestigious occasion local Tincurrin farmer, Neil Ballard, received the award of Honorary Doctor of the University, presented to him by Acting Chancellor Ross Holt. Dr Neil Ballard was nominated for this award by his long-time collaborator at Murdoch, Professor John Howieson.

In his speech presenting Neil for this award, Professor Howieson spoke at length on the valuable contribution made by Dr Ballard in the field of development of new pasture legumes over the past twenty five years. "As scientists who sought impact, we needed our ideas to be grounded in the requirements of the farming systems we wanted to improve. Neil supported our programs of experimentation; he listened to our ideas, he pointed out flaws, helped select and manage appropriate trial sites and he became our eyes on the ground for many of our early experiments. But Neil went much further than that; as we were developing new legumes he began developing machines to harvest them, advice on ways to alter our selection criteria and in building seed handling and cleaning infrastructure that would allow us to not only select the right characteristics, but provide a means to rapidly transition our plants into commercial realities. Neil did all this voluntarily because of his burning desire to see improvements in Agricultural Science. But his intuitive insights into the essential plant characteristics to breed for were pivotal to our achieving some successful outcomes."

Continuing on Professor Howieson spoke of Neil accepting his invitation to take part in an aid program being developed in Africa. Neil's community skills came to the fore here, with him arranging for a container load of cricket gear to be shipped to a very poor community, hence providing sporting opportunities at this local level, for underprivileged young folk.

Neil has since been part of many overseas Agriculture Development Programs, going to China, Libya and Indian Ocean Islands. Dr Ballard is presently assisting with a project on Christmas Island, where employment opportunities are being developed, for when the super phosphate mine runs out of production.

Onto Professor Howieson closing comments "Murdoch University is extremely privileged to have Neil Ballard work with us both here widely in Australia, where he sits on several research oversight committees, and in many countries overseas since those early days. He has the observational and interpretational skills of a first rate scientist, he retains the energy of a school boy athlete and has the compassion for community that is embedded in Murdoch's own ethos. Neil didn't have the opportunity to attend University as a young man, as after leaving school he was required to work on the family farm on which he grew up. So, I can think of no better candidate for this award and I am extremely proud to work alongside Dr Neil Ballard. I hope it continues for a while yet"

John (Jack) Hosken – 88

I travelled to school by bus. At first it was a Charabanc, the driver sat up the front and the back of the vehicle was enclosed with canvas. There were seats along both sides and a row in the middle.

On arriving at school, we usually played marbles – and I always lost! We also kicked the football around to each other as well until it was time to go to class. There were only 3 classrooms, one, two and three.

I recall we had to have a slate and pencil to write with. We generally played as a group and most of us got along well together. My favourite subjects as a school boy were spelling and arithmetic. I do remember that one day the circus came to town and our class was taken down to the railway station yard where the circus was being held to see the elephants, tigers, clowns and circus animals. Miss Chipper was my first teacher then Miss Moncrief and then Mr Burrows who was the Principal. We never attended any school camps and did not get any homework.

Add 1 tbsp white vinegar to 1 cup of water and soak a Coles Ham Bag in it. Wring out and place ham inside bag. Store ham in the refrigerator and cut slices as required.

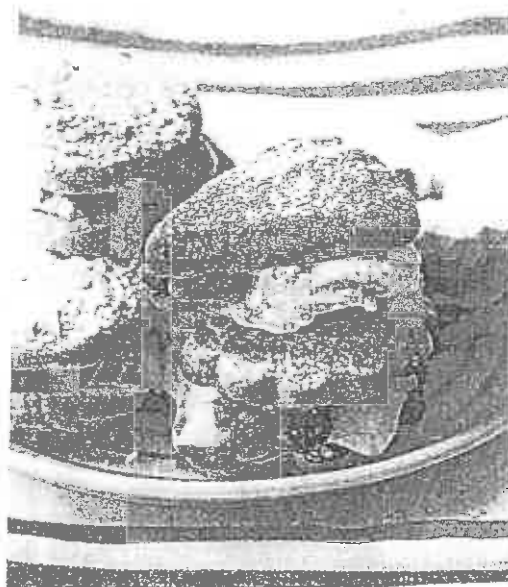

- 1 tbsp Dijon mustard

- 3 Meanwhile, heat honey and butter in a medium saucepan until simmering. Add whole plums and simmer on low heat for 8-10 mins, until plums are tender.
- 4 Slice ham and serve with honeyed plums.

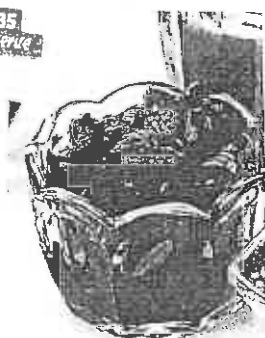
