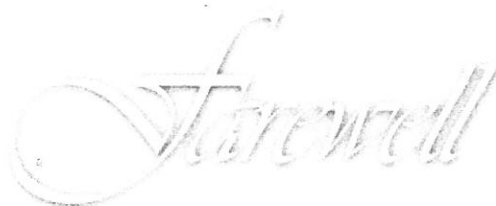

Roadwise Crash Car Trailer

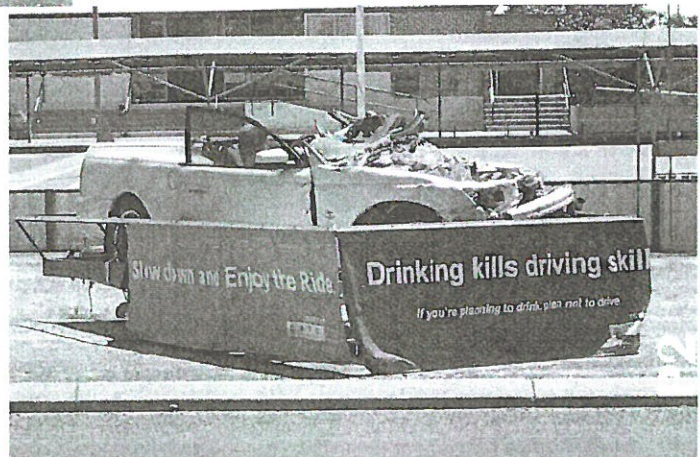

Saturday 17 February saw the annual Wickepin Triathlon take place on a beautiful summery day.



This year would see the Triathlon go from 4 categories down to 3, with only the Mini, Short and Long Courses being competed in.

The Mini Course saw three teams and 7 individuals compete in a 50m swim, 500m bike ride and 500m run.

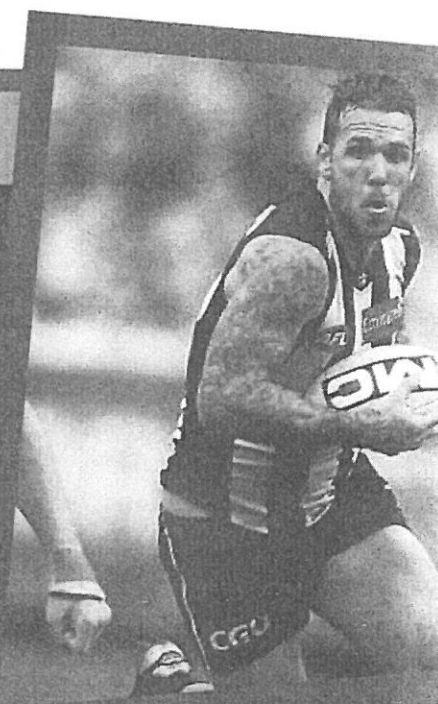

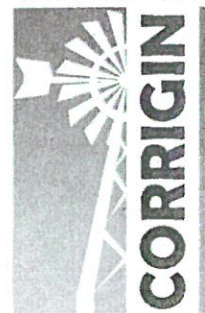
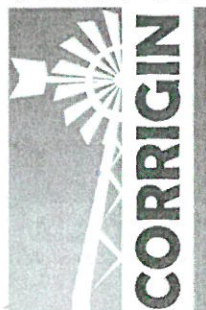

IN THE KITCHEN

old-school baking

Chocolate vanilla slice

MAKES 12 PREP 30 MINS (PLUS CHILLING) COOK 30 MINS

frozen puff pastry, 3 sheets, thawed
caster sugar, ½ cup
custard powder, ¼ cup
cornflour, 1 tablespoon
milk, 2 cups
butter, 30g, chopped
vanilla extract, 1 teaspoon
thickened cream, ½ cup, whipped

ICING
icing sugar, ¾ cup, sifted
cocoa powder, 2 tablespoons
butter, 10g, melted
just-boiled water, 1-2 tablespoons

- 1 Preheat oven to hot, 200°C. Line two oven trays with baking paper.
- 2 Cut each pastry sheet into 12 even rectangles. Arrange on trays. Top with baking paper. Place a second tray on each top to weigh down. Bake 12-15 minutes until crisp. Transfer to wire rack to cool.

3 Meanwhile, in a medium saucepan combine sugar, custard powder and cornflour. Add a little milk, stirring to smooth paste. Gradually stir in remaining milk. Cook over medium heat 4-5 minutes, stirring constantly, until mixture boils and thickens. Mix in butter and vanilla. Allow to cool.

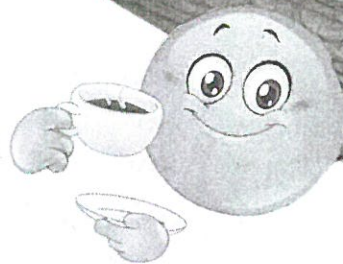
4 **ICING** In a small bowl, combine icing sugar, cocoa, butter and enough water to make a smooth, spreadable paste. Using a small palette knife, spread icing over 12 cooled pastry wafers. Allow to set.

5 Whisk cream into cooled custard. Spoon into a piping bag with a large plain nozzle. Pipe custard onto remaining wafers.

6 Stack 2 layers together and top with iced pastry. Store in an airtight container in the fridge.

Top tip

For a speedy option, bake pastry sheets whole. Layer in 22cm square pan with custard. Spread icing over, chill 1 hour. Slice.



Coffee scrolls

MAKES 12 PREP 35 MINS (PLUS PROVING) COOK 25 MIN

plain flour, 3 cups, sifted
caster sugar, ¼ cup
dried yeast, 7g sachet
salt, ½ teaspoon
milk, ⅔ cup, warmed
water, ¼ cup
egg, 1, lightly beaten
butter, 40g, melted, plus 60g extra, softened
brown sugar, ½ cup
walnuts, chopped, ½ cup, plus extra, to sprinkle

1 In a bowl, combine flour, sugar, yeast and salt. Add combined milk, water, egg and butter. Knead on a lightly floured surface until smooth. Set aside, covered, in a warm place, 10 minutes.

2 Roll dough to a 20 x 30cm rectangle. Spread with butter. Sprinkle with brown sugar and walnuts. Roll up lengthways. Cut into 12 equal slices.

4 Preheat oven to moderately hot, 190°C. Line a 30cm round cake pan with baking paper. Arrange scrolls, cut side down. Prove, covered, in a warm place, 40-45 minutes.

5 Bake scrolls 20-25 minutes, until hollow when tapped. Drizzle with icing (see tip). Sprinkle with extra walnuts to serve.

Top tip

For icing, sift 1½ cups icing sugar into a bowl. In a jug, mix 2 tablespoons hot milk and 3 teaspoons instant coffee. Add to bowl, stir until smooth.

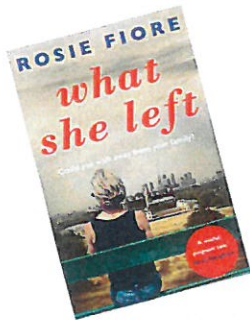

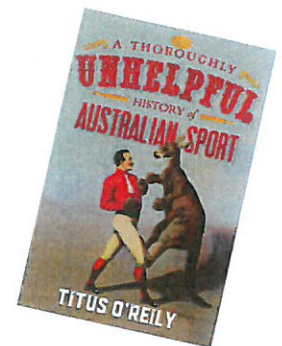

A Thoroughly Unhelpful History of Australian Sport - Titus O'Reilly ~

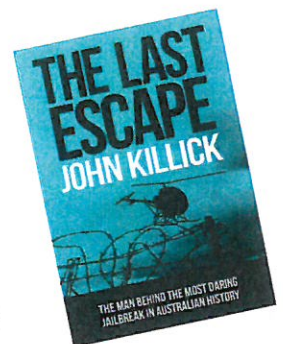
