





VALE BRIAN HEMLEY

Compiled and read by Glenys Hemley at her husband Brian's funeral in Albany on March 19^{th} . Brian Hemley 24/3/1940 - 12/3/2018.

I first met Brian when I was appointed to Wickepin as a school teacher in 1962 but I think I may have vaguely remembered him when I was little 1st Year High School student and he was a big 3rd Year.

Brian was born at Wickepin on the 24th March 1940 to parents Renee and Bill. Since being diagnosed with his illness, the first goal he wanted to achieve was to celebrate his 78th Birthday with the family, but he fell short of this by 12 days. On Monday he asked me what the date was and when I said "the 12th" he may have thought the 24th was too far away.

Brian is the eldest of the family; he has sister Dorothy and brother Colin.

He attended Wickepin Primary School and moved on to Albany High School; boarding at Norman House that was run by the Slomans. At the age of 15 he left school and went home to work on the family farm with his Mum and Dad. His main interest has always been farming and everything related to that but he also became involved with Junior Farmers, tennis, cricket, football, and basketball.

It was always interesting when young teachers arrived in the small country towns and the locals "checked them out." This was quite nice but soon soured when he and a friend were discussing the possibility of taking us (another first year out teacher, Hazel, who has become a special friend of mine) to the Drive In. The other fellow wanted the tall, slim one and Brian ended up with the short, fat one!

I should have realized, way back then, that I would have to fight for top position in his life because his work ethic and devotion to his farm work was always very high on his priority list and this never changed.

We married on 4th April, 1964. This date was Brian's second goal as he wanted us to celebrate our 54th Wedding Anniversary.

I continued teaching until our first born daughter, Derryn, was born on 15th June 1965 and shortly after, in fact, <u>very</u> shortly after, Kym was born in the following year on 6th June 1966. In 1968 Scott was born on 12th October and we had the Meckering Earthquake to help us celebrate the occasion. Nicole was another June baby and arrived on 30th and this completed our familyclose together in age and close together as mates which is rather lovely.

In 1975 we left the family farm and moved to a new life at Gnowangerup and this is where Scott, Jo and family still farm. Brian has continued to help there even though we lived in Albany and he was supposed to be semi retired. I guess we knew he would never stop farming....... He is wearing his work clothes today.

He became very involved with Local Government, Politics, Apex, Agri politics, Water catchments and various other Land Care projects but this did not include the garden unless he could use the chain saw.

Brian enjoyed a healthy life with the only exceptions being having his tonsils out as a little boy and later on, a knee Arthroscopy. It came as a huge shock to us all when, on the 16th December, he came to Albany with a broken part of machinery and later that week learned he had a terminal disease.

Some of us were with him on Monday when he peacefully passed away.

I have never met a more honest, fair, non-judgemental, caring and loving person.


Short Article for the Watershed



Notice of Intention to Upgrade the Niche Wall at Harrismith Cemetery

The Shire of Wickepin hereby gives notice of the intention to refurbish the Niche Wall at the Harrismith Cemetery. This work is expected to be carried out between June 2018 and September 2018.

The upgrade aims to address issues identified in the Shire of Wickepin Cemetery Redevelopment Plan including problems with the size of the niches in the current wall and to improve the overall appearance of the cemetery.





IN THE KITCHEN

Lamb fillet kebabs

with tabouli and tzatziki dip

- 1/4 cup burghul wheat
- 1 cup flat-leaf parsley leaves, chopped
- 1/4 cup mint leaves, chopped
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 2 tomatoes, deseeded & chopped toasted pita bread to serve
- · 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1/2 lemon, juiced
- salt & freshly cracked black pepper
- · 600g lamb fillet, 2cm diced
- 1 large brown onion, 2cm pieces
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- tzatziki to serve


Place the burghul in a small bowl. Cover with cold water and stand for 15 minutes. Drain and place in a clean tea towel and squeeze out excess water. Transfer burghul to a large bowl. Add parsley, mint, garlic, tomato, 1 tablespoon olive oil and lemon juice. Mix until well combined. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

Mix remaining oil with the garlic and rub over the lamb. Thread lamb and onion alternately onto metal skewers.

Heat a BBQ grill to high, place the skewers on the grill and cook for 8-10 minutes turning often until the lamb is cooked to your liking.

Serve with the tabouli, pita bread and tzatziki.

Authentic Italian mushroom pizza with mozzarella

- 2 pizza bases
- 1/2 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 cup passata sauce
- 1/4 cup basil, chopped
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 400g swiss brown mushrooms, sliced
- 1 tablespoon dried oregano
- · 2 cup freshly grated low fat mozzarella

Preheat oven to 220°C

Heat the oil in a saucepan and add the garlic, cook, stirring for 1 minute. Add the passata sauce and the basil. Cook gently for 5 minutes to infuse the sauce.

Spread the passata sauce over the pizza base leaving a 1cm boarder. Sprinkle 1/4 of the cheese on each of the bases and top with the sliced mushrooms.

Add remaining cheese. Sprinkle with the dried oregano.

Cook on an oven tray for 15 minutes or until golden.




