## History Snippets

*Taken from the Sunday Times of February 12, 1911.*

### A Wail from Wickepin

*Now a case somewhat analogous is reported to us from Wickepin. From a correspondent there we learn that a young immigrant girl, engaged as a waitress at a hotel, seems to have taken up a strange fancy for the company of a newly arrived Japanese cook. To the astonishment of residents the two stroll out for a walk in the evenings and the young woman seems utterly oblivious to the importance of such behaviour or defiant of local opinion on the subject. Our correspondent writes to us with strong feelings on the matter. He asks us to bring the matter to the notice of the authorities here. But we would ask, what are the people of Wickepin doing? Is there no clergyman in the district to whose church at any rate nominally this young woman belongs? Are there no matrons whose good offices in giving counsel or warnings could be utilised? And then again what shall be said of the hotel keeper and wife who would knowingly permit such a state of affairs to obtain among their domestics?*

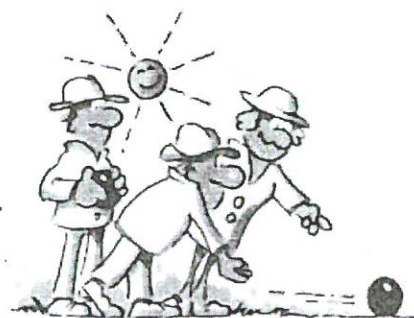



**ONLY WORKING SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES.**

If your smoke alarm isn't working properly, it won't warn you and your family of a fire in your home!

Is it time to change your battery?

Whether you need to change your smoke alarm battery will depend on your type of smoke alarm.

If you do need to change the battery, DFES recommends you do this on the 1<sup>st</sup> April

Smoke alarms powered by:

- 9V AKALINE BATTERY require you to replace batteries every year.
- 10-year NON-REMOVABLE LITHIUM BATTERY do not require you to change the battery each year.
- MAINS-POWERED SMOKE ALARMS have a battery back-up for periods of mains power outage.
- Many models have a rechargeable (non-removable) battery and do not need replacing.
- Refer to the manufacturer's instructions to see if you need to change the battery.



**After replacing the battery**

Always test that your smoke alarm is operating by holding down the test button until you hear a loud alert tone.

**Things you should know...**

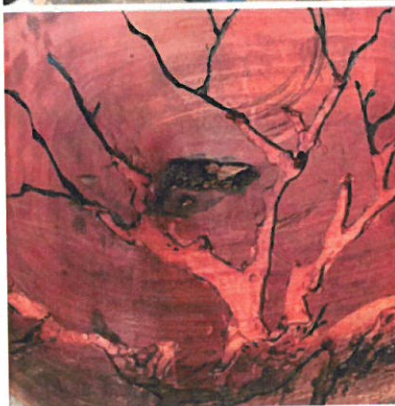
- Not all smoke alarms need their batteries replaced.
- Smoke alarms will make a 'beep' or 'chirping' sound when they have a low battery or are faulty.
- Mains powered smoke alarms are required to have a Green "Power ON" LED indicator. This will light up when the alarm is connected to mains power.
- Test your smoke alarm every month by holding down the test button until you hear a loud tone.
- All smoke alarms require replacement every 10 years. If you do not know how old your smoke alarm is, it's time to replace it.



## Sculpture Workshop Weekend in Wickepin

Lesley Barrett spent the weekend in Wickepin recently. With her art she has worked as an art consultant, studio technician and teacher. This weekend workshop had everybody working with recycled wood and metal, combining the two, and just dabbling a bit with bright coloured paint.

Participants were introduced to hot branding (with homemade branding irons) and some very cool wood burners. Exciting new tools, extending everyone's artistic ability, were given a thorough workout. Great fun and learning for all who joined in.







With seeding season on the way, motorists in the Shire of Wickepin should be aware of increased heavy freight traffic and towed farm equipment on local roads. Drivers should be alert on local roads and expect more heavy traffic on roads that may normally have little traffic.

Trucks, utes and farm machinery are likely to be on the roads, crossing roads and exiting in unusual places. Many of these will be oversize vehicles, and they will need some or even all of the other side of the road. It is important to give them room to pass safely.

The Shire of Wickepin advises all motorists to use their headlights during the day time as we head into autumn and winter, so that other road users can see them in poor light.

CEO Mark Hook said, "Current dry conditions mean there is dust on country roads, and this will affect vision of tail lights and judgment of distances. With burn-offs and when the rain starts, smoke and spray will also affect vision. Don't overtake if you can't see through dust, smoke or spray."

"For farmers who are often working into dusk and night time, it is important to have all flashing lights on machinery and vehicles in working order to ensure maximum visibility to other road users,"

Farmers are encouraged to check the updated Guide to the Movement of Agricultural implements in Western Australia, which is available on [www.transport.wa.gov.au](http://www.transport.wa.gov.au), or ring 13 11 56 for guidance on their responsibilities.

It is also important to consider the risk of fatigue and take extra care when driving home after working long hours in the paddock. We have a shared responsibility for safety on our roads, so all drivers need to be careful and vigilant in this busy season.

# IN THE KITCHEN

## 5 ways with LEFTOVER SAUSAGES

- 1 Slice and add to your favourite vegetable soup. Add some kidney beans and pasta to create a hearty meal.
- 2 Heat a jar of pasta sauce in a saucepan. Add sliced sausages, mushrooms, zucchini and a drained can of borlotti beans. Simmer until vegies are cooked.
- 3 Wrap sausages in puff pastry with a little tomato relish. Brush with beaten egg and bake at 200°C until golden brown.
- 4 Sauté some red curry paste, add a can of coconut milk, leftover sliced sausages and some vegetables. Simmer and serve with cooked rice.
- 5 Top pizza bases with barbecue sauce, sliced sausages and fresh tomato. Sprinkle with grated mozzarella and bake at 200°C until cheese is bubbling.



## Easy as 1-2-3



4 white fish fillets (basa, ling, or ocean perch)

¼ cup red Thai curry paste

2 bunches broccolini, trimmed, separated

### Curried fish

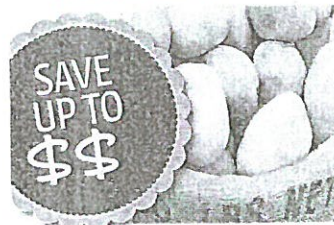
- 1 Place fish in a shallow dish. Brush each fillet with curry paste. Set aside for 5 minutes.
- 2 Heat a non-stick frying pan on medium. Brush with oil. Cook fish for 3-4 minutes each side, until cooked – the flesh will flake easily when tested with a fork.

- 3 Meanwhile, arrange broccolini in a steamer basket over a saucepan of simmering water. Steam for 3-5 minutes until just tender. Serve fish with broccolini, lime cheeks and steamed rice, if liked.
- SERVES 4



**Top tip:** Sprinkle coffee grounds around the base of plants. They'll add nutrients to the soil

## **EXTRA GST REVENUE MUST BE USED TO REVERSE REGIONAL EDUCATION CUTS**

Nationals WA education spokesperson Peter Rundle is calling for a small portion of the State's GST windfall to be allocated to reversing the Labor Government's cuts to regional education.

Federal Treasurer Scott Morrison announced this week Western Australia would receive 47c for every dollar of GST the State generates in 2018-19, up 11c from the 2017-18 34c figure. The WA Treasury had budgeted for 45c for every dollar, resulting in an additional \$140 million flowing into State coffers.

WA will also receive an extra \$122 million as a result of the growing national GST pool.

While remaining critical of WA's "dud deal" on the GST, Mr Rundle said the McGowan Government must use the unexpected revenue to reverse their decision to close the Moora Residential College and tax the Agricultural Education Farm Provisions Trust.

"This is Labor's chance to show they care about giving our regional kids a quality education," he said.

"A small portion of this new money can be spent on ensuring that regional families can educate their children in the communities they live in."

The Nationals Deputy Leader Jacqui Boydell said the McGowan Government had argued the cuts to regional education were necessary because Labor's proposed gold royalty hike did not pass through Parliament.

"The unexpected changes to the GST have resulted in a Budget windfall which has already outstripped the revenue the Government expected to receive from its gold royalty cash grab," Ms Boydell said.

Mr Rundle said that the Labor Government said that the cuts to regional education were made in the aid of "budget repair", and now with this increase in GST income, these cuts could be reversed.

"This is not a large sum of money and with the unexpected revenue from the GST increase the Labor Government can comfortably redirect some funding to regional WA," Mr Rundle said.
