

While the robot itself didn't quite make it to the top competing field, the students and team reached new records for themselves.




Team 5663 competed on the Newton field with 66 other of the world's best teams, including NASA's very own FRC Team, 118 - The Robonauts.

The first day of the qualification matches started strong with the Team winning all other their matches. However, on day 2 the Team encountered some broken pneumatics, bent pistons, and a yellow card. A few losses were felt. The end of qualification matches saw the Team with 6 wins, 5 losses, and ranked 20 out of 67 teams in their division. Achieving a top score of 517 points!

When it came to alliance selections, Team 5663 were fortunately chosen by the 7th alliance captain to join as a 3rd pick. This achievement is something new for Curtin FRC. It meant the Team was to play in their divisions quarter finals! After 2 tough matches in a best of three, competing against some high competing teams, 5663 and their alliance were knocked out of the game.

Barbecue Pork Balls

Ingredients

500g pork mince 1 egg, lightly whisked 2 tablespoons barbecue sauce 2 teaspoons finely grated fresh ginger 60g (1 cup) Panko breadcrumbs



Vegetable oil, to deep-fry Baby Cos lettuce leaves, to serve Coarsely grated carrot, to serve Barbecue sauce, extra, to serve

Method

Line a baking tray with baking paper. Combine the mince, egg, barbecue sauce, ginger and 1/4 cup of the breadcrumbs in a large bowl. Season. Roll 3-teaspoon portions of the mince mixture into balls. Roll in remaining breadcrumbs to coat. Place on prepared tray. Cover and place in the fridge for 30 minutes to rest.

Add enough oil to a wok to reach a depth of 6cm. Heat to 180°C over medium-high heat (when oil is ready a cube of bread turns golden brown in 15 seconds). Cook the meatballs in 3 batches, turning occasionally, for 5 minutes or until crisp and golden. Transfer to a plate lined with paper towel. Serve on lettuce leaves with carrot and extra barbecue sauce.

Spicy Peach and Avocado Salad

Creamy avocados and juicy peaches get a kick of spice thanks to Fresno chiles.

Ingredients

Yields: 8 servings

3 tbsp. fresh lemon juice

3 tbsp. olive oil

2 tsp. pure honey

1 shallot, finely chopped

1 Fresno chili, thinly sliced

Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper


3 ripe but firm peaches, cut into wedges

2 avocados, pitted and cut into wedges

1/2 c. fresh mint, torn if large, plus more for garnish

1/4 c. roasted pistachios, chopped

Directions Prep Time: 0:15, Total Time: 0:30



- 1. Whisk together lemon juice, oil, honey, shallot, and chili in a bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Add peaches and toss to coat. Let sit at least 15 minutes and up to 1 hour.
- 2. Just before serving, add avocado and mint and toss to combine. Season with salt and pepper. Top with pistachios and garnish with mint.



Gardening Tips

Now is the time to plant your winter vegetables The mornings are cooler and the days are still warm so great growing conditions.

Time also to relax and enjoy the garden now that the extreme heat has gone and the pruning and cleaning up is mostly done.



Handy tip

Plentiful limes

Freeze in containers or bags to save for marinades or other uses when not in season.



Remove Tarnish from Silver

1. For pieces that are dull, filmy, or starting to discolour, mix a few drops of mild dishwashing liquid with warm water and dip in a soft cloth. Rub the jewellery, then rinse in cool water, and buff with a cloth until dry.

2. For heavier tarnish, mix three parts baking soda to one part water. Wet the silver and apply the cleaner with a soft, lint-free cloth. Work the paste into the crevices, turning the cloth as it gets gray, then rinse and buff dry. Avoid rubbing silver-plated jewellery too much as it could wear off the finish. Keep in mind that these techniques are fine but these solutions don't have ingredients to prevent tarnish like polish does.

Shine Up Gold

Give gold a bubble bath by pouring a few drops of mild dishwashing liquid into a small bowl of sodiumfree seltzer water or club soda. Put the jewellery into a small strainer, and place it in the bowl to soak for about five minutes. Swish it around and then fish out each piece to go over settings and crevices with a soft toothbrush. Return each piece to the strainer and rinse under running water and dry with a soft cloth.

Polish Dull Pearls

Because they're so porous, pearls easily lose their lustre. Whether real, cultured, or faux, you must clean them with care. First, lay the strand on a soft cloth. Dip a clean, small makeup brush into a mixture of warm water and a little shampoo, and go over each pearl. To finish, rinse the pearls with a clean, well-wrung damp cloth. Let the strand dry flat to prevent the string from stretching. Don't forget to wear your pearls often as this maintains their lustre.






