

History snippet

Excerpt from Yealering 1907-2007 Yealering Library 1940's

The Co-op store manager, Mr Arthur Kelly was the instigator of a lending library. He had purchased a large number of books from 'somewhere' presumably a library that had ceased to operate. Mrs Ellen Walton (nee Tann) who was employed in the Drapery section of the store at the time was approached to operate this venture. Some shelving and desks were put into an old shop in the main street, next to Honeyman's Saddle and Harness store. The Post Office was next door, with a red phone box on the street outside. A metal pot belly stove with a supply of wood was installed in this 'Library'.

Book numbers had to be put on the covers of all the books with a clear varnish paint. Book numbers had to be put on the covers of all the books and an index of them recorded into a large reference book.

A recording system was then set up to put patron's names and dates in when they took books out of the Library. The cost was 5 pence a book to be returned within 2 weeks. As an avid book lover the job was a joy to Ellen. The interaction between folk that came to the Library was interesting and Pat Shipley riding her bike into town from the farm and taking time out to sit and chat remains a vivid memory.







Moroccan Pumpkin Soup

Ingredients

- 1 tblsp olive oil
- 1 onion finely chopped
- 1 clove garlic crushed
- 1 tblsp moroccan seasoning
- 1.5 kg butternut pumpkin peeled, chopped
- 2 large carrots peeled, chopped
- 1 cup dried
 red lentils drained, rinsed
- 1 litre chicken stock
- 1 cup water
- ½ cup natural yoghurt to serve
- ½ cup croutons to serve

Method

Heat oil in a stockpot over a medium heat. Add onion and garlic. Cook, stirring occasionally, for about 3 minutes, or until soft. Add seasoning. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute, or until fragrant. Add pumpkin, carrots, lentils, stock and water. Bring to boil. Simmer, covered, stirring occasionally, for about 15 to 20 minutes, or until pumpkin is soft. Remove. Stand for 10 minutes to cool. Carefully blend hot soup, in batches, until smooth. Season with salt and pepper. Return soup to stockpot. Stir over a medium to low heat until hot. Swirl through yoghurt. Serve with croutons.

Mixed Apple and Berry Sponge Pudding

Ingredients

3 Granny Smith apples, peeled, chopped 2 tablespoons lemon juice, plus 2 teaspoons grated lemon zest 1 1/2 cups (330g) caster sugar 500g frozen mixed berries 2 eggs 1/2 cup (125ml) milk 2 tablespoons whisky
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 cup (150g) plain flour, sifted
1 teaspoon baking powder, sifted
lcing sugar, to dust
Thick cream mixed with 1 teaspoon ground
cinnamon, to serve

Method

Preheat oven to 160C. Place the apple, juice and 1 cup (220g) sugar in a small pan and cook over low heat, stirring, for 3 minutes or until the sugar dissolves. Cook for a further 3-4 minutes, stirring occasionally, until apple softens slightly. Cool, then stir through berries. Transfer to a 1.25 litre baking dish. Set aside.

Whisk eggs, milk, whisky, lemon zest and vanilla in a bowl until combined. Set aside. Place fl our, baking powder and remaining sugar in a bowl. Pour egg mixture into dry ingredients, whisking well to form a smooth batter. Pour over fruit, then bake for 30-35 minutes until golden and firm to the touch.

Dust with icing sugar and serve warm with cinnamon cream.

-Handy Tip-

Pull bananas apart before displaying them in your fruit bowl. If you leave them connected at the stem they will ripen faster.
