





Shedanigans - Acknowledgements edition





Beef casserole with parmesan dumpling

Ingredients

- 1kg gravy beef, cut into 2cm chunks
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 6 bacon rashes, chopped
- 500g button mushrooms, halved
- 4 whole garlic cloves, peeled
- 2 tablespoons plain flour

- 2 cups (500ml) Massel beef stock
- 1 cup (250ml) red wine
- 2 fresh thyme sprigs
- 3 bay leaves
- 50g butter
- 2 cups (300g) self-raising flour

Method

Brown 1kg gravy beef, cut into 2cm chunks, in 1 tablespoon olive oil over medium heat. Transfer to plate. Add 1 onion, chopped, 6 bacon rashes, chopped, 500g button mushrooms, halved, and 4 whole garlic cloves, peeled and cook until soft. Stir in 2 tablespoons plain flour.

Add 2 cups (500ml) beef stock, 1 cup (250ml) red

wine, 2 fresh thyme sprigs and 3 bay leaves. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low, add beef and simmer covered for 1 1/2 hours. Spoon into a 2 litre (8 cup) ovenproof dish.

Preheat oven to 200°C. Rub 50g butter into 2 cups (300g) self-raising flour. Stir in 1/2 cup (45g) parmesan and 3/4 cup (185ml) milk. Bring together. Roll into 20 balls. Place on beef. Bake for 20 minutes. \$270kg

Orange Marmalade

Ingredients

1.2 kg oranges, scrubbed, halved lengthways, thinly sliced crossways

• 8 cups water

• 8 cups white sugar, approximately

Place orange and water in a large glass or ceramic bowl. Cover with plastic wrap and leave to stand overnight. Transfer to a large saucepan. Bring to the boil over medium heat. Reduce heat and simmer for 1 hr or until reduced by about one-third.

Cool slightly, then measure the mixture and add 1 cup of sugar per cup of fruit mixture. Stir over low heat until the sugar dissolves. Increase heat to medium-high and bring to the boil. Cook, skimming any dense froth from the surface with a large metal spoon, for 45 mins or until setting point is reached (see tips). Spoon into warm sterilised jars(see tips). Seal and label.

To sterilise, wash and drain jars and lids. Heat on a tray in oven at 100°C or 80°C fan until dry. To test, chill a saucer in freezer. Remove marmalade from heat. Place a tsp of mixture on saucer, then return to freezer for 1-2 mins to cool. If it doesn't crinkle when pushed with your finger, cook for another 5 mins, then repeat. Store jars in a cool, dark place for a month, then store unopened for up to 12 months.

Once opened, store in fridge for up to 6 weeks. Other citrus fruit can be substituted or mixed with oranges.

Gardening jobs

Give autumn flowering natives a tip prune and fertilise after. They will love the rainfall and will put on new growth!

Transplant deciduous shrubs, perennials or trees while dormant. Prune off roots with secateurs to make clean cut before replanting

Don't be tempted to put indoor plants outside to get the rainfall, the difference in temperature will be too much for them.
