BUDGET 2018/19

At its meeting held on Wednesday 15 August 2018 Council adopted its 2018/19 Budget and resolved to increase the GRV rates by 0% and UV rates by 0% on 2017/18, levying a total of \$1,480,836. With properties being re-valued in 2017/18 some properties with valuation increase may have a rate rise.

Smeding Family

Eddy and I walked 2 miles to the school bus each day and Mum would be left to her own devices. It must have been a very lonely existence for her as Dad was out at daybreak. Her life-savers were the Rawleigh and Watsons, travellers and of course Bill Prosser who would translate new words for her every day which she religiously picked out of the old Woman's Weekly.

We were allowed to take the farm truck into Wickepin once a fortnight and go to Henryon's grocery store where vey kind people taught us how to shop in English. We never forgot them and in fact I went to New Norcia where I met up with one of the daughters.

School for Eddy and I was no real problem as we learnt to speak English very quickly as children do. I did catch nits at school and my poor mum was ready to return to Holland. Old Mrs Rose told Mum just to cut my hair short and dip my head in a bucket of kero. It did the trick but was rather painful to say the least.

Do you know the person behind this name?

The name appears on Wickepin's War Memorial and could be a serviceman or woman who enlisted and served between WW2 and 1995. The name has been marked with an "*" to signify that he/she died during service.
